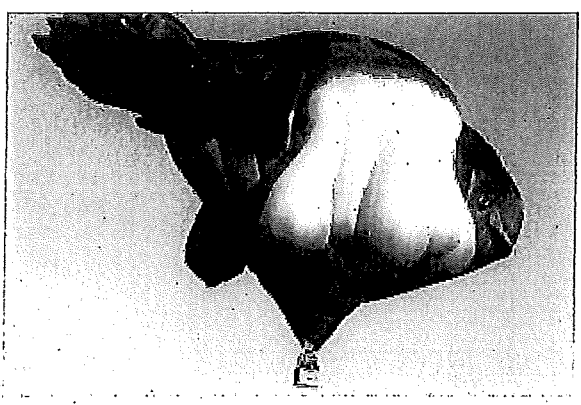

Hey

Always nice to hear a bit of enthusiasm for our inflatable friend!

As you know, our budget is tight and we can't add to it. BAC were able to stump up the cash for the flight (for a site visit from the pilot in advance) and if you guys were able to do the same, then an appearance could be possible ...

Alternatively, Brooke has requested a flight in Tharwa, which we can potentially pay for through philanthropic money that can cover regional flights – as in, outside urban areas. That could be one way of getting her down south, and Adam has noted that southwards is so far not accounted for and would be a nice thing to do if possible.

The other restriction is that she leaves town during the week commencing October 28 and then isn't due back in Canberra until March '14.

As things change I need to keep looking at the budget and schedule (it's now hard finding the times to fly, too), but I will do that before the end of the week to determine whether we can do Tharwa. If you think there's some cash for Tuggeranong (and 6 – 8 volunteers), I can only ask the pilot and see whether he thinks the schedule can cope.

Just on your questions below:

[redacted] is the charge of Global Ballooning to you for the appearance of the Skywhale. The invoice will be issued directly to you by Global Ballooning, and it covers the costs of presenting the balloon including the pilot fee. I'm not sure there's much more I can say about it than that;

In terms of the possibility of short up-and-down flights while the balloon is tethered, that will be a call for the pilot on the day, and depend on the conditions. I wasn't there when that was done during May, but [redacted] was the pilot on that day, so if it's possible to do it, he can do it;

No in-principle objection from me to donations to Dollars for Dili being collected from people who go in the basket. for your information, Dollars for Dili is our official charity and raises money to build toilet blocks in at schools in Dili. As with all donations, there can't be a compulsion;

As discussed about volunteers, we have a lot of calls on volunteers for Skywhale flights over the next two months. Our volunteer manager is including this flight in her alert to volunteers that some assistance may be required, but it would be so great if UC could provide as many volleys as can be mustered to alleviate the calls on Centenary ones. Perhaps can you tell us how you are going at the end of next week – Friday 23rd – and we'll go from there?

