Summary of impacts:

- There are no direct negative impacts on the ACT community as a result of the findings of the review of the gaming machine tax rebate or introducing amendments to the *Gaming Machine Act 2004* as part of the ACT Government's commitment to supporting small to medium local community clubs.
- There are positive impacts for the club industry in that the gaming machine tax rebate can support the provision by clubs of a wider range of services and alternative uses of club land.
