Subject: Asbestos in Telstra Pits

Critical Date: Urgent

Recommendation

1. That you:
 - a. note the issues associated with asbestos being found in Telstra pits as part of NBN rollout.

Background

2. As part of the NBN rollout Telstra is managing issues associated with 'pits' which were often put in place by the then PMG and which quite often contain bonded asbestos. Telstra pits provide access to underground cables and are generally located on the footpaths at certain points within suburbs.
3. Telstra, as a business, is regulated by Comcare in respect of its health and safety obligations under Commonwealth law. VisionStream, one of the subcontractors involved in the rollout is also regulated by Comcare. In some cases there are other subcontractors involved who are regulated by State/Territory regulators such as WorkSafe ACT. In such cases Comcare regulates the activity through the principle contractor, Telstra, and WorkSafe ACT regulates the activity through the subcontractor.
4. It has recently come to the attention of authorities that the handling of this material by Telstra subcontractors has been inadequate from a health and safety perspective.
5. Comcare is working with Telstra as the principle contractor to address the concerns and ensure that the ongoing management of this issue is in accordance with work, health and safety laws. Telstra have publicly accepted responsibility for addressing this matter.

Issues

6. Arrangements are now in place between Comcare and all relevant state/territory jurisdictions, including the ACT, for Comcare and the relevant state authority to work hand in hand on this issue. Comcare will, in many cases, have the lead since they are responsible for the principle contractor. However there may be joint inspections when work site inspections are deemed necessary and a state or territory subcontractor is involved.
7. Where enforcement action, such as stop work notices, is deemed necessary, Comcare will generally impose these on Telstra as the principle contractor. A decision will be made on a case-by-case basis whether similar action is required in relation to the subcontractor by WorkSafe ACT.
8. Late on Monday 3 June, Comcare advised WorkSafe ACT of two pits in the Nichols area where Comcare issued stop work notices last week because they may be of concern. WorkSafe is seeking clarification of the exact nature of the concern in these instances as one

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of the sites is close to a primary school. On the other hand, Nichols is a relatively new suburb and it is not clear how any pits there could contain asbestos.

- 9. WorkSafe is now working hand in hand with Comcare to ensure that both territory and Commonwealth law requirements are met. ACT Health has also been contacted as they provide advice on the level of public health risk.
- 10. Reporting arrangements are now in place to ensure that both Comcare, and WorkSafe ACT, ACT Health and other involved agencies share any information regarding this and any future issues which may arise.
- 11. The Work Safety Commissioner has asked for the ACT's Asbestos Regulators Forum to be convened as a matter of urgency. A communication strategy is proposed to be developed as required to appropriately communicate information to the public. Good rACT Health will take the lead with respect to community risk communication, which is vital in managing public perceptions concerning asbestos issues.

- 13. WorkSafe ACT is keeping the asbestos coordinator at CMTD and ESDD updated on any developments in relation to this matter. The Work Safety Commissioner has also been in contact with the Chief Health Officer, Dr Paul Kelly and John Woollard from ACT Health.

External Consultation

- 14. WorkSafe is working with Comcare as noted above.

Consultation with CMTD

CMTD have been consulted and had no comment.

- 15. As previously stated, WorkSafe ACT is keeping the asbestos coordinator at CMTD updated on any developments in relation to this matter.

Benefits/Sensitivities

- 16. When the public has been made aware of the location of areas of potential concern in other jurisdictions, there has been a high degree of media interest which at times has been significantly in excess of the real issues.

Media Implications

- 17. When the public is made aware of the location of areas of potential concern in the ACT, there may be a significant amount of media interest.

This is very helpful. Keep me informed of the national picture.

I left a message on your mobile to alert you to this matter some hours ago. I guess you were in the "lockup"? Happy to discuss if required. Essentially, I agree with Bruce Armstrong - this is NOT a public health issue, but is an important PUBLIC PERCEPTION issue. There are two current elements:

1. the potential long-term major political and cost risks of the Commonwealth stance on a register for the ACT Government, specifically ACT Health if this includes the general public (expectations for screening etc).
2. Short term, as Mark McCabe informed us today (and alluded to in the attached transcript from the ABC World Today program) there are 2 "pits" with a Com Care prohibition order in Nichols. One is close to Nichols Primary School.

Holding media dotties are attached. The ACT asbestos regulators' forum will have an urgent meeting tomorrow morning and a further plan will be

John and I have given input into a brief from Mark McCabe to the Chief Minister earlier today. Due to the urgency of the matter, and your unavailability Peggy, I just did that directly (attached for info). As you will see, this is a complex inter-jurisdictional matter, with Com Care taking the lead as the responsible work safety agency for Telstra.

I have also spoken to John Rees in CMTD on this matter earlier today. Consistent with usual approaches:

1. The regulators forum will ensure a "single point of truth" across ACT Government
2. The work safety commissioner will have the lead on workplace matters (in consultation with Com Care)
3. CHO is available to discuss public health aspects (and can liaise with the Chief Medical Officer if required). HPS can assist where required, and will maintain links with the national enHealth group.



More tomorrow, but happy to discuss by phone if more clarification required.

