Freedom of Information request

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1989* (the Act) received on 14 August 2014, in which you sought access to patronage numbers for ACTION school bus route 445.

I note that you have also contacted the Minister for Territory and Municipal Services about the cancellation of ACTION school service route 445 who will provide a separate response to address your concerns.

Decision

I am an officer authorised under section 22 of the Act to make a decision in relation to your request.

Three documents have been located within the scope of your request as summarised in the schedule at <u>Attachment A.</u> I have decided to release the documents to you in full.

Right of review

If you are dissatisfied with my decision, you have the right to seek an internal review. If you wish to seek an internal review you should write to:

ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal

If you are still dissatisfied after TAMS has conducted an internal review, you can seek an independent review of the decision by the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal. You have 28 days from the date of the internal review decision to seek a review from the Tribunal.

Ombudsman

You also have the right to complain to the Ombudsman about the processing of your request. If you wish to lodge a complaint you should write to:
