FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 8 June 2022, in which you sought access to:

 Submission documents for grant recipients of the Safe Tourism Co-Investment Program for 2020-21 as well as documents and correspondence relating to selection of the grant recipients.

Following on from a telephone conversation with this office on 9 June 2022, you refined the scope of your request to:

The grant recipients' ideas/concepts that attracted funding in the 2020-21 Safe
Tourism Co-Investment Program, including their expected return on investment for
the project.

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of CMTEDD under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD was required to provide a decision on your access application by 7 July 2022 however, following third party consultation the due date is now 28 July 2022.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant information and 14 concepts were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have included as **Attachment A** to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

Please note that 'expected return on investment' is not a criterion for the grants program and there is no information held by CMTEDD that would cover this part of your request.

Third party consultation

In determining this access request, I identified that some of the information may reasonably be expected to be of concern to third parties. In accordance with section 38 of the Act, I have undertaken third party consultation. I have considered the contentions raised by the third parties in making this decision.

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decision is below.

Material considered

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act;
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request; and,
- responses from third parties.

Exemption claimed

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the identified documents and components of these documents are as follows:

Public Interest

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interest lies. As part of this process, I must consider factors favouring disclosure and non-disclosure.

In Hogan v Hinch (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest'.

Factors favouring disclosure in the public interest under Schedule 2.1:

- (a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:
 - (i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.

Having considered the factors identified as relevant in this matter, I consider that release of the information relevant to your request may contribute to promoting open discussion and enhance the government's strong stance in supporting innovation in the small local business arena.

I am satisfied that this factor favouring disclosure carries some weight. However, this weight is to be balanced against the factors favouring nondisclosure.

Factors favouring nondisclosure in the public interest under Schedule 2.2:

(a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following: (xi) prejudice trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person.

I have also considered the impact of disclosing information which relates to business affairs. In the case of *Re Mangan and The Treasury* [2005] AATA 898 the term 'business affairs' was interpreted as meaning 'the totality of the money-making affairs of an organisation or undertaking as distinct from its private or internal affairs'.

Schedule 2 section 2.2(a)(xi) allows for government information to be withheld from release if disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to prejudice the trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person.

As prefaced in an email to you dated 9 June 2022, some of the entities involved have objected to the release of this information at this point in time, as they have launch plans and that to prematurely release these concepts and ideas could reasonably be expected to prejudice their success and release their intellectual property.

I give this factor for nondisclosure significant weight.

Access to documents

Pursuant to section 38(6) of the Act, I am required to defer access to all the identified documents as an affected third party has objected to disclosure. This third party may apply for review of my release decision within 20 working days after my decision is published in CMTEDD disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman. I will write to you to advise when access is no longer deferred.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable for this request because the number of pages being released to you is less than the charging threshold of 50.

Online publishing – Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents released to you in response to your access application will be published in the CMTEDD disclosure log. Ombudsman Review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in CMTEDD disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.
