19/542 — Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elected Body Amendment Act 2020

Summary of impacts:

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elected Body Amendment Bill 2020 is supported by Section 7 of the Preamble to the ACT Human Rights Act 2004 and Section 17 – Taking part in public life. The amendments are supported by Article 3 of the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous People. The Bill will:

- enhance the ability of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elected Body to advocate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Canberrans;
- provide for a clearer understanding of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elected Body elections process;
- enable a more succinct reporting process; and
- enable the Elected Body to broadcast its public hearings as it sees fit.
