Please accept the following as an access application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016*.

Background

The ACT Integrity Commission ('Commission') *Annual Report 2024-25*, at page 105, discloses that the Commission incurred during FY25 \$55,000 in expenditure for act of grace payments. A supporting note states that this involved one act of grace payment 'to support the legal expenses for a witness that appeared before the Commission' and that '[a]s the witness was not a current or former ACT Public Servant, they were not otherwise entitled to receive legal representation paid for by the ACT Government'.

Commission annual reports since 2020-21 disclose that the Commission knows that a regulation has not been made prescribing for sections 171 and 172 of the *Integrity Commission Act 2018* ('IC Act') witnesses entitled to payment for legal assistance or reimbursement of expenses.

Information released under a prior FOI request with reference number CMTEDDFOI 2024-237, at page 31 of the PDF, identifies a ministerial brief directed to the Chief Minister with reference number CMTEDD2024/2865 titled 'Act of Grace Payment for Non-Government Witness legal expenses incurred in relation to Integrity Commission proceedings' [sic].

Access Application

I request access to an electronic copy of all government information held by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate ('CMTEDD') about:

- act of grace payment/s for legal representation or witness expenses incurred by any non-government witness related to functions of the Commission
- specific payment/s of public money for the benefit of any witness not otherwise entitled receive ACT Government financial assistance related to functions of the Commission, irrespective of whether a payment occurred
- payment for legal representation or witness expenses incurred by non-government witness related to functions of the Commission generally, excluding information that is only about (a) development of regulations for sections 171 and 172 of the IC Act; or, (b) conducting, responding to or generally implementing the 'Govey' review.

The scope of this access application extends to government information in any form including, without limitation, documents of any kind; file notes, diary entries and similar; emails; text messages; instant/chat messages (e.g. via MS Teams); meeting and other conversation records.

The scope of this access application does not include:

- government information held by the Commission or Inspector of the Commission
- information that would identify an individual, that is, a natural person, to the extent this can be deleted from a record containing government information—noting at the same time that legal people such as corporations do not have human rights such as privacy rights.

Other matters

I do not consent to any information about my identity being disclosed to anyone not within CMTEDD and not directly involved in dealing with this access application.

Specifically, I do not consent to any information about my identity being disclosed to:

- the Commission, Integrity Commissioner or staff of the Commission (including a Commission information officer)
- any other third-party that may be relevant to deciding this access application.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – NOTICE OF DECISION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 9 April 2026.

Specifically, you have sought access to:

Background

The ACT Integrity Commission ('Commission') Annual Report 2024-25, at page 105, discloses that the Commission incurred during FY25 \$55,000 in expenditure for act of grace payments. A supporting note states that this involved one act of grace payment 'to support the legal expenses for a witness that appeared before the Commission' and that '[a]s the witness was not a current or former ACT Public Servant, they were not otherwise entitled to receive legal representation paid for by the ACT Government'.

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I request access to an electronic copy of all government information held by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate ('CMTEDD') about:

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- *payment for legal representation or witness expenses incurred by non-government witness related to functions of the Commission generally, excluding information that is only about (a) development of regulations for sections 171 and 172 of the IC Act; or, (b) conducting, responding to or generally implementing the 'Govey' review.*

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- *information that would identify an individual, that is, a natural person, to the extent this can be deleted from a record containing government information— noting at the same time that legal people such as corporations do not have human rights such as privacy rights.*

On 24 April 2026 you were sent a formal acknowledgement of your access application. In reply on that date, you also stated within your email:

My access application expressly refers to information within scope that was disclosed through a prior access application by way of a ministerial brief about payments by the Integrity Commission to witnesses.

On 12 May 2025, you were sent a clarification request under section 34 of the Act, which also included CMTEDD FOI Team obtaining your consent to continue with third party consultation. On 12 May 2025 you also replied as follows:

I confirm that I would like to proceed with this access application.

The intention of excluding the names of individuals from the scope of this access application was to limit or avoid the need for third-party consultation with every individual that might be named in the information. If the need for third-party consultation is not changed by excluding names then please regard this information as within scope and deal with it in the ordinary way.

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the CMTEDD Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application within 30 days.

As this matter required third party consultation, the decision due date was extended by 15 working days, in accordance with section 40(2) of the Act.

Therefore, a decision is due by **17 June 2026**.

Decision on access

Searches for CMTEDD information have identified 54 documents within the scope of your request.

I have decided to grant **full access** to five documents.

I have decided to grant **partial access** to 32 documents.

I have decided to grant **no access (nondisclosure)** to 17 documents.

The records identified as relevant to your application are listed in the schedule enclosed at **Attachment A**. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

The documents located include copies of correspondence, including emails, briefing papers, Microsoft Teams Messages, a policy document, forms and legal advice. Some of the documents included draft copies of the documents with track-changes.

The information concerns requests for payment, and the processing of the application, as set out in the decision notice below.

Release of documents

The information being released to you is provided at **Attachment B**.

Scope of your request

Your requested scope **excludes information as held by the ACT Integrity Commission**. Where a part of a document includes information held by the ACT Integrity Commission, those parts of the documents have been redacted on the basis that they are 'outside scope' of your request.

Additional information within some documents does not relate to your requested topic and have also been redacted as outside scope of your request, such as email chains containing updates on multiple briefing papers.

Copies

Copies or duplicates of records have mostly been excluded, however they have been redacted under 'copies' where the complete document could not be completely excluded. For example, duplicate copies of emails in email chain. This is in accordance with ACT Ombudsman Freedom of Information (FOI) Guidelines.

Statement of Reasons

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decisions is below. In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act
- the information that falls within the scope of your request
- third party consultation
- correspondence with you
- ACT Ombudsman Freedom of Information Guidelines
- *Human Rights Act 2004* (HR Act)
- *Integrity Commission Act 2018* (IC Act)
- *Information Privacy Act 2014* (IP Act)
- *Financial Management Act 1996* (FMA), including s 130
- Publicly available information
- Policy Document: [Act of Grace Policy and Procedures guide](#)

As a decision maker, I am required to determine whether the information within scope is in the public interest to release. To make this decision, I am required to:

- assess whether the information would be contrary to public interest to disclose as per **Schedule 1** of the Act.

- perform the public interest test as set out in section 17 of the Act by balancing the factors favouring disclosure and factors favouring nondisclosure in **Schedule 2** of the Act.

Exemptions claimed

Schedule 1: Information taken to be contrary to the public interest

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the information or components of information found within documents are as follows:

- *Section 1.2 - Information subject to legal professional privilege.*
- *Section 1.3 - Information disclosure of which is prohibited under law.*

Binder 3 and some information in Binder 1, Part 2 contains documents are either fully or partially composed of information that is considered to be contrary to the public interest information under **Schedule 1, section 1.2** of the Act as it is information that is deemed privileged under Legal Professional Privilege (LPP). This information can only be released if the parties involved agree to waive that privilege. The parties have not waived privilege. Other documents within the binders containing LPP information includes emails provided for the dominant purpose of legal advice, including the forms for obtaining legal advice, as well as instructions for drafting documents. LPP information relates to topics related to your requested scope.

Some information concerning the identity of AOG payment recipients within scope of your request is considered to be contrary to the public interest under **Schedule 1, section 1.3**:

(6) Any other information the disclosure of which is prohibited by a secrecy provision of a law.

(7) In this section:

secrecy provision—*a provision of a law is a secrecy provision if it;*

(a) applies to information obtained in the exercise of a function under the law; and

(b) prohibits people mentioned in the provision from disclosing the information, whether the prohibition is absolute or subject to stated exceptions or qualifications

The *Information Privacy Act 2014* (IP Act), Territory Privacy Principle (TPP) 6 states:

*If a public sector agency holds personal information about an individual that was collected for a particular purpose (the **primary purpose**), the agency must not use or disclose the information for another purpose (the **secondary purpose**) unless—*

(a) the individual has consented to the use or disclosure of the information; or

(b) TPP 6.2 or TPP 6.3 applies in relation to the use or disclosure of the information.

Section 20 of the IP Act stipulates that *'a public sector agency must not do an act, or engage in a practice, that breaches a TPP'*.

Information of individuals was collected for the primary purpose related to functions of the ACT Integrity Commission, including Act of Grace (AOG) payment recipients related to those functions. Release of this information subsequent to the primary purpose would be a secondary purpose.

The ACT Integrity Commission operates under the *Integrity Commission Act 2018* (IC Act), which has its own secrecy provisions. While your request concerns information that is administrative in nature, consideration was given to protecting information that is reasonably likely to identify parties to matters before the ACT Integrity Commission.

