# Freedom of information request - Traffic and Road Infrastructure in Holt

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1989* (the FOI Act) received on 20 May 2014, in which you sought access to all documents relating to traffic and road infrastructure in Holt since 1 January 2012.

I note that the directorate has received similar requests from you on 12 December 2012 and 22 August 2013 and that both the decision and associated documents related to those requests have been uploaded to the Open Government website. As a result of those previous requests, the directorate has undertaken searches from 1 August 2013 until 20 May 2014 for this request only.

### Decision

I am an officer authorised under section 22 of the FOI Act to make a decision in relation to your request.

A search for documents within the scope of your request has been undertaken in both Roads ACT and in ACTION. As a result of this search, thirty-five documents have been located that fall within the scope of your request. To assist you, I have included a schedule of documents at Attachment A.

I have decided to release documents 12, 20, 25, 31-34 and 35 to you in full.

I have decided to partially exempt material from documents 1-11, 13-19, 21-24 and 26-30 pursuant to section 41 of the FOI Act, which provides:

### 41 Documents affecting personal privacy

(1) A document is an exempt document if its disclosure under this Act would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information relating to the personal affairs of any person (including a deceased person).

The exempt material contains the personal information of third parties, including their names, addresses and contact details. I have also deleted some out of scope information from document 11.

You will note that document 34, a contract for Local Area Traffic Management in Holt, has been provided to you in full. It is also partly available on the Shared Services Procurement website at <a href="http://www.procurement.act.gov.au/contracts">http://www.procurement.act.gov.au/contracts</a>.

With respect to document 22, which consists of a letter from a resident to Roads ACT and a response, I note that on file the response is not a signed copy and for this reason may not reflect the final letter that was sent to the resident.

### Fees and charges

Freedom of information requests attracts fees and charges for time spent searching and retrieving documents, decision-making time and photocopying. In relation to your request, processing charges total \$63.34. I have, however, accepted your argument that the release of this information is in the public interest and have decided to remit all processing charges under section 29 of the FOI Act.

### Right of review

If you are dissatisfied with my decision, you have the right to seek an internal review. If you wish to seek an internal review you should write to:

You have 28 days from the date of the decision letter to seek a review of the outcome or such other period as the Director-General permits.

### **ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal**

If you are still dissatisfied after the directorate has conducted an internal review, you can seek an independent review of the decision by the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal. You have 28 days from the date of the internal review decision to seek a review from the Tribunal.

The Tribunal is an independent body. It can agree with, change or reject the original decision, substitute its own decision or send the matter back to the decision maker for reconsideration in accordance with Tribunal recommendations. 

Thank you for your letter of 18 February 2014 regarding the traffic calming measures in Holt.

I have noted your comments about the classification of Spofforth Street. As you are aware, the ACT road hierarchy classifies roads based on their function within the wider network and the extent to which it serves the two basic purposes of the road network, that is, the movement of traffic and access to property. On this basis, Spofforth Street is a minor collector road. Its primary function is to provide access to properties along its length and distribute traffic into Holt via Messenger Street, rather than being a through traffic route between arterial roads. The 50km/h default speed limit applies on minor collector roads in the ACT. Roads ACT will continue to monitor traffic in this area as the development in West Macgregor progresses to assess if a re-classification of the road is warranted.

Regarding your comments about Southern Cross Drive, west of Kingsford Smith Drive being a 'known black spot', I understand improvements at the Southern Cross Drive/Florey Drive and Southern Cross Drive/Starke Street (west) intersections, where the majority of crashes occurred, have now been completed. These works will reduce traffic conflicts at the intersections and improve safety for all road users.

I have also noted your comments regarding the present and proposed traffic calming scheme in Holt.

High traffic speeds were identified as a particular safety issue on Spofforth Street, and these speeds were occurring despite enforcement efforts by ACT Policing and the Traffic Camera Office. The primary objective of the traffic calming scheme on Spofforth Street was to reduce the measured travelling speed of 76km/h to a value nearer to the 50km/h residential speed limit. It was also expected that the traffic calming scheme will make the road less attractive for 'rat runners', thus encouraging them to use the surrounding arterial roads.

