Title of the Submission: 19/374 ACT 5G Revenue Model for Streetlights

Summary of Impacts

- A revenue model implemented in line with the approach proposed would result in carriers who use
 the streetlight assets paying a one-off application fee per pole in the first year and an ongoing
 annual renewal charge per pole every year thereafter.
- Once finalised by Government, the fee will be set in accordance with the Utilities Act 2000.

ACT Government Budget	The proposed revenue model would recover the costs to the Government in administering the rollout and may raise additional revenue over time.
Productivity and economic growth	5G is likely to increase productivity growth, and this would result in an increase in gross domestic product per capita by between \$1,300-\$2,000 (in real 2015-16 terms), 10 years after the rollout.
