Hi Hope,

A resident from Isaacs has called me a few times. We have had a few conversations about the Isaacs Pines trails and consultation. The following are a summary of her comments from these phone calls for inclusion in the consultation which I agreed to forward to you, she has also sent in a hard copy survey response:

- Resident living two streets down from the Isaacs pines area on Gratton street, uses the pines regularly for walking and running, has had altercation with mtn bike riders.
- Would prefer:
 - Mtn bike trails to be located closer to the Mugga tip area
 - No mtn bike riding in the area
 - That the pines area be an open nature reserve/ park area for local users\
 - Any mtn bike trails to avoid the residential areas/ houses
- Raised the following concerns:
 - Motorised bikes use the area and this is a danger to other users
 - Conflict of use on fire trail - mtn bike riders on fire trails are dangerous for runners and walkers, they ride too fast and do not communicate to other users
 - Noise pollution to residents and users from mtn bike events
 - Fixing up the trails will make them more attractive to mtn bike riders and increase regular use, causing disruption to local users – walkers and runners
 - Damage to fire trails caused by mtn bike riders
 - Mtn bike riders riding with their dogs off-leash

Hi Sophie

For the last 20 years the Australian Mountain Running Association has been organising the Tour de Ridges trail run in December each year on courses including Farrer Ridge, Wanniasa Hills reserve and Isaacs Ridge. See attached last year's entry form with maps of the 21km, 15km and 10km courses. I also walk in Isaacs Pines regularly.

The trails used on Isaacs Ridge for this event are main fire trails. Some existing mountain bike tracks cross these fire trails in ways that are quite dangerous to runners and other pedestrians (there are many dog walkers every day), horse riders and cyclists. Some of the new Majura pines MTB trails also are less safe than they should be where they intersect with main fire trails.

I am also CEO of Orienteering Australia and in Easter 2016 there is an Australian 3 Days Championship event at Isaacs pines which is an Australian team selection trial and a World Ranking Event. A major influx of new MTB trails before that event has the potential to greatly reduce or nullify the utility of the area for orienteering navigation.

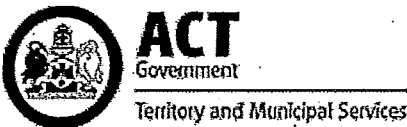

I am writing to express ACTEA's disappointment with the Isaacs Ridge consultation process. Either I misunderstood or I was given to understand that the consultation process was designed to look at the best way to make Isaacs Ridge safer given that cyclists have been creating illegal downhill tracks. From our perspective this has not been a big problem for at least a decade because the Isaacs tracks were largely abandoned for the bigger newer tracks at Stromlo and Kowen but we could see your perspectives about risk. We assumed we would all be starting from a clean slate.

I am a student of the English language and I have been listening carefully to the words the cycling community, the consultants and Sophie Clement has been using and what I am hearing is that the cyclists have already got a commitment to a new, improved, larger facility at Isaacs and the consultation process is operating at the margins. Certainly if such commitments have been made to CORC, and you can see from the attached outtake from one of their forums they are under that impression, they have been made long ago without any consultation with the equestrian users of the pines.

I find it hard to believe that TAMS staff are in ignorance of the fact that Isaacs Ridge is in close to close proximity to both public and private agistment and part of the interconnecting horse trials through Farrer Ridge and on to Weston Creek. My only conclusion under those circumstances is that this is a deliberate decision to disenfranchise us for the benefit of the cycling community. Shades of Majura Pines!

Why do we constantly have to gird our loins and go into battle to protect our limited access to these open spaces?

I would like to be dead wrong. I welcome an assurance that our participation in this 'public consultation' process is actually about planning for what is appropriate for all the users of Isaacs Ridge and not window dressing to ensure the residents of Isaacs don't get a surprised when a substantial bike park appears on their doorstep.