**ACT LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY** 



In general research and experience indicate that the placement of traffic calming measures reduces travelling speeds, indirectly reduces traffic volumes and enhances road safety. On the other hand, some vehicles are distributed elsewhere on the road network, some travel trips become slightly longer and traffic noise is slightly increased in the vicinity of such devices. Such treatments are a trade-off between these impacts and outcomes between safety and convenience. The ACT Government has recognised these impacts but also accepted the importance the community placed on a safer road and a slower speed environment.

Roads ACT will also undertake a post implementation evaluation of the effectiveness of these treatments, which will include a technical analysis of the treatments' impact on the surrounding road network, as well as feedback from residents about the effectiveness of the changes.

Thank you for raising your concerns with me and I hope this information is of assistance.

# RE: PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES IN HOLT

Thank you for your response of 10 February 2014 regarding this matter. We were grateful for the opportunity to spend two hours in discussion with officers of RoadsACT and the consultant, Mr Martin Gordon, and for the subsequent information provided at our request. Based on the information available to us at present, we have arrived at the following conclusions:

- The placement of black rubber speed humps at frequent intervals along Spofforth Street in 2011 has created an obstacle course that disadvantages residents and causes other drivers to use alternative roads through Holt.
- Despite being classified as a minor collector road, the character of Spofforth Street lends itself to being treated as a major collector road in having a 60 km/h speed limit rather than the standard residential limit of 50 km/h.
- In the short term, all speed humps or, at least, all but the four sets currently proposed for retention, should be removed from Spofforth Street.
- No other measures should be installed until traffic behaviour has been monitored again and the need for further measures adequately assessed in the context of increased demand for through traffic to and from William Hovell Drive via Drake Brockman Drive from existing and anticipated new suburbs.

These conclusions are based on the following facts:

The alternative main route from west Belconnen to Civic and southern suburbs is via Southern Cross Drive. Consultants stated at an open night in Holt that this was the preferred route for traffic. The section of this route west of Kingsford Smith Drive experienced 31 crashes in 2013 and was labelled a 'known blackspot' following a fatal accident in 2012.

overall traffic speeds along the road. As the bus runs only occasionally, the chicanes will have less of an effect most of the time, so it raises questions about the need for buses to block traffic in the short time they are in that street. Pedestrian access to and from the bus stops does not seem to be a problem.

- Some drivers will try to pass cyclists through chicanes rather than slowing and passing
  after the chicane. Off-road options on Spofforth Street are limited due to the lack of
  visibility of driveways from the footpath. If chicanes are installed, then consideration
  should be given to creating a cycle path on the golf course side of Spofforth Street,
  linking with other new cycle paths on Southern Cross Drive servicing 'new' Macgregor.
- Subsequent consultations on Messenger Street, Beaurepaire Crescent, and Trickett Street did not address the fact that the problems were likely to have had their genesis in poor decisions regarding Spofforth Street. It appears that no option to remove impediments to Spofforth Street were considered when deciding what (not if) traffic calming measures would be installed on these streets.

In conclusion, it appears that the studies of this area have been concerned only with the fact of speeding and that there was a lack of context in the consultation and decision-making. It has not been demonstrated that the solution is proportional to the problem.

When the first measures were designed, there appears to have been no anticipation of the effect of the multiple speed humps on the residents nor of driver behaviour in response to the traffic calming. The move of traffic to adjacent streets does not appear to have been predicted. This has now prompted further traffic calming measures on other streets. While monitoring will be carried out after introduction of the proposed traffic-calming measures, there is no indication that any pre-emptive study over a wider area has been done to predict driver behaviour and, thus, inform the current plans.

Council believes that a thorough review of traffic movement in this part of Belconnen, in the context of densification and increased residential areas, should be undertaken to determine the proper role and optimal treatment of Spofforth Street. This would determine what, if any, further measures are required on other roads in Holt. We welcome any further evidence to support the current proposal.

Thank you for your letter of 19 February 2014, on behalf of your constituent, about the additional parking space provided by Roads ACT in 2013 for people with a disability near the Belconnen Magpies Football Club.

I am advised by Roads ACT that three parking spaces are already provided for people with disabilities near the club. A recent inspection by Roads ACT found only one out of the available three spaces was occupied near the club.

I am further advised that the new space is located within 30m from the club, and includes a pram ramp to allow access from the parking space to the footpath area. The space was positioned to allow ease of use for persons with a disability and also in a location where access to the footpath area was able to be provided. The space also provides parking for people with a disability visiting the unit complex and businesses near the club.