Importantly, your request relates to an AOG payment. Applications for AOG payments are made under section 130 of the *Financial Management Act 1996* (FMA). Section 130(10) states:

130 Act of grace payments

(10) The notes relating to a payment under this section must not disclose the identity of the payee unless disclosure was agreed to by the payee as a condition of authorising the payment.

As noted in the scope of your request, you have requested information related to notes reported in the ACT Integrity Commission's [annual report](#) (page 105). I note the payee, being the recipient of the AOG payment, was not identified in the annual report, and therefore not publicly known, and I have taken this into consideration in making my decision.

I have decided this information is exempt from release under **Schedule 1, 1.3**. The names of parties involved in the application for an AOG have also been redacted. Some of the information within the documents is reasonably likely to identify witnesses and the recipient of an act of grace payment and accordingly, I have decided that this information is also contrary to the public interest information and is exempt under **Schedule 1, 1.3**.

Public Interest Test

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interest lies. As part of this process, I must consider factors favouring disclosure and nondisclosure.

In *Hogan v Hinch* (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Schedule 2: Factors to be considered when deciding the public interest.

Taking into consideration the information within scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest'.

Factors favouring disclosure (Section 2.1)

- *Section 2.1(a)(i) - promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(ii) - contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(iii) - inform the community of the government's operations, including policies, guidelines and codes of conduct followed by the government in its dealings with members of the community.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(iv) - ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds.*

- *Section 2.1(a)(vii) - advance the fair treatment of individuals and other entities in accordance with the law in their dealings with the government.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(viii) - reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.*

You have requested information related to AOG payments. As stated in the [Act of Grace Policy and Procedures guide](#), the authority for AOG payments is provided by section 130 of the *Financial Management Act 1996* (FMA). The FMA provides statutory authority for AOG payment so that there is a lawful basis for the expenditure of public money where it is not otherwise authorised by law.

I have decided to release policy and procedural information that relates to AOG payment applications. I consider that this would reasonably contribute to informing the community of policies and procedures implemented for the expenditure of public funds in special circumstance in addition to informed debate on the processes of AOG payments. I afford this factor for disclosure moderate weight.

I have also considered the factors for disclosure including advancing the fair treatment of individuals in accordance with the law in their dealings with government and revealing the reason for a government decision. I find little weight in release of information concerning AOG payee identities, however, there may be some weight in the release of this information in terms of contextual information (policy).

I am satisfied that these factors favouring disclosure carry some weight. However, these factors are to be balanced against the factors favouring nondisclosure.

Factors favouring nondisclosure (Section 2.2)

- *Section 2.2(a)(ii) - prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004.*
- *Section 2.2(a)(iv) - impede the administration of justice generally, including procedural fairness.*
- *Section 2.2(a)(ix) - prejudice the flow of information to the police or another law enforcement or regulatory agency.*
- *Section 2.2(a)(xi) - prejudice trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person.*
- *Section 2.2(a)(xiv) - prejudice the conduct of considerations, investigations, audits or reviews by the ombudsman, auditor-general, integrity commission, integrity commission inspector or human rights commission.*
- *Section 2.2(a)(xvi) - prejudice a deliberative process of government.*
- *Section 2.2(b)(iv) - the information is information disclosure of which is prohibited by an Act of the Territory, a State or the Commonwealth.*

I have withheld some information in the documents as it contained personal information, such as photographs of people's faces, names, mobile numbers and email addresses that may identify individuals. Having reviewed the information, I consider that the protection of an individual's right to privacy, is a significant factor for nondisclosure. Release of information concerning individual employees who are working within the ACT Public Service is generally not considered to prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy. However, where mobile phone numbers may be used for home and work

purposes, this information is redacted, as it could or would reasonably be expected to prejudice an individual's right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Recipients of AOG payments are entitled to procedural fairness in addition to their details remaining free from disclosure. As noted in both the FMA and the policy, "The FMA prohibits the disclosure of details in relation to the payee, unless disclosure was agreed to by the payee as a condition of the Treasurer authorising the payment". On balance against public interest, I weight these factors significantly.

I have considered the flow of information between an entity and a regulatory agency such as the act Integrity Commission. I have found in this case, that there were legal obligations relating to information collection (information was not given on a voluntary basis) and as such weight this factor lightly. However, information held by the Integrity Commission is out of scope from this request, in addition to being exempt under schedule 1.

