19-340 Capital of Equality – ACT Government LGBTIQ+ Strategy: First Action Plan

Summary of impacts

- The First Action Plan under the Capital of Equality strategy 2019-2023 will be implemented to deliver equitable outcomes for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and Gender Diverse, Intersex and Queer (LGBTIQ+) people in Canberra.
- The Capital of Equality strategy and first action plan will have a positive impact on Canberra with the aim of making Canberra the most LGBTIQ+ welcoming and inclusive city in Australia.
- The ACT Government, LGBTIQ+ Ministerial Advisory Council, community-based organisations, and wider community are aligned in their desire to change the trajectory of LGBTIQ+ disadvantage and inequality.
- The first action plan describes work to be undertaken until the end of 2020 under the framework of the four-year Capital of Equality Strategy to enhance services, policies and programs to benefit LGBTIQ+ people.