A pickup and set down area is available at the entrance of the club. The pickup and set down area is available for all members of the community including, people with a disability to be dropped off or picked up directly adjacent to the club's entrance.

Given the above, and noting your constituent's concerns, I have asked Roads ACT to monitor the utilisation of the existing parking spaces for persons with a disability and consider the provision of additional spaces, if required.



Thank you for your email of 10 September 2013 about pedestrian safety in Luke Street, Holt and the issues previously raised by of Uniting Care in Kippax.

I am advised by Roads ACT that an investigation of pedestrian safety in Luke Street has been completed. The investigation included pedestrian counts to determine the current crossing activity in Luke Street during peak hours.

The investigation identified that the number of pedestrians currently crossing the road, while increased from 2011 figures, did not meet the requirements for the provision of a marked pedestrian crossing. I understand that an officer of Roads ACT met with and to discuss the results of the investigation. In recognising the increase in pedestrian numbers, I am advised that Roads ACT will provide a pedestrian refuge on Luke Street to assist pedestrians to cross the road more safely.

The design of the pedestrian refuge is currently being completed and will be provided to directly affected residents and Uniting Care Kippax for comment. It is expected that the pedestrian refuge will be completed before the end of December 2013.



Thank you for your email of 7 February 2014 to the Chief Minister, Ms Katy Gallagher MLA, about the traffic calming measures on Spofforth Street in Holt and other traffic issues. Ms Gallagher has referred your email to me as this matter falls within my portfolio responsibilities.

Your support of the implemented and proposed traffic calming treatments in Holt is appreciated. As you have noted, the implementation of such treatments is in line with efforts to make our roads safer and our streets more liveable.

With regard to your concerns about increasing traffic volumes on Southern Cross and Drake Brockman Drives, Roads ACT is monitoring traffic conditions on these roads to assess how they are operating and whether there is a need for any improvements. As you have noted, the operation of existing roads is affected by the gradual population growth and changes in traffic patterns. Any subsequent upgrade is funded from the ACT Government's Budget, and will be considered in association with competing priorities for other projects in future capital works programs.

Regarding your concerns about speeding and tailgating, the ACT Road Safety Strategy and Action Plan has identified that these are problems experienced on many streets in the ACT road network and the ACT Government is currently progressing a number of engineering, enforcement, encouragement and education initiatives to address these issues.

ACT Policing are responsible for the enforcement of traffic regulations including, speeding and tailgating issues on ACT roads. I would encourage you to report such behaviour to Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 or to ACT Policing on 131 444, providing as much detail as possible (e.g. registration numbers of offending vehicles). This information can assist ACT Policing in following up a complaint.

I do not support your proposal regarding Spofforth and would like you to address the following issues:

1. You acknowledge that traffic is an issue, so your solution is to push it back on to being Spofforth residents problem. Policing never worked in the past so how do you propose to tell the AFP what to do? If you can influence the Canberra policing please get them to fix speeding on roads such as William Hovel and Parkes way? If traffic is the issue why don't you work out a way to use appropriate lane ways such as Southern Cross drive and Kingsford Smith.

This city has woeful road behaviour currently, and my trips in this city I am constantly subjected to dangerous driving. Little Spofforth will not garner any (just as in the past) attention from the police. I know the way police operate, they will not police the street like you claim they would/can.

- 2. Do you or any of your family live on Beaurepaire? What is your personal investment in this issue?
- 3. I grew up in the area and have spent a combined 30 years living in the area. When I grew up there was NO west Macgregor development, no proposed further development in West Canberra. Therefore Spofforth NEVER had to deal with this traffic in the past. That's why it worked for decades, you must acknowledge the increase in traffic and acknowledge that Spofforth was not designed for this, hence not allowing heavy traffic. It is a suburban road just like Beaurepaire.
- 4. Before the calming measures were placed I was subjected constantly to road rage, speeding and tail gating. On average at least 3 times a week. If you succeed I will contact you every time I am subject to this and request your influence on the police that you claim you have.
- 5. I will agree that there are too many speed bumps, but the past has shown to have nothing there will just send everything back to the way it was. Please consider ways to direct traffic down lane ways or proposing new road development. Don't move the problem, fix it, that is what you are elected to do.