I have also considered the impact of disclosing information which relates to business affairs. In the case of *Re Mangan and The Treasury* [2005] AATA 898 the term 'business affairs' was interpreted as meaning 'the totality of the money-making affairs of an organisation or undertaking as distinct from its private or internal affairs'. Schedule 2 section 2.2(a)(xi) allows for government information to be withheld from release if disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to prejudice the trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person.

The ACT Government frequently deals with businesses and while business information is subject to information access legislation, third parties should not be adversely affected by the operation of the FOI Act. I have considered that some third-party information could cause harm to the third party if disclosed. I weight this factor significantly.

Schedule 2, section 2.2(a)(xiv) provides for the nondisclosure of information that could prejudice the conduct of considerations, investigations, audits or reviews by bodies including the integrity commission. Some information that I have examined could interfere with an investigation. I weight this factor significantly.

A deliberative process involves the weighing up or evaluation of arguments or considerations related to a process that is being undertaken within government to consider whether and how to make or implement a decision [*Public Transport Association of Canberra Inc and Transport Canberra and City Services* [2025] ACTOFOI 4 (4 April 2025), citing *Re JE Waterford and Department of Treasury (No 2)* [1984] AATA 67 (14 March 1984) at [58]]. For the factor to apply, the information must also be reasonably expected to prejudice such a process, in other words, some sort of harm to the deliberations could occur if the information was disclosed. Relevant considerations when considering whether prejudice could reasonably be expected to occur includes whether the information sought is already publicly known, the stage of the deliberations, whether a final decision has been reached, and whether there are any ongoing negotiations occurring.

The scope of your request includes references to a 'Govey' report. As stated in a published document ([Preliminary-Government-Response-to-the-Review-of-the-Public-Interest-Disclosure-Act-2012.docx](#)), at page 2: "the Government will consider the

Review's recommendations in greater detail, and provide a more substantive response, during the 11th Legislative Assembly."

I am satisfied that information within scope of your request, including correspondence, briefing papers and draft letters" contain sensitive confidential business information of the Territory and third parties that is reasonably likely to be prejudicial to the deliberative process, and as noted in the report: "The recommendations agreed to in principle will require further consideration and consultation with key stakeholders."

Having applied the test outlined in section 17 of the Act and deciding that release of some information contained in the documents is not in the public interest to release, I have chosen to redact this specific information in accordance with section 50(2). Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that I believe is not in the public interest to release will ensure that the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of the information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.

Charges

Processing charges are applicable for this request because the total number of pages to be released to you exceeds the charging threshold of 50 pages. However, the charges have been waived.

Your original access application and my decision will be published on the CMTEDD disclosure log. Your personal contact details will not be published.

Ombudsman Review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is provided to you, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.

