FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 9 September 2020, in which you sought access to:

On 3 July 2020 (employed by Adadn Pty Ltd) was injured whilst working at the Geocon Grand Central Towers development site in Woden, ACT. We request a copy of all documents relating to WorkSafe's investigation of this incident, including but not limited to the following:

- Documents recording information provided to WorkSafe;
- Statements;
- File notes;
- Photographs;
- Reports;
- Correspondence; and
- Emails.

Authority

As an appointed Information Officer under section 18 of the Act, I am authorised to make a decision on access or amendment to government information in the possession or control of CMTEDD.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application by 8 October 2020, however, following on from third party consultations, the due date is now 14 September 2020.

Third Party Consultation

In making this decision, third party consultation was completed in accordance with section 38 of the Act.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant documents and two documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have included as **Attachment A** to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

I have decided to grant partial access to both documents as I consider it to contain information that would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as **Attachment B** to this letter.

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decisions is below.

Statement of Reasons

In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act;
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- the views of the relevant third party; and
- the Information Privacy Act 2014.

Exemption claimed

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the identified documents and components of these documents are as follows:

Public Interest

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interests lies. As part of this process I must consider factors favouring disclosure and non-disclosure.

In Hogan v Hinch (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest'.

<u>Factors favouring disclosure in the public interest:</u>

(a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following: (xiii) contribute to the administration of justice generally, including procedural fairness.

Having considered the factor above, I consider that the release of these documents may contribute to the administration of justice generally by allowing you to have a record of the WorkSafe ACT documents that fall under the scope of your request. However, this factor is to be balanced against the factors favouring non-disclosure.

Factors favouring nondisclosure in the public interest:

(a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:(ii) Prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or other rights under the Human Rights Act 2004;

Having reviewed the documents, I consider that the protection of an individual's right to privacy, especially in the course of dealings with the ACT Government is a significant factor as the parties involved have provided their personal information for the purposes of working with the ACT Government. This, in my opinion, outweighs the benefit which may be derived from releasing the personal information of the individual's involved in this matter.

Individuals are entitled to expect that the personal information they have supplied as part of this process will be dealt with in a manner that protects their privacy. Considering the type of information to be withheld from release, I am satisfied that the factors in favour of release can still be met while protecting the personal information of the individuals involved. I therefore weight the factor for non-disclosure more highly than the factor in favour of release in this instance. As a result, I have decided that release of this information (email addresses, mobile numbers and names of individuals not employed by the ACT Public Service) could prejudice their right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Having applied the test outlined in section 17 of the Act and deciding that release of personal information contained in the documents is not in the public interest to release, I have redacted this information in the documents in accordance with section 50(2). Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that I believe is not in the public interest to release will ensure that the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of the information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.

Charges

Pursuant to Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2017 (No 2) processing charges are not applicable for this request because the total number of pages to be released to you is below the charging threshold of 50 pages.

Online publishing - Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents released to you in response to your access application will be published in the CMTEDD disclosure log after three working days after the date of my decision. Ombudsman Review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in CMTEDD disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.



Inspectors Ledbrook and Williams attended the site, whilst installing Formwork timbers the worker has misjudged the size of the platform losing his footing. The trestle is in good condition, on stable ground and meets all requirements.

Corrective actions: Where possible and reasonably practicable use Platform ladders.