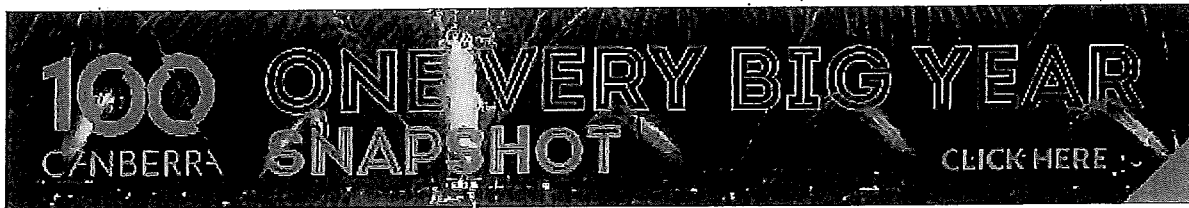

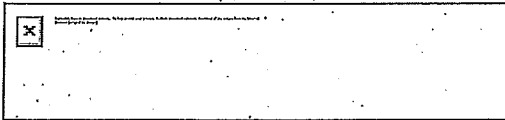

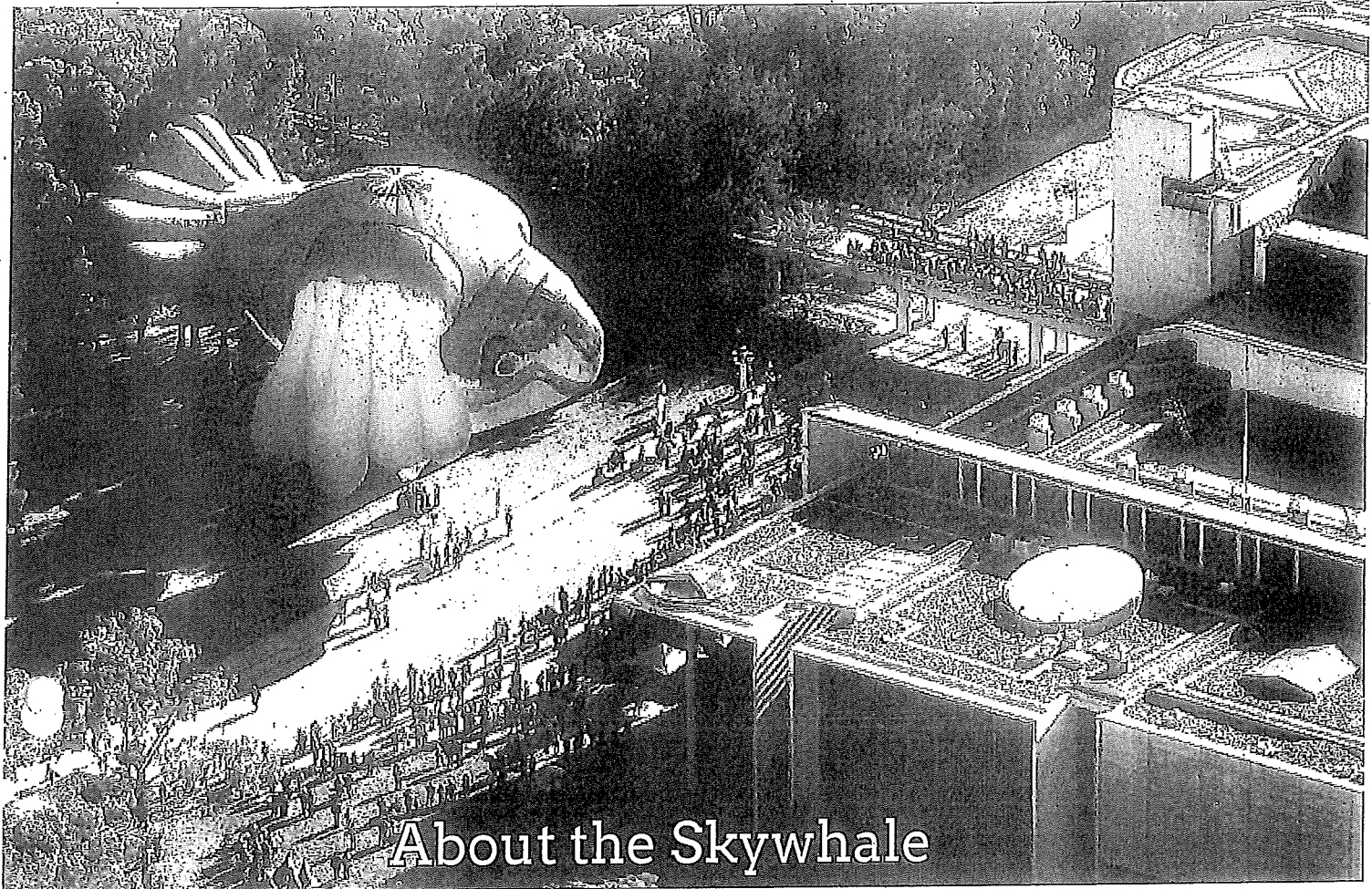
Thank you for your enquiry regarding Patricia Piccinini's Skywhale performance.

Please find below an outline of operating parameters and associated costs.

About the Skywhale project

"The Skywhale is a magnificent and mysterious creature that literally floats in and out of our world. She appears both impossible but also strangely plausible, a reminder of the marvelous and incredible adaptations that exist across the breadth of the world. When we catch a glimpse of her, floating through the skies and wonder how she could be possible, we could remember that the blue whale, the largest animal ever to have lived (including the dinosaurs) is descended from a small deer-like animal. So, in fact, stranger things have actually happened. The Skywhale is by far the largest sculpture I have ever conceived. It is massive on every level. The very idea of creating it is huge. I see her as a generator of wonder, and a creator of discussion."

Patricia Piccinini, talking about her inspiration for the Skywhale.