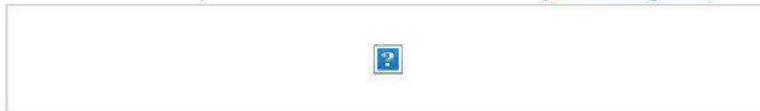

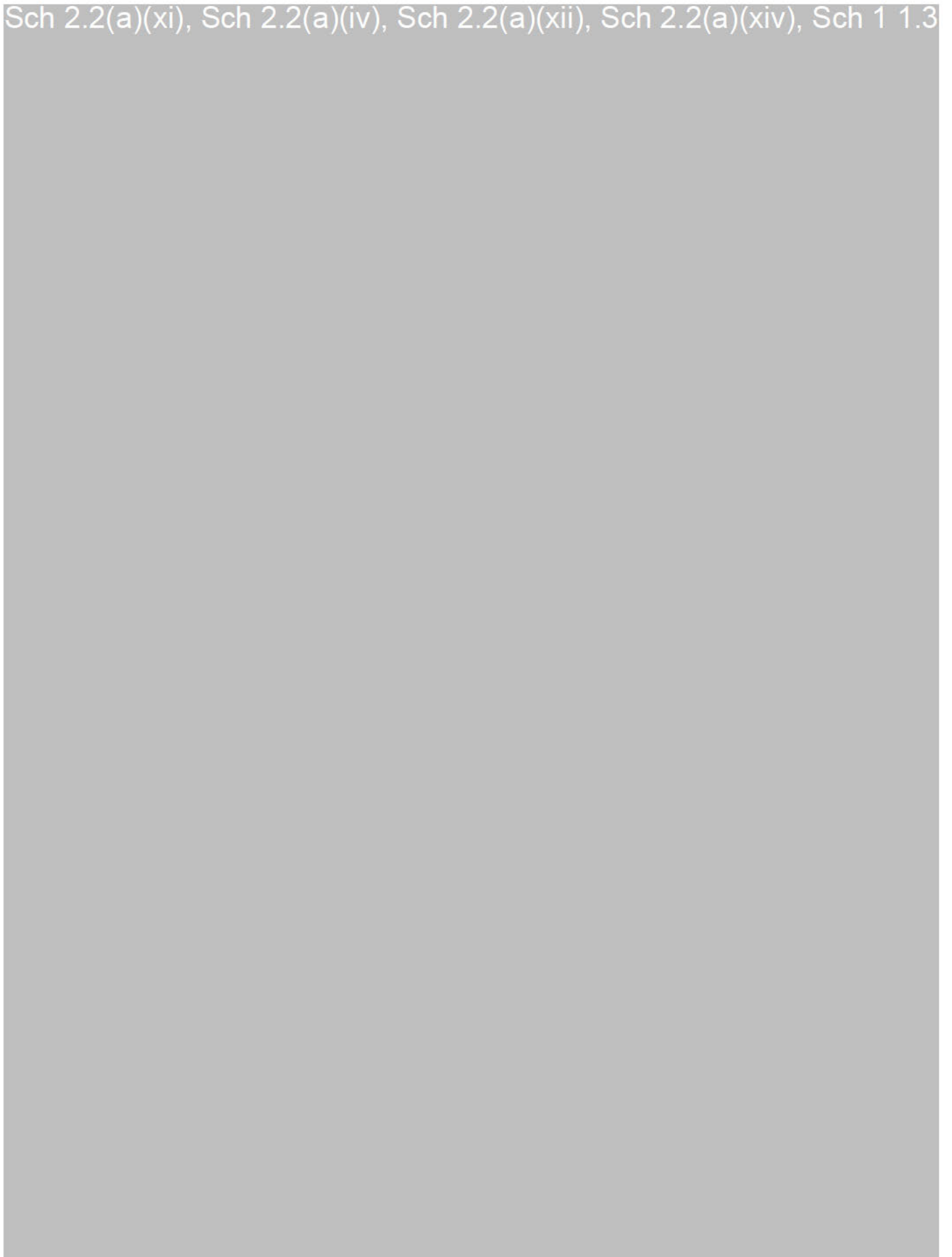

13. Under section 130 of the FMA Act you, as Treasurer, can authorise an Act of Grace payment that would not otherwise be authorised by law or required to meet a legal liability where special circumstances exist. The legislation does not specify criteria for assessing requests for an Act of Grace payment, giving discretion to make assessments on a case-by-case basis.
14. The ACT Government has published guidelines to provide elements the decision-maker may consider in determining the existence of special circumstances. The Guidelines are available at [Attachment C](#). However, an Act of Grace payment is generally an avenue of last resort and is not used where there are other options available to provide redress.
15. It is open for you to approve an Act of Grace request in this circumstance. However, you may wish to await the following information from the Commission to inform your decision;

Consideration of Policy Response for Legal Assistance

17. There has been significant recent media attention on legal assistance provided to those eligible under the Legal Services Directions in relation to matters under investigation by the Integrity Commission.
18. Further, in its annual reports since 2020/21, the Integrity Commission has put forwards its view that the Government make a regulation under section 171 of the IC Act to formalise a legal assistance scheme.

20. Should you agree, CMTEDD and JACS could commence initial policy work to scope options for a legal assistance reimbursement framework for non-Government

witnesses. This could cost and model possible frameworks with a view to bring forward policy options for consideration and approval via a future budget process. This would align with the Government's response to the review of the IC Act.

- a. This could include consideration of whether any future scheme could be retrospective, which may allow individuals previously summonsed to the Commission to seek reimbursement for legal expenses incurred prior to the regulation's enactment.
21. This work would consider different approaches to the payment of legal assistance expenses during anti-corruption inquiries in other Australian jurisdictions. A comparative table is provided for context at [Attachment D](#).
22. The Commonwealth, New South Wales, Victoria and Queensland allow any individual to apply for assistance with legal expenses.
- a. The Commonwealth, New South Wales and Queensland schemes are means tested and require an assessment of the applicant's financial position and demonstration of hardship.
 - b. The position in Victoria is unclear. An application may be made to the Secretary of the Department of Justice and Community Safety, but there are no public facing guidelines to outline who may be eligible for assistance.
23. Remaining states and territories only cover legal expenses to public officials where there is an employment nexus.

