20/243 Support for temporary visa holders in response to COVID-19

Summary of impacts:

COVID-19 has increased the vulnerability of several Canberrans.

All people who arrived in Australia as refugees and on permanent work and family visas are eligible to access Australian Government financial assistance. People living in Australia on a range of temporary visas are largely ineligible to access Australian Government financial assistance. This includes people on temporary work and family visas, international student visas and bridging visas, including asylum seekers.

Canberrans on temporary visas are predominantly employed on a casual basis. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, our casual economy has collapsed, impacting the ability of Canberrans on temporary visas to meet their immediate housing and living costs.

This proposal provides financial assistance to ensure temporary visa holders can access urgently needed goods and services to meet their immediate living needs including housing, health, communication, utilities and food needs.
