In the interests of openness, transparency and clarity about this matter.

I would be very grateful if you could please provide a timeline of events that occurred between the 5/06/2018 and 14/06/2018.

I have provided an example of the detail I am requesting for my records so that an external observer can be clear of what was required/done by the relevant parties over this period.

If so the reasons for it being non-compliant if possible.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 18 June 2018, in which you sought access to documents regarding the compliance of a pool fence at

Specifically, your requested stated: "I am solely interested in the timeline of events and whether the pool fencing was inspected prior to 14/06/2018 and found to be non-compliant. If so the reasons for it being non-compliant if possible".

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of CMTEDD under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application by 16 July 2018.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant documents and 2 documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have decided to grant full access to 1 document and partial access to 1 document. The information redacted in the documents I consider to be information that would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.

I have included as <u>Attachment A</u> to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as <u>Attachment B</u> to this letter.

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decision is below.

Statement of Reasons

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act;
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request; and
- the Human Rights Act 2004.

Exemption claimed

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to components of the identified documents are as follows:

Public Interest

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interests lies. As part of this process I must consider factors favouring disclosure and non-disclosure.

In Hogan v Hinch (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Factors favouring disclosure (Schedule 2.1)

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest':

(a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following: (viii) reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.

The information contained in the documents shows the interactions between the ACT Government and other relevant stakeholders and the steps taken in relation to the compliance of a pool fence at 25 Kidston Crescent Curtin. This includes the steps taken to address these issues. I am satisfied the information contained within these documents is within the public interest to release as they reveal the reason for a government decision.

Factors favouring non-disclosure (Schedule 2.2)

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have also identified the following public interest factors in favour of non-disclosure are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest':

(a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:

(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004.

Having reviewed the documents, I have considered the impact that releasing personal information contained in the documents, including the name and contact information of the property owner could have on the individual involved in this matter and I am satisfied the release of this information is unreasonable or could prejudice their right to privacy.

I am satisfied that the protection of an individual's right to privacy, especially in the course of assisting in a line of enquiry with a government agency, is a significant factor as the party involved has provided their personal information for the purposes of meeting obligations under relevant legislation which, in my opinion, outweighs the benefit which may be derived from releasing the personal information of the individual's involved in this matter. Individuals are entitled to expect that the personal information they have supplied as part of this process will be dealt with in a manner that protects their privacy. Considering the type of information to be withheld from release, I am satisfied that the factors in favour of release can still be met while protecting the personal information of the individuals involved.

I therefore weight the factor for non-disclosure more highly than the factor in favour of release in this instance. As a result, I have decided that release of this information (any identifying features within the submission) could prejudice their right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that is not in the public interest to release, while releasing the rest of the documents will ensure the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.

Accordingly, I have chosen to redact parts of folios 2-3 and 7 of the documents within Attachment B.

Charges

Pursuant to *Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2017 (No 2)* processing charges are not applicable for this request because the total number folio's to be released to you is below the charging threshold of 50 pages.

Online publishing - Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents released to you in response to your access application will be published in the CMTEDD disclosure log after 26 June 2018. Your personal contact details will not be published.

Ombudsman Review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. 