Financial Implications

24. On the basis that you agree with this brief's recommendations, there are no financial implications. Should you decide to approve the Act of Grace request, payment will be made from the Integrity Commission's existing allocated budget.

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ACT OF GRACE PAYMENTS

Definition

1. An act of grace payment is a payment of money to a person from the Territory that would not otherwise be authorised by law or required to meet a legal liability, but is authorised by the Treasurer because the Treasurer considers it is appropriate to do so because of special circumstances. It is ordinarily the case that the Territory has some moral obligation in respect of the special circumstances that warrants the authorisation of the payment. The Treasurer will make a decision after receiving advice in relation to the act of grace request and will be assisted by the procedures outlined in these guidelines.

Authority

2. The authority for act of grace payments is provided by section 130 of the *Financial Management Act 1996* (FMA). This Act provides statutory authority for an act of grace payment so that there is a lawful basis for the expenditure of public money where it is not otherwise authorised by law.

Discretion of Treasurer

3. The act of grace power is a unique discretion given to the Treasurer to authorise the making of payments to persons in special circumstances. The act of grace mechanism enables the authorisation of payments, but does not create an obligation to make these. There is no entitlement to an act of grace payment and the making of a request that sets out complete information does not guarantee a favourable outcome for the applicant.

Purpose of this Guide

4. The purpose of this guide is to set out the procedures relating to act of grace payments and thereby assist people, both in the community and in the ACT Government, in understanding why and how such payments are requested and sometimes made.

5. This guide is not intended as a guide for decision-makers in assessing the nature of special circumstances, nor the merits of any individual case. It does not limit the decision-making powers of the Treasurer nor of a decision-maker for an act of grace payment.

Request Process and Payment

6. The following procedures are addressed by these guidelines.

- Process for making a request.
- Act of grace considerations and decision-making.
- Payment and records for reporting.

Things to Consider Before Making a Request

7. Each request for an act of grace payment (as a form of discretionary financial assistance):

- is considered on its individual merits;
- is decided at the discretion of the decision-maker; and
- once decided, does not establish a precedent for other requests.

8. The act of grace mechanism is generally a remedy of last resort and is not used when there is another viable remedy available to provide redress in the circumstances giving rise to the request, such as administrative review or legal action.
9. If other avenues exist for a person to receive financial assistance from the ACT Government or elsewhere (such as existing legislation or schemes), it is recommended that those avenues be investigated before a request is made for an act of grace payment.

PROCESS FOR MAKING A REQUEST

Individuals and organisations seeking an act of grace

10. Individuals and organisations seeking an act of grace payment should write to the Treasurer to seek an act of grace payment. A fact sheet is available on the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) website explaining this process in more detail.
11. There is no prescribed format for the making of a request for an act of grace payment.
12. Those submitting a request are asked to do so by sending a letter, or an email, to the ACT Treasurer, and to include or attach all relevant evidence in support of the request. This would include information, where relevant, about:
- a) a clear explanation of the incident/situation and how it occurred;
 - b) what actions on the Government's part contributed to the situation;
 - c) what actions or factors, relating to yourself or to other relevant individuals or organisations have contributed to the situation in either a positive or negative way;
 - d) why the situation warrants being considered a special circumstance;
 - e) what other avenues have been explored (including legal and financial), and with what outcomes;
 - f) why a payment would be appropriate, and the value of the payment being sought;
 - g) Evidence, including:
 - i. how has the value of the payment being sought been estimated;
 - ii. documentary evidence of the circumstances, for example, correspondence, agreements and other documents establishing the circumstances and any loss (e.g. medical certificates and statements);
 - iii. details of court or Tribunal findings; and
 - iv. what reviews have been undertaken or may be underway;
 - h) previous correspondence with Government;
 - i) yourself (name, date of birth, place of residence) and how you can be readily contacted (via email, phone and post); and
 - j) other information that is likely to be relevant.