About the Skywhale

The Skywhale is a massive, floating sculpture by artist Patricia Piccinini, commissioned for the Centenary of Canberra. Although the Skywhale is a sculpture, it is also a registered aircraft. It is effectively a special shaped hot air balloon conceived by Piccinini and built by Cameron Balloons in the United Kingdom. The colours, patterns and textures have been carefully printed onto 3,535 metres of fabric. The Skywhale was cut and sewn together by a team of six people using approximately 3.3 million stitches!

The Skywhale has been designed to fly and is basically an Australian Registered aircraft. This effectively means it is controlled by a pilot and is operated under the Australian Standards pertaining to aviation.

The Skywhale is not a cold inflatable that is erected and then left in situ. It is operated by a commercial pilot and a trained ground assistant and is inflated by burning LPG and heating the inside of the Skywhale to keep it standing.

The Skywhale when inflated stands 24 metres high and is 36 metres in length - basically it is huge.



Requirements & considerations

When considering the Skywhale at your event there are a few aspects that you may wish to consider.

Free flight The Skywhale is made to fly. When we free fly, the Skywhale will drift with the wind, so the flight path would be determined by the wind on the day. If we free fly then we would be unlikely to tether given the time it takes to inflate, fly and to pack away. However, the process of inflation is quite an interesting event for spectators, and it is possible for the Skywhale to stay tethered for a short while before departing on a flight. This creates a real sense of an event. However, it is important to be aware that not every venue is suitable as the departure point for a flight.

Tether This is when the Skywhale is attached to the ground with ropes. This becomes a static installation giving people the chance to see the sculpture without it blowing away. Tethering can be done during the day or even at night, when the internal light from the LPG gas burner makes the whole sculpture glow. Weather is still a very important factor in a tethered presentation.

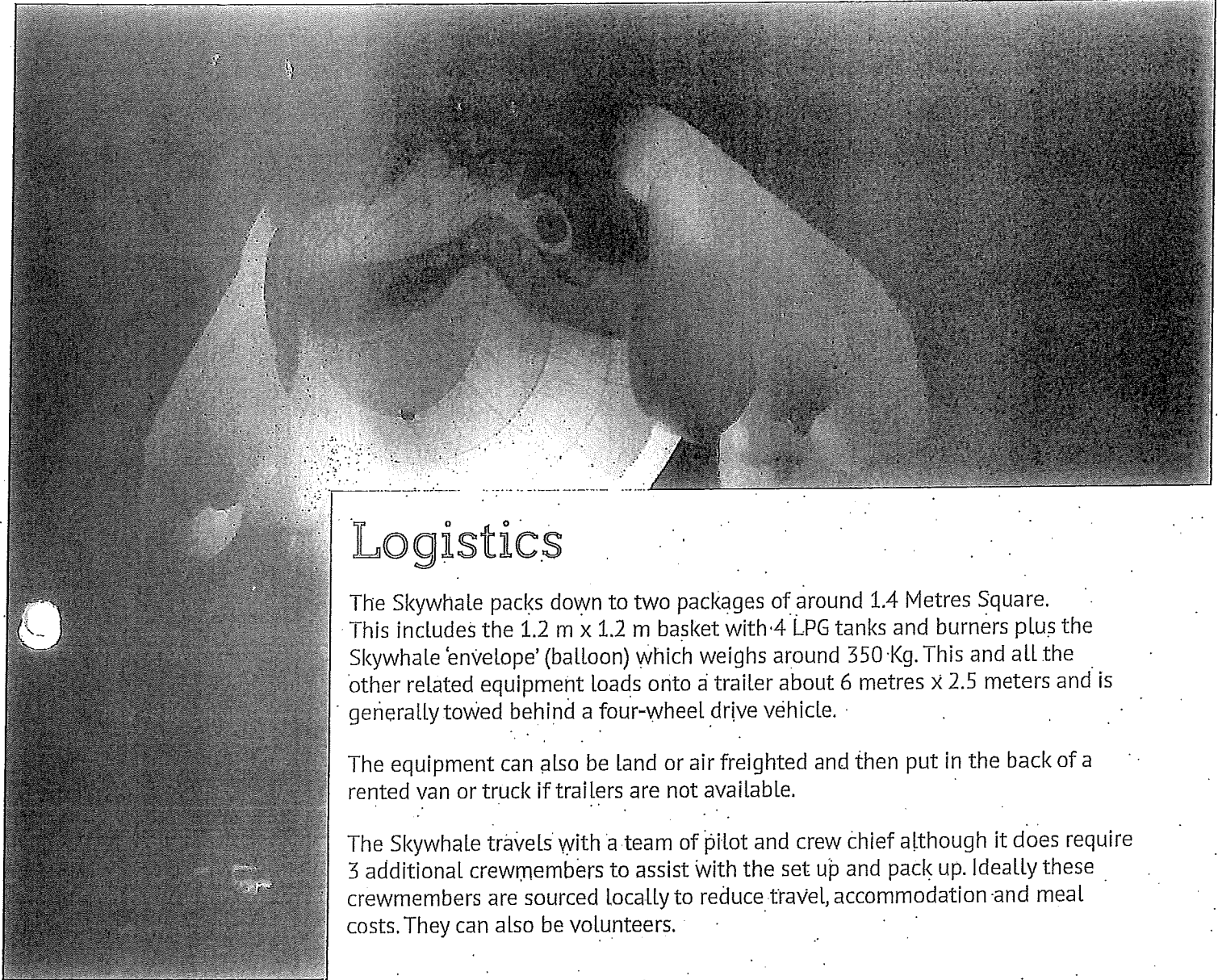
Space required As a rule we need to have a space clear of obstacles in the vicinity of 50 square metres (500 square feet) to inflate the Skywhale. The inflation process starts with the fabric laid out and a petrol fan is used to blow cold air into her to begin the process and then we switch over the LPG burners. Once she is inflated the footprint on the ground becomes that of the basket (1.2m x 1.2m). If conditions are calm people are free to wander around and underneath her - even hop in the basket with the pilot.