And finally, this question is for all Ginninderra MLA's. There is big proposal for a development west of west McGregor. This Spofforth issue highlights that the traffic is only getting worse on roads built 40 to 50 years ago to deal with normal suburban traffic. We need to start seeing thoughts of how to deal with the traffic, new roads etc.? The 2 lane Southern Cross road will not be enough, nor Drake Brockman Drive, so what is the proposal to deal with this? Additionally in general, vehicle behaviour in this city is a disgrace. This week I was subjected to tailgating on William Hovell because I dared go the speed limit. I was intimidated and almost involved in an accident. Something needs to be done with speeding, the police have done well with drink driving, but speeding, especially during high traffic volume times needs to be addressed. Notable areas for me Southern Cross Drive, Drake Brockman, William Hovell, Parkes Way. The speeding is excessive and constant.

I live on the

's in Holt.

I would like to raise my concerns regarding your active desire to diminish my property value, increase the risks to my personal, and others safety, to actively block positive change, prevent the evolution of an ageing suburb and to inhibit the creation of community. Apparently because a masculine, car dominant, police state is a preferable and desired future that advances lives and societies and benefits us all.

- "...It's time to remove the speed humps and return traffic to normal..."
  - Whose normal Mr Coe?

- The land release at the bottom of the street is about change, about progress, managing increasing urban densities, life-styles and the transport infrastructure investment. Investments that require a vision, and planning that supports and is consistent with the life of the asset. There is no vision in your petition.
- "...If the roads are returned to the way they were for decades..."
  - Holt was established in 1972, the year my house was built. Which decade Mr Coe would you like Holt to be returned to?
  - I understand some streets were not even paved initially. Should I look to buy an SUV ahead of the removal of
    the pavement and graded drainage lines being carved into the soon to be softer pebbled shoulder? How will the
    summer watering of the streets be accounted for under the Murray Darling Basin Plan?
- "...I think that appropriate policing may be all that is required..."
  - What does appropriate policing entail exactly? "...May..." implies you are uncertain? Daily, hourly patrols up and down my street? The installation of permanent speed camera's perhaps; maybe an increased once a week random drive-by (about 1 minute top to bottom at 50 km/hr) at the end of a shift on the way back to the station? Will this drive-by be during peak hours am and or pm? During the lunchtime tradies rush to lunch, the Saturday night 6.30 pm adolescent trek to pick the new babe with muffin tops in the P-plated V6 that just got a 4 hour makeover on the front lawn (wheelies at the corner a bonus freebie). Or maybe just pulling over randoms, newly weds and those young families who moved from their Lyneham apartment's into the opportunity of home ownership. Oblivious to the history of the homes they now trundle regularly by. Possibly better educated, better paid, at a different life stage. Keen on the taking the shortest, back street route to avoid the traffic, lights and those pesky police patrols.
  - When the land release created a suburb at the end of the street, vehicles travelling on Spofforth were consistently booked travelling at speeds well in excess of 80 km/hr, often more than 100 km/hr.
  - You remove the speed humps and the policing that will be going on will be scraping me and my neighbours off
    the pavement, or cutting our mangled bodies out the wreck of a car. The remains of what will be left of us from
    undertaking the simple task of reversing from our drive way. Then of course there are all those new residents
    that utilise the street and its verge.
  - Mr Coe you need to help a community move forward and accept change, to develop a degree of sophistication
    consistent with a modern and dynamic existence. To understand that suburbs are not raceways, despite what
    cars sales person might have told them when they bought their turbo charged, two litre beast.
- "...the installation of speed humps on Spofforth Street has moved traffic into neighbouring streets which are now more dangerous that they were before..."
  - How is moving the traffic back onto Spofforth a solution to this issue? I have had old timers walking past my home complain to me of the madness of having traffic moving through the suburb. A seemingly radical means of getting to ones home? I was advised, the solution was to have the traffic "wizz" around the back, and to increase the speed limits so that they might do so "...at more sensible speeds..." I can only assume from reading your sponsored petition you've been talking to the same guys? What's a sensible speed Mr Coe?

• If I understand your policy rationale correctly, the safety implications for life and limb is directly correlated to housing density. People who live in a street where there is housing on both sides are more at risk (by a

significant margin) of being killed by speeding traffic than those who live in streets where housing only occupies one side of the street.