ACT agencies as the receiver of a request

13. Any request for an act of grace payment received by an ACT Government agency from an applicant should be forwarded to the Under Treasurer via either the Director-General, or an executive, of the agency receiving it. It would be useful for the recipient agency to liaise with Treasury prior to doing this to see whether any other information could usefully be provided at the same time.

ACT agencies as the author of a request

14. An agency may bring an individual matter or set of circumstances to the attention of ACT Treasury to discuss the merit of a request for an act of grace payment. However, an agency should generally only make a specific request for such a payment on behalf of an individual or organisation with their approval, and should consult with Treasury before doing so to ensure to the extent possible that sufficient and appropriate information is provided to help Treasury with their assessment of the application.

15. The agency receiving (or making) the request for the payment may prepare a submission for Director-General approval, justifying why an act of grace payment may be appropriate or not. A request should address the matters outlined above (relevant information and evidence) and any other matters the agency considers relevant. It should refer to what (if any) correspondence or contact has been had with the individual or organisation to whom the request relates.

16. Any submission should be forwarded to the Chief Finance Officer (or equivalent) in the agency, prior to Director-General approval. Once approved by the Director-General, the Chief Finance Officer will send the request to the Finance and Budget Division of Treasury in CMTEDD for the purposes of preparing advice for consideration by the decision maker.

Treasury review upon receipt of the request

17. Upon receipt of the request, Treasury will send a letter acknowledging receipt along with this guide. This will give the opportunity for those submitting the request to provide any additional information in relation to the request or confirm the existing application is complete.

18. When an act of grace request is made directly to the Treasurer, or to a delegate in CMTEDD, Treasury will consider the request and may undertake research in relation to the claims.

19. Staff of the Finance and Budget Division of Treasury in CMTEDD may be in contact with relevant areas of ACT Government and with the requestor to seek information.

20. Treasury will then develop advice for the Treasurer, or delegate, to consider along with the information provided in the request.

Requests for comment from agencies

21. At any stage, an agency may be invited to provide formal advice to Treasury or to the Treasurer. If there are particular sensitivities in providing comment, please liaise with an Executive in the Finance and Budget Division to ascertain an appropriate way forward.

Act of grace considerations

22. The FMA provides a discretion to the Treasurer, or an authorised delegate, to approve an act of grace payment, but does not obligate doing so.

23. The decision-maker will assess the nature of special circumstances and the appropriateness of making a payment of a relevant amount, including whether the Territory has any moral obligation in relation to the particular matter. 'Special circumstances' and 'relevant amount' are not defined in the FMA and are for the Treasurer or delegate, as decision-maker, to assess and decide on.

24. Individual circumstances are relevant in considering whether the application of a Territory law or policy, or Government action or inaction, has produced a moral obligation and/or an inequitable result in a particular case.

25. In deciding whether special circumstances exist, the decision maker may consider whether any of the following give rise to circumstances that are uncommon, exceptional or extraordinary in some way:

- a) the direct role of ACT Government in causing an unintended and inequitable result to a person such that it considers it has a moral responsibility to address the circumstances of the individual;
 - b) ACT legislation or policy has had an unintended, anomalous, inequitable or otherwise unacceptable impact on the individual's or organisation's circumstances, and the impact on the individual's or organisation's circumstances is:
 - i. specific to the individual or organisation;
 - ii. outside the parameters of events for which the individual or organisation was responsible or had the capacity to adequately control; but
 - iii. not merely the intended effect of the legislation; and
 - c) the matter is not covered by legislation or specific policy, but the ACT intends to introduce such legislation or policy, and it is considered desirable in a particular case to apply the benefits of the relevant policy to the individual or organisation prior to the legislation or policy's commencement.
26. The decision-maker may consider any other matter that is relevant to the circumstances being considered.
27. Act of grace payments may not be approved, for example:
- a) when the proposed payments would have the effect of supplementing capped payments set by other specific legislation, in circumstances where that legislation expresses the clear intention that particular payment levels cannot be exceeded in any circumstances;
 - b) when the proposed payments would have the effect of establishing a payment scheme to apply to a group of individuals, without considering the merits of their requests on an individual basis;
 - c) when a request has arisen from private circumstances outside the sphere of ACT administration, there has been no involvement of an agent or ACT Government employee or entity and the matter is not related to the impact of any ACT legislation;
 - d) in respect of a matter that relates solely to the involvement of a Territory-owned Corporation that has a separate legal identity to the ACT Government;
 - e) to compensate a person or body for a debt owed to the ACT Government; or
 - f) to compensate a person for a loss arising from a judicial decision not involving the executive arm of the Government.
28. Act of grace requests are not likely to be approved in cases where a requestor's sole assertion is that it is unfair that the individual or organisation has been historically ineligible to receive a benefit for which a person or organisation in a similar contemporary situation would now be eligible. They are also not likely to be approved in cases where a person or organisation was historically eligible for a payment but is now ineligible due to a change in certain criteria.