Obstacles We need to avoid sharp obstacles around her as she is made of nylon and can rip quite easily. Powerlines are particularly problematic.

Weather Weather plays a huge part in the presentation of the Skywhale. She cannot be flown or tethered outdoors if there is any likelihood of rain, or high winds. Winds over 8km/h on the surface mean that the Skywhale becomes unruly and over 12km/h it becomes untenable and unsafe. The best conditions are still, cool, clear days.

Outdoor Venues When considering outdoor venues clean spaces are preferable. Grass is excellent. The best venues are those that offer the best protection from wind.

Indoor Venues We are also possible if you have a stadium or space big enough for her to fit, and where we can use the LPG gas burners. Of course approvals would be required to achieve this tether scenario.



Logistics

The Skywhale packs down to two packages of around 1.4 Metres Square. This includes the 1.2 m x 1.2 m basket with 4 LPG tanks and burners plus the Skywhale 'envelope' (balloon) which weighs around 350 Kg. This and all the other related equipment loads onto a trailer about 6 metres x 2.5 meters and is generally towed behind a four-wheel drive vehicle.

The equipment can also be land or air freighted and then put in the back of a rented van or truck if trailers are not available.

The Skywhale travels with a team of pilot and crew chief although it does require 3 additional crewmembers to assist with the set up and pack up. Ideally these crewmembers are sourced locally to reduce travel, accommodation and meal costs. They can also be volunteers.

How it works

The whole process of setting up the Skywhale takes approximately 45 minutes from arriving to it being inflated. Generally we operate either early in the morning or later in the evening to capitalise on the light winds. This is not to say the Skywhale cannot operate in the middle of the day - it just is not the most optimal time from a meteorological standpoint.

If the Skywhale is being tethered then ropes will be attached and she will stay in that position for the entire time - which generally will be about 2-3 hours depending on the weather.

If the Skywhale is being free flown the location of launch will vary based on wind direction and where she is expected to fly. Obviously things like terrain and suitable landing areas are most important. A free flight will generally be for one hour.

Packing away the Skywhale takes about one hour - although this may vary based on the amount of helpers available. Again, volunteers can greatly assist this process.

Once the Skywhale is back on the trailer it is then taken to a secure location out of the weather to be parked and stored.



General Costs

The general costs associated with a Skywhale performance are as follows

Operating Cost (per 2hr tether/ 1hr free flight)	\$3500 + GST
Travel Days	\$400 / 10hr day
Weather days (pilot and 3 crew)	\$1250.00 + GST
Transport Costs (4x4 Vehicle and Trailer)	\$1.20 / km
Accommodation	Supplied
Meals for crew	At Cost
Global Ballooning management fees	\$120 /hour + GST

It is preferable that Patricia attends the flight, so that she can be involved in any media or public program opportunities that might be appropriate. If this is case, she would need her travel and accommodation costs covered as well as an appropriate per diem and artist's or speaker's fee.

For events outside of Australia items such as freight will be quoted once established. Effectively the more an event can supply the less we will be required to charge for our management services.