• An interesting logic...I would be interested to see the evidence and basis of facts for this policy position. Perhaps you could lobby the Government for funds for a blind trial. We take a random set of people from both streets, maybe a placebo group from a high rise apartment block where there are not streets, and then have each group repeatedly hit by speeding vehicles so we might compare the injuries and thereby better judge the safety implications. Perhaps something to consider during your proposed 12 month assessment phase?

• Mr Coe, I fully acknowledge that the increased vehicle movements across the suburb as a result of the Macgregor land release has brought change. This is an implicit outcome of the decision. I like to think it has been positive. The speed humps on Spofforth Street DO NOT prevent vehicles moving through our street. They simply require the vehicle to do so safely. How is this a failed policy? That drivers are actively seeking to avoid transiting safely through a suburb needs to be addressed on every street. It is mindless, not a value right of decent society. Cars do not have and should never have rights over and above humanity, irrespective, full stop. People live in these streets, they are not front row seats at summer nats.

"...many of the traffic problems in Holt are of the Government's making (due to the speed humps on Spofforth Street..."

The increase in traffic movements through Holt is a consequence of the Government's decision to release land for housing. That's it. Land is released for housing so that that more Canberra residents might access affordable homes. I do not think the dominance of housing in the Australian definition of wealth is going to change anytime soon. Well not while we have an ageing population of self-funding retirees whose ability to feed themselves independently of the public purse remains so intimately linked to geared taxation arrangements that favour leveraging illiquid capital.

Perhaps as an elected representative in parliament you could consider better channeling your intellect towards
more substantive issues around how we might diversify the economic base so that individual aspirants can
invest and grow their personal wealth and by inference the wealth of the country through mechanisms that do
not relay so heavily on home ownership and by inference increase traffic movement though Holt.

Mr Coe I support the speed humps on Spofforth Street 100 per cent. I support traffic calming measure being installed on neighbouring streets where the poor driver behaviour persists. I support further investment in our suburb that places people before opinion, safety above ignorance, and policy that drives progress over fear and economic stagnation.

I do not support your petition, it is ill conceived, poorly constructed and does not offer solutions.

Thank you for your email of 8 November 2013, to Mr Shane Rattenbury MLA, Minister for Territory and Municipal Services about traffic on Trickett Street in Holt and a response to you of 20-November 2013 from Mr-Rifaat-Shoukrallah-of-Roads-ACT. As-Mr-Rattenbury is currently on leave I am responding on his behalf.

As advised by Roads ACT the recent traffic survey on Trickett Street indicates that the level of traffic on this street is within the safe environmental capacity for a road such as Trickett Street and is similar to many other streets in the ACT that perform the same function within the road network.

I understand that arrangements have been made by Roads ACT to erect the "NO TRUCK" signs at either end of Trickett Street by the end of February 2014. This will make it unlawful for trucks with a gross vehicle mass greater than 4.5 tonnes using Trickett Street unless their destination—lies beyond the signs and there is no other way of accessing the destination.

I refer to your emails of 24 and 30 September 2013 to Mr Shane Rattenbury MLA, and his interim response of 4 November 2013, regarding your concerns about traffic volumes on Trickett Street in Holt.

The traffic survey on Trickett Street has now been completed, and the results indicate that Trickett Street carries around 2,500 vehicles per day. Peak hour traffic on Trickett Street is around 300 vehicles in the morning peak and 270 vehicles in the afternoon peak. This level of traffic is within the safe environmental capacity for a road such as Trickett Street, and similar to many other streets in the ACT that perform the same function within the road network.

The survey results also indicate that about 5 percent of the traffic on Trickett Street is made up of heavy vehicles (vehicles over 4.50 tonne gross vehicle mass (GVM)). Roads ACT will erect NO TRUCK signs at either end of Trickett Street which will make it unlawful for trucks with a GVM greater than 4.5 tonnes, such as those that you have observed, from using Trickett Street unless their destination lies beyond the signs and there is no other way of accessing the destination. This does not affect buses, waste collection vehicles or truck access to properties along Trickett Street.

It is also anticipated that the treatments being developed for Trickett, Spofforth and Messenger Streets and Beaurepaire Crescent will change driver behaviour and redistribute traffic through the area. Roads ACT will continue to monitor the traffic conditions in the area and will take further action if warranted.



