FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I am writing to you in response to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 4 August 2021, in which you sought access to:

- All decision notices in response to requests for accessible executive documents
 made under section 7 of the Executive Documents Release Act 2001 (now
 repealed) or section 31D of the Territory Records Act 2002 excluding any
 personal information of requesters and excluding the content of any documents
 released in response to those requests. (Alternatively, I would also accept a list

 whether the request was successful or unsuccessful.)
- All release restraint determinations (in force or expired) made by the chief executive under section 7 of the Executive Documents Release Act 2001 (now repealed) or made by the principal officer under section 31G of the Territory Records Act 2002.

On 13 December 2021 a notice of Intention to refuse was sent to you stating that the request in its current form would require an unreasonable and substantial diversion of resources pursuant to section 44(1) of the Act.

On 17 December you returned a modified scope being:

 Decisions made on the release of Executive Documents under the Territory Records Act 2002 (TRA) since the commencement of the ACT Freedom of Information Act 2016 (FOI Act) (excluding personal information).

Authority

As an appointed Information Officer under section 18 of the Act, I am authorised to make a decision on access or amendment to government information in the possession or control of CMTEDD.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application by 14 February 2022.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant documents and 31 documents have been identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have decided to grant full access to the relevant documents. The document released to you is provided as **Attachment A** to this letter.

Charges

Pursuant to Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2018 processing charges are applicable for this request because the total number of pages to be released to you exceeds the charging threshold of 50 pages. However, the charges have been waived in accordance with section 107(2)(b) of the Act.



I write in reference to your request received on 28 June 2019 for access to Executive Documents from 1989 to the end of 2003. Out of Scope

and access to the documents will inform Out of Scope

I apologise for the delay in responding as it was necessary to seek advice from the ACT Government Solicitor to inform the access arrangements outlined below.

You have requested access to 15 years of Cabinet submissions totalling over 8,300 submissions. You recognise the legal restrictions on access to those submissions and the implications of disclosure on the capacity of a polity to maintain any claim for privilege. You propose two legal bases on which your access might be granted, you acknowledge the limitations in both avenues for yourself and the Territory, and you have offered to make any relevant undertakings of confidence that may be required to facilitate access. To accommodate your access, I propose the following arrangements.

By convention, former ministers are entitled to special access to refresh their memories of Cabinet and related documents with which they dealt personally while in office. The utility of that entitlement is somewhat limited as it does not encompass a right to make copies and is unlikely to encompass a licence to make public disclosures or comment.

Under the *Territory Records Act 2002*, a member of the public may be given early access to accessible executive records, subject to any contrary release restraint determination. The utility of that process is limited by the sheer volume of the submissions in question.

For the Cabinet documents in the period from 1995 to 2001, correlating to the time you held ministerial and the Chief Minister portfolios, I am prepared to give you access in accordance with the convention, subject to certain conditions with which you would undertake to comply.

The conditions of access include:

- a) that you report regularly to the Head of Service on progress towards completion of your work;
- that where the Head of Service notifies you that particular information is sensitive, contrary to the public interest in accordance with section 31G of the Territory Records Act or attracts legal professional privilege you will protect that information in accordance with the directions of the Head of Service;

- that no use whatsoever be made of information acquired during consultation of records made available under these arrangements, other than as necessary to the production of the final text of the work;
- d) that before the work is made public in any way:
 - those sections of the text based on records to which this access has been granted be submitted to the Head of Service for examination,
 - those sections of the text based on records to which this access has been granted, and deemed by the Head of Service to be unsuitable for public release, be deleted or amended to the satisfaction of the Head of Service,
 - that the work acknowledge both the records used and the means by which access was obtained (i.e. through the Territory Records Act 2002)

I have included an Advance Access Acceptance Form which details proposed conditions of access to the records. If you are agreeable and wish to proceed, could you please complete the Advance Access Acceptance Form and email to CabinetOffice@act.gov.au?

Following receipt of the signed form, the Cabinet Office team will contact you to arrange access. The hard copy documents are stored at ACT Records Services and will be made available to you at the ArchivesACT Reading Room located at 255 Canberra Avenue, Fyshwick.

For the Cabinet documents in the periods for which you were not a minister, you would need to request documents through the Executive Document release process under the *Territory Records Act 2002*. What is an accessible executive document?

Under the Territory Records Act 2002 (the Act) an executive document is a record that has been proposed by a Minister for consideration by the Executive and includes cabinet documents and associated material. This may include cabinet decisions, briefings, agency comments and submission attachments etc.

Cabinet documents become accessible to the public after 10 years under Part 3A of the Act. Under section 31C of the Act, the list of records that are available must be published electronically every Canberra Day. The list can be accessed here.

Canberra Day release Process

In the lead up to Canberra Day, **Government Business & Coordination**, **CMTEDD**, will distribute the list of accessible executive documents to directorates and Ministers to undertake an initial review prior to release. The Head of Service (HoS) agrees to publicly release the list on the CMTEDD website. CMTEDD Communications Team and the Chief Minister's Office are notified prior to the release of the list.

