19/322 National Partnership Agreement on Land Transport Infrastructure Projects

Summary of Impacts

The National Partnership Agreement (NPA) on Land Transport Infrastructure Projects is an agreement between the Commonwealth and the States and Territories. The agreement facilitates investment in land transport infrastructure with the aim of delivering a national transport system that is safer and more secure for users, drives national productivity and economic growth, accommodates Australia's growing population and supports competitive markets and employment opportunities.

Key to impacts: Red – negative, Blue – neutral, Green – positive.
