I had a brief conversation with Penelope about this the other day.

In addition to the information contained in the message below that the publishing committee is not known Penelope, I understand the committee had been successful in its application for ACT Government funding before it invited her to participate. I am also advised she has had no involvement in the project except as an author selected by the publishing committee for inclusion.

I do not know whether the decision to award funding was made by Mr Stanhope or Ms Burch. In any event, my advice would be the same, although I note there would be even less scope for allegations of conflict if the decision was made after May 2011.

Penelope's invitation to participate in this activity would seem to fall clearly in the private realm, founded on an independent assessment by the publishing committee of her work's literary merit.

On that basis I see no conflict in her participation.