Who is the decision maker?

The Head of Service as Principal Officer under the Act is the decision maker and exercises their own discretion as to whether the information should be published or whether it is contrary to public interest. The Head of Service's view can be informed by the views of the agency, but they are not ultimately bound by those views if they are not personally satisfied of the reasoning in respect to the application of the exemptions applicable under the Act.

Reviewing a document under the TERRITORY RECORDS ACT 2002

When a request for access is received directorates are asked to review an accessible executive document under sections 31E, 31F and 31G of the Territory Records Act 2002. The Freedom of Information Act 2016 (The FOI Act) does not apply.

This review should consider the following exemptions and is undertaken at the time that a request for access to accessible executive documents is received:

- 1. if it is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of a person; or
- 2. if it is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to be an unreasonable limitation on a person's rights under the Human Rights Act 2004; or
- 3. If it is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to significantly prejudice an ongoing criminal investigation; or
- 4. if it is protected private information. This is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to, disclose personal information about any person (including a deceased person) and is contrary to the public interest; or
- 5. if it is information which falls under legal professional privilege in accordance with section 171 of the Legislation Act 2001.

There may be circumstances where directorates need to seek GSO advice or undertake third party consultation prior to making a recommendation to the Head of Service. If this is the case **please advise Government Business & Coordination, CMTEDD at the earliest opportunity.** An extension of time may be considered where consultation is required.

Third Party Consultation – when reviewing a document directorates may identify the need to consult, as a courtesy, with a third party or parties who are referenced in the document. This may include other state or territory government jurisdictions, the Commonwealth government, business entities or individuals. It is at a directorate's discretion whether consultation is required and directorates are responsible for initiating it. The specifics should be discussed with **Government Business & Coordination, CMTEDD,** as early as possible. Any consultation undertaken will need to be referenced in final recommendations and any briefings.

Request for legal advice – during review it may be determined that legal advice from the GSO is required. To avoid any delays, this request should be made as early as possible and Government Business & Coordination, CMTEDD, advised.

Redactions

Directorate FOI teams will be able to provide assistance to apply redactions to an accessible executive document.

How to Lodge reviewed documents and associated attachments with cabinet office

When lodging release recommendation with Cabinet Office, Directorate CLOs will provide Cabinet Office with the following documents via TRIM:

Mandatory Documents:

- if applicable, the executive document with any proposed redactions (marked but not applied*) in PDF. *Redactions are to be lodged in draft format and will be accepted by the Cabinet Office once a decision has been made on release;
- the completed Schedule for Release including recommendations for release (Word);
- · a signed Brief to the portfolio minister noting the release; and
- talking points (PDF or Word).

What is an accessible executive document?

Under the *Territory Records Act 2002* (the Act) an executive document is a record that has been proposed by a Minister for consideration by the Executive and includes cabinet documents and associated material. This may include cabinet decisions, briefings, agency comments and submission attachments etc.

Cabinet documents become accessible to the public after 10 years under Part 3A of the Act. Under section 31C of the Act, the list of records that are available must be published electronically every Canberra Day. The list can be accessed here.

How do I request access to an accessible executive document?

Requests for access to accessible executive documents should be directed in writing to the Cabinet Office at CabinetOffice@act.gov.au. The request should identify which accessible executive documents access is being sought to by including the Cabinet number and title of submission.

Review of accessible executive documents

In accordance with the Act, a review is required to be undertaken to determine if the exemptions applicable under the ACT apply to the accessible executive document.

This review considers the following exemptions and is undertaken at the time that a request for access to accessible executive documents is received:

- if it is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of a person; or
- 2. if it is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to be an **unreasonable limitation on a person's rights** under the *Human Rights Act 2004*; or
- 3. if it is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to **significantly prejudice an ongoing criminal investigation**; or
- 4. If it is **protected private information**. This is information that would, or could reasonably be expected to, disclose personal information about any person (including a deceased person) and is contrary to the public interest; or
- 5. if it is information which falls under **legal professional privilege** in accordance with section 171 of the *Legislation Act 2001*.

Where the Principal Officer determines that any part of the executive document could contain information identified in the above criteria a release restraint determination would be prepared.

Who is the decision maker?

The Head of Service, as Principal Officer under the Act, is the decision maker and must exercise their own discretion as to whether the information should be published or whether the above exemptions may apply. The Head of Service's view can be informed by the views of the agency, but they are not ultimately bound by those views if they are not personally satisfied of the reasoning in respect to the application of the exemptions applicable under the Act.



Timing of response to a request for access

The Act does not stipulate a timeframe for a response to be provided to an access request and the timing of each access request will require its own considerations. Generally, access requests could be expected to be finalised within 8–12 weeks of receipt of a request with the possibility that a release decision may take longer where additional information is required for the Principal Officer to make a decision.

Right of review

The decision to withhold information is reviewable by the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal (ACAT) under section 31M of the Act.