Hi Paul and John,
This afternoon we have a enHealth teleconference that discussed the National Asbestos exposure register and provided insight into yesterday's meeting with the Ministers and Telstra.
The latest information is that Telstra has approximately 8 million pits in Australia and that 20% of these pits contain asbestos. This issue is arising as Telstra need to enlarge the existing pits to install the new infrastructure. This is resulting in exposure to workers and also a disposal issue.
The role and purpose of the register was discussed and it was reaffirmed that this is not a health register.
Comcare have set up a hotline number which is providing facts and figures. The hotline is referring all incident to jurisdictions work cover agencies and any health enquires to health agencies.
There was discussion about having a common script for health enquires and this will be further developed on Friday at an enHealth teleconference.
Professor Baggoley will provide a further update once the commonwealth ministers have their next meeting.

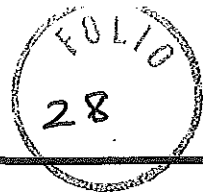

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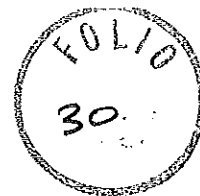

As you are aware the Asbestos Regulators Forum met this morning to discuss issues associated with the NBN rollout. Two telecommunications pits in Nicholls have been subject to stop work notices by the Commonwealth agency responsible for workplace safety Comcare since 29 May 2013. Comcare advised the ACT Work Safety Commissioner of these stop work notices late on 3 June 2013.

The central issue discussed at the ARF meeting was the discovery of material in these pits which was suspected of being asbestos. Comcare have subsequently advised the Work Safety Commissioner that they have sent material for testing from these site and are awaiting the results.

Further advice will be made available when available.

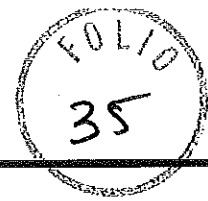

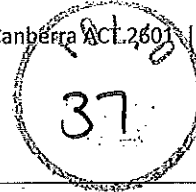

Purpose

2. To brief you on the issuance of stop work notices on two telecommunication pits in Nicholls by Comcare.

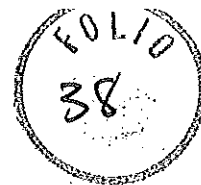
Background

3. As part of the NBN rollout Telstra is managing issues associated with 'pits' which were often put in place by the then Post Master General (PMG) and which quite often contain bonded asbestos. Telstra pits provide access to underground cables and are generally located on the footpaths at certain points within suburbs.
4. Telstra, as a business, is regulated by Comcare in respect of its health and safety obligations under Commonwealth law.
5. The issue of sub-contractors engaged by Telstra, Comcare or the NBN is less clear. In some cases there are other subcontractors involved who are regulated by State/Territory regulators such as WorkSafe ACT. In such cases Comcare regulates the activity through the principle contractor, Telstra and WorkSafe ACT regulates the activity through the subcontractor.
6. As you will be aware the management and handling of this material associated with the NBN has been the focus of negative public scrutiny on a national level.
7. Comcare is working with Telstra as the principle contractor to address the concerns and ensure that the ongoing management of this issue is in accordance with work, health and safety laws.

Issues

8. Late on 3 June 2013, Comcare advised the ACT Work Safety Commissioner that two telecommunications pits in the suburb of Nicholls were subject to Comcare stop work notices. These pits were suspected of being contaminated with asbestos.
9. The Asbestos Regulators Forum met at a specially convened meeting on 5 June 2013, to discuss Nicholls and formulate a whole of government response to a range of broader issues associated with the NBN rollout.
10. It was agreed that ACT Work Safe and ACT Health would lead on the immediate issue of Nicholls with the Asbestos Management Coordinator, providing support through the provision of information and coordination for the whole of government.

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- 11. Subsequent to this meeting the ACT Work Safety Commissioner has been advised by Comcare that the material suspected of being asbestos has been sent for analysis.
- 12. The results of this analysis will determine the course of future action relating to Nicholls.
- 13. Health have provided the attached talking points should the media seek comment from the Minister.
- 14. It is suggested that either The Chief Health Officer or the Work Safety Commissioner be the public spokesperson for any media coverage relating to associated risk for potential exposure to asbestos fibres.
- 15. Arrangements are now in place between Comcare and all relevant state/territory jurisdictions, including the ACT, for Comcare and the relevant state authority to work hand in hand on this issue. Comcare will, in many cases, have the lead since they are responsible for the principle contractor. However there may be joint inspections when work site inspections are deemed necessary and a state or territory subcontractor is involved.
- 16. Where enforcement action, such as stop work notices, is deemed necessary, Comcare will generally impose these on Telstra as the principle contractor. A decision will be made on a case-by-case basis whether similar action is required in relation to the subcontractor by WorkSafe ACT.
- 17. The ARF will discuss issues associated with the continued rollout of the NBN at its scheduled meeting on 7 June 2013.

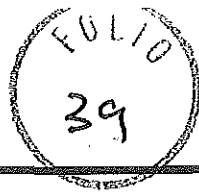

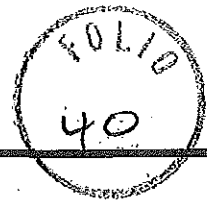

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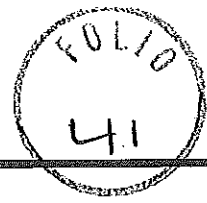