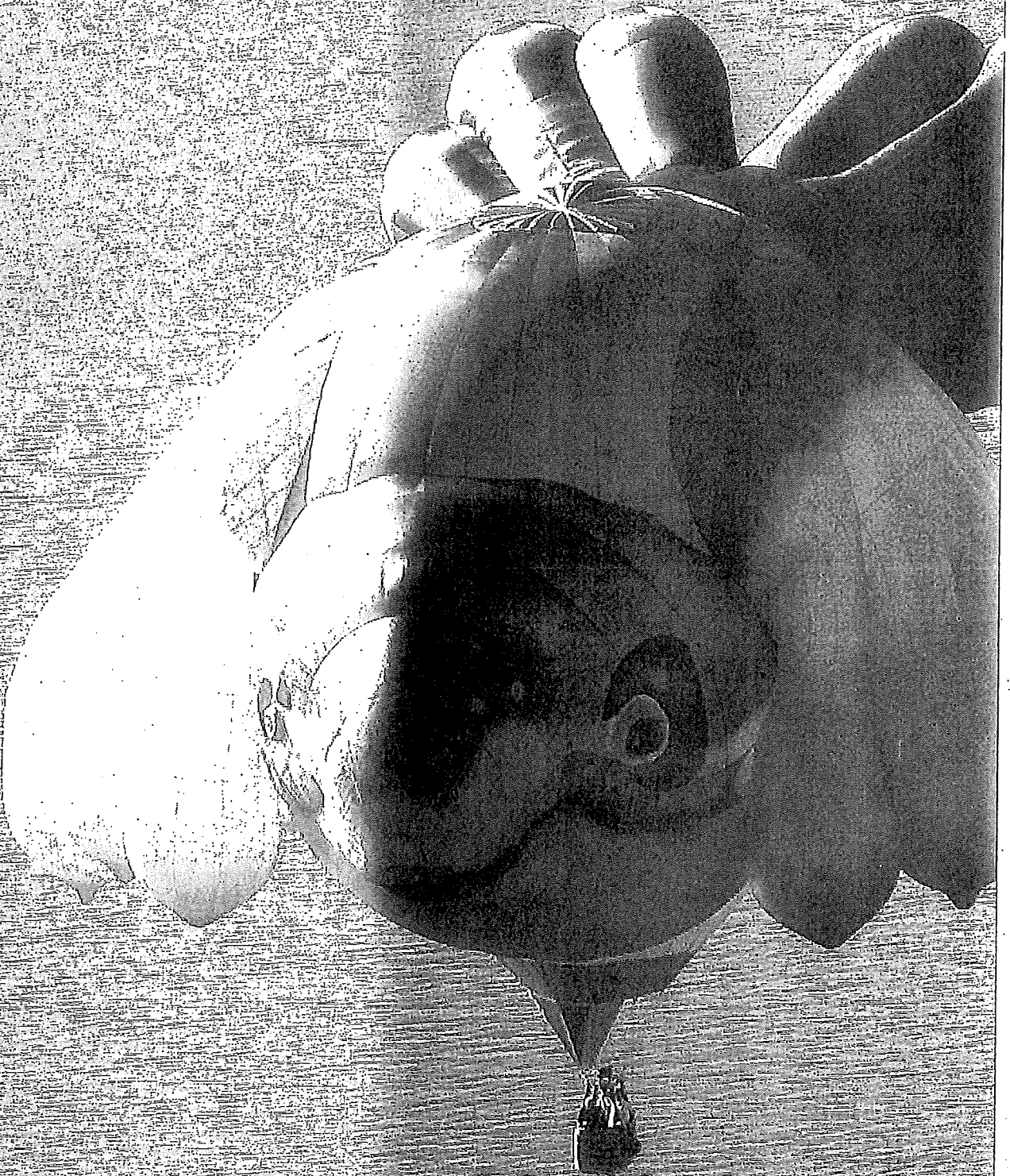
Note: For overseas events we may utilise the bottom end equipment from local balloon operators to save on freight charges.

The figures form only indicative costs - the actual costs of a performance will be quoted once we have established all the event details.

If volunteers or staff is available to assist we will be able to reduce the cost of operation.

Cancellation Policy

It is advisable to build into your event a weather day to give us the best chance of success. Our team will do everything possible to achieve a positive outcome although given that most of the operating costs are in being on site Global Ballooning Pty Ltd will require 80% of the operating fees to be paid if the Skywhale is unable to operate due to weather or other forces beyond our control.
