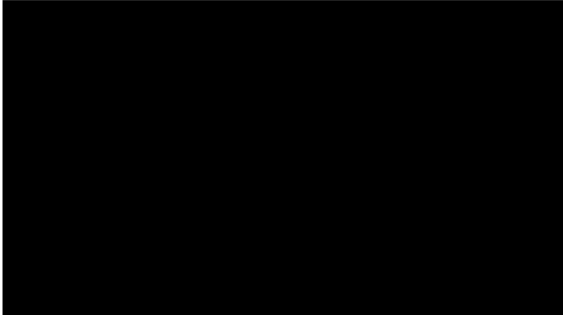

I refer to our letter of 16 March 2016 in relation to your application under section 59 of the *Freedom of Information Act 1989* (FOI Act), in which you requested an internal review of a decision made on 22 February 2016 in relation to your request for:

“a SGS Australia report relating to fixed speed camera located at ‘Canberra Avenue/Captain Cook Crescent/Manuka Circle’ for the year 2015, 2016.”

I am an officer authorised to review decisions in respect of a request for information, under section 22 of the FOI Act.

The third party’s review period has expired and no further submissions were received. I have therefore decided to release the documents with less redaction. You will note the hand written dates at the bottom of each of the Calibration certificates, as well as the DUT Indicated Speed columns in each of the test results tables are no longer redacted.

Review rights

As stated in my previous correspondence my decision is appealable under the Act. This means that, if you are dissatisfied with the outcome of this review, you have a right to seek a further review under section 60 of the Act. This right of review extends to a review of the adequacy of the search for documents undertaken by the Directorate. If you wish to seek a review you should write to the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal.

Under section 54 of the Act, if you are concerned about the processing of your request or related administrative matters, you may complain to the Ombudsman, who may conduct an independent investigation into your complaint. There is no fee for this, and the contact details are as follows:
