I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 26 May 2020, in which you sought access to information in relation to Class A Builders Licences.

Specifically, you are seeking information in relation to the following questions:

- 1. From 22 February 2019, how many applicants to date have applied for A class builders' licence?
- 2. How many applicants who met the mandatory and other eligibility requirements, such as qualifications and work experience, were deemed to proceed to the next stage of the licence process?
- 3. Of those that proceeded to the next stage, how many were assessed as qualified at an unrestricted licence level (i.e. capable of undertaking all BCA classes of work)?
- 4. How many applicants were assessed as eligible to progress to the written examination?
- 5. Of those applicants that progressed to the written examination, how many applicants passed the examination at the first sitting?

1. From 22 February 2019, how many applicants to date have applied for A class builders' licence

Nine new applicants.

2. How many applicants who met the mandatory and other eligibility requirements, such as qualifications and work experience, were deemed to proceed to the next stage of the licence process

Nine applicants have met the mandatory requirements. As a result, they were invited to undertake the written examination set by the Registrar (next stage).

3. Of those that proceeded to the next stage, how many were assessed as qualified at an unrestricted licence level (i.e. capable of undertaking all BCA classes of work).

Six of the nine applicants who proceeded to the next stage were assessed as qualified at an unrestricted licence level.

4. How many applicants were assessed as eligible to progress to the written examination

Nine applicants have been assessed as eligible. Six applicants sat the examination.

5. Of those applicants that progressed to the written examination, how many applicants passed the examination at the first sitting

Three applicants passed the examination on the first attempt.

6. Of the applicants that did not pass the written examination on the first attempt, how many applicants passed the examination on the second attempt

Two Applicants passed the examination on the second attempt.

7. How many applicants did not achieve the mandatory 80% pass mark after two sitting attempts and were thus refused a licence from the Construction Occupations Registrar Construction Occupations Registrar, Class A Builders Licence (Current Licence Holders)

One applicant has been refused a licence.

8. From 22 February 2019, how many current class A licence holders (existing or renewing) to date were required to sit the written examination as a process of licence renewal, government direction or otherwise.

49 Applicants have been required to sit the examination. 20 Applicants sat the examination.

Please note:

- 14 applicants renewing their licence have not sat an examination as they were assessed under Section 14 of the Construction Occupations (Licensing) Regulation 2004 due to Covid-19.
- 11 applicants re-applied for their licence through the Mutual Recognition Act 1992
- four applicants voluntarily cancelled

9. Of those existing licence holders, how many applicants passed the examination at the first sitting

Six applicants passed the examination on their first attempt.

10. Of the existing licence holders, that did not pass the written examination on the first attempt, how many applicants passed the examination on the second attempt

Two applicants passed on the second attempt.

11. How many existing licence holders did not achieve the mandatory 80% pass mark after two sitting attempts and were thus refused a licence (renewal or otherwise) from the Construction Occupations Registrar

One applicant was refused a licence.

Please note:

- Of the 20 applicants that sat the examination:
 - One applicant downgraded their licence class
 - Two applicants re-applied for their licence through the Mutual Recognition Act 1992
 - Eight applicants were not required to sit the examination for a second time due to Covd-19 and were granted a licence under Section 14 of the Construction Occupations (Licensing) Regulation 2004.