Thank you for your emails of 24 and 30 September 2013 regarding the preposed traffic calming measures in Holt and heavy vehicle traffic on Trickett Street. I appreciate your comments and desire to find an acceptable solution.

I agree with you that through traffic should use main roads such as Kingsford Smith and Southern Cross Drives. The surveys conducted by the ACT Government confirm that traffic speeds on Messenger and Trickett Streets are well in excess of the 50km/h speed limit (around 34% of motorists travelling at more than 60km/h) and that these conditions existed before any works were implemented on Spofforth Street.





I refer to your emails of 24 and 30 September 2013 to Mr Shane Rattenbury MLA, and his interim response of 4 November 2013, regarding your concerns about traffic volumes on Trickett Street in Holt.

The traffic survey on Trickett Street has now been completed, and the results indicate that Trickett Street carries around 2,500 vehicles per day. Peak hour traffic on Trickett Street is around 300 vehicles in the morning peak and 270 vehicles in the afternoon peak. This level of traffic is within the safe environmental capacity for a road such as Trickett Street, and similar to many other streets in the ACT that perform the same function within the road network.

The survey results also indicate that about 5 percent of the traffic on Trickett Street is made up of heavy vehicles (vehicles over 4.50 tonne gross vehicle mass (GVM)). Roads ACT will erect NO TRUCK signs at either end of Trickett Street which will make it unlawful for trucks with a GVM greater than 4.5 tonnes, such as those that you have observed, from using Trickett Street unless their destination lies beyond the signs and there is no other way of accessing the destination. This does not affect buses, waste collection vehicles or truck access to properties along Trickett Street.

It is also anticipated that the treatments being developed for Trickett, Spofforth and Messenger Streets and Beaurepaire Crescent will change driver behaviour and redistribute traffic through the area. Roads ACT will continue to monitor the traffic conditions in the area and will take further action if warranted.

(1) The problem in Trickett is of two kinds- between 7.30 and 9 am traffic is forced to queue to access Drake Brockman and the reverse is true between 4 and 6pm. Thank you for your prompt telephone reply to my letter. Since I wrote to you I have made further observations which I hope to follow up this week with list of the four or five truck firms who are regularly using Trickett Street as a rat run.

- (1) The increased traffic should clearly use Kingfortsmith Drive and either Southern Cross or Ginninderra drive which were designed for such heavy traffic. Why are they using Sofforth or Trickett Street? The survey gives no answer to this critical question.
- (2) The proposed solution is like curing one broken leg by breaking the other good one. Spreading the pain will not work and we will still be dealing with this years from now. The answer is to prohibit heavy traffic from residential area. Putting in a few speed bumps will only make matters worse- more noise, moer
- (3) The problem is not speed but congestion and noise. Already the road at the junction of Drakebrockman is beginning to break up. The solution does not address this problem of noise and vehicle size and regularity.
- (3) The solution involves in my view re-routing the through traffic from the centre of Holt to the main roads.



I am advised that an officer from Roads ACT has inspected the above location and assessed the traffic conditions as well as the behaviour of motorists and pedestrians. The pedestrian crossing point provided at the end of MacNaughton Street near the Kingsford Smith School and the pedestrian refuges on Starke Street, adjacent to MacNaughton Street and in the vicinity of Kingsford Smith School, offer safe locations for pedestrians to cross the road. Pedestrians using these refuges are required to give way to approaching vehicles and the central concrete islands allow each direction of traffic to be crossed separately.

I appreciate your suggestion to install some of the speed cushions removed from Spofforth Street onto MacNaughton Street to slow traffic on the street. At this stage some will be re-used on Trickett and Messenger Streets and the reduced speed of traffic will also be of benefit to Starke and MacNaughton Streets.

I have asked Roads ACT to monitor the impact of these changes and assess whether there is a need for additional measures on MacNaughton Street.

The 'No Truck' signs on Spofforth Street were to restrict trucks destined for the West Belconnen Resource Management Centre from using this street instead of main roads such as Kingsford Smith Drive and Southern Cross Drive. I have

asked Roads ACT to assess whether MacNaughton Street is affected in a similar way and whether there is a need for additional 'No Truck' signs on this street.



The investigation identified that high speeds on the road (85% of motorists travelling at or below 76 km/h in a 50 km/h zone) was a particular safety concern. These speeds were occurring despite enforcement activity by ACT Policing and the Traffic Camera Office.

The investigation recommended the installation of speed cushions to reduce the travelling speeds and improve road safety. The results of the evaluation of the scheme showed it has been technically successful and achieved its objectives.

Following the evaluation report, the Government agreed to retain the treatments on Spofforth Street, but with some modifications to address feedback from the community. The Government also decided to investigate the impacts on other streets, and this was completed in June 2013.

This study showed that whilst traffic volumes have increased on some side streets since the implementation of the measures on Spofforth Street, these are still within acceptable limits of such streets. On the other hand, traffic speeds on Messenger Street, Trickett Street and Beaurepaire Crescent are well in excess of their 50 km/h speed limit and these conditions existed even before the works on Spofforth Street (85% of motorists travelling at or below 66 km/h in a 50 km/h zone). Spofforth Street is a minor collector road in the hierarchy of ACT roads. Its primary function is to provide access to properties along its length and distribute traffic into Holt via Messenger Street, rather than being a through traffic route between arterial roads. The 50 km/h default speed limit applies on minor collector roads in the ACT.

Roads ACT originally investigated Spofforth Street in response to residents' complaints about speeding. The investigation identified that high speeds on the road (some 75% of drivers were travelling at more than 60km/h in the 50km/h zone) was a particular safety concern. These speeds were occurring despite enforcement activity by ACT Policing and the Traffic Camera Office.

The investigation recommended the installation of speed cushions to reduce the travelling speeds and improve road safety. The results of the evaluation of the scheme showed it has been technically successful and achieved its objectives.

Following the evaluation report the ACT Government agreed to retain the treatment on Spofforth Street but with some modifications to address feedback from the community. The ACT Government also decided to investigate the impact on other streets and this was completed in June 2013.

This study showed that while traffic volumes have increased on some side streets since the implementation of the measures on Spofforth Street, these are still within acceptable limits for such streets. I appreciate your concern about the treatment on Spofforth Street seemingly being placed as a result of complaints from very few residents. However, Roads ACT originally investigated Spofforth Street in response to a number of residents' complaints about speeding. The investigation identified that high speeds on the road (some 75% of drivers were travelling at more than 60km/h in the 50km/h zone) was a particular safety concern. These speeds were occurring despite enforcement activity by ACT Policing and the Traffic Camera Office.

The investigation recommended the installation of speed cushions to reduce the travelling speeds and improve road safety. The results of the evaluation of the scheme showed it has been technically successful and achieved its objectives.

Following the evaluation report the ACT Government agreed to retain the treatment on Spofforth Street but with some modifications to address feedback from the community. The ACT Government also decided to investigate the impacts on other streets, and this was completed in June 2013.

This study showed that while traffic volumes have increased on some side streets since the implementation of the measures on Spofforth Street, these are still within acceptable limits for such streets. On the other hand, traffic speeds on Messenger and Trickett Streets and Beaurepaire Crescent are well in excess of their 50 km/h speed limit (around 34% of motorists travelling at more than 60km/h) and these conditions existed even before the works on Spofforth Street. It is also clear from public consultation to date that many residents of these streets, while not supportive of the scheme on Spofforth Street, are aware of the need for traffic calming measures in the area.

Roads ACT has taken this feedback into account. It has reviewed current conditions on Spofforth Street and will make some changes to the current scheme. Seven sets of cushions will be removed and replaced with chicanes to

Anarrow the carriageway and slow travelling speeds. These changes on Spofforth Street will be implemented at the same time as higher priority measures on Beaurepaire Crescent, Trickett and Messenger Streets.

The objectives of the treatments on Beaurepaire Crescent, Trickett, Messenger and Spofforth Streets are to reduce travelling speeds, improve road safety and minimise the potential increase in traffic through Holt as a result of the development in West Macgregor. An evaluation of the effectiveness of these treatments will take place six months after implementation and the implementation of any other treatments will depend on the results of this evaluation.

Research and experience indicate that the placement of traffic calming measures usually results in reduced speeds and traffic volumes and enhanced safety. On the other hand, some vehicles are distributed elsewhere on the road network and some travel trips become slightly longer. Traffic calming treatments are a trade-off between these outcomes and impacts and between safety and convenience. The ACT Government recognises these impacts but also understands the importance the community places for a safer road and a slower speed environment.

Thank you for raising this matter with me and I hope this information is of assistance.