The decision-making step

29. Treasury will provide advice to the decision-maker, which will be considered alongside the request and any other material that has been provided.
30. The Treasurer or delegate is not obliged to follow the advice of Treasury, as full discretion to decide on a request for an act of grace payment is vested in the Treasurer, or delegate.

31. As there is no timeframe specified for the making of a decision, the decision will be made as soon as possible in light of all of the circumstances. Gathering information relevant to the request may involve Treasury making enquiries, requesting further information, conducting independent research or investigating claims made in the request. This may include seeking further information from the requestor.

32. Treasury must continue to perform its ordinary functions throughout this process and at certain times of the year (for example, in the lead up to the budget and budget review milestones) delays in the processing of an act of grace request may be unavoidable. Requestors who consider that there is time criticality for a decision should set out those matters in the request.

33. An authorisation of an act of grace payment by the Treasurer or a delegate may be expressed as being subject to conditions that need to be complied with by the payee, as set out in section 130 of the FMA.

Notification of decision

34. The outcome of the decision will be conveyed by the decision-maker to the requestor in writing. If the request is successful, the decision maker will also write to the relevant agency to notify them of the payment and any conditions attaching to it. If a requestor is unhappy with the decision, it is open to them to request reconsideration of the decision if relevant new information or a serious factual error is identified. Requestors are also welcome to seek legal advice.

Payment

35. Where a request is successful, the relevant agency will arrange for payment of the authorised amount, subject to any conditions having first been met.

Payments under the act of grace mechanism must be made from money appropriated by the ACT Legislative Assembly; and these will be reported in line with legislative requirements.

- a) If a condition is contravened, the Treasurer or a delegate may, by written notice addressed to the last-known address of the payee, require the payee, within 30 days of receipt of the notice, to pay an amount equal to all or part of the relevant amount.
- b) If the payee does not pay the amount specified in the notice, the amount may be recovered by the Territory as a debt.

Records for reporting

36. Directorates and territory authorities will keep records of all payments for reporting in the notes to financial statements in accordance with the FMA, which will detail the amount and grounds for each payment made that financial year. The FMA prohibits the disclosure of details in relation to the payee, unless disclosure was agreed to by the payee as a condition of the Treasurer authorising the payment.

Background


1. The ACT Integrity Commissioner, The Hon Michael F Adams KC, wrote to the then Treasurer, Mr Andrew Barr MLA, on 19 March 2024 (Attachment C) seeking:
 - a. authorisation for an act of grace payment (Sch 1 1.3 [REDACTED]) to section 130 of the *Financial Management Act 1996* (FMA); and
 - b. to raise the general issue of reimbursing costs for non-Government witnesses appearing before the Commission.

4. While the Government has not yet made a regulation in relation to section 171, financial assistance to witnesses participating in Commission inquiries is available to current and former ACT public servants under the *Law Officers Legal Services Directions 2023* (Legal Services Directions).
 - a. The November 2023 Review of the IC Act (the 'Govey Review') recommended that the Government formalise the legal assistance scheme for all persons appearing before the Commission.
 - i. The Government Response to the Review of the IC Act (CAB2023/643) noted this recommendation and deferred further consideration to the eleventh Assembly.

7. On 30 July 2024, in response to a joint brief (CMTEDD2024/2865 at Attachment D) from the Deputy Director-General - Office of Industrial Relations and Workforce Strategy (OIRWS) and the Deputy Under Treasurer - Budget, Procurement, Investment and Finance, Chief Minister agreed that:
 - a. Treasury further investigate whether to authorise an act of grace payment in this instance; and
 - b. OIRWS, in consultation with officials from the Justice and Community Safety Directorate, ACTGS and Treasury, commence work to assess a basis for establishing an appropriate legal assistance scheme under the IC Act. 
 - i. OIRWS indicated that preliminary investigative work is ongoing.

Issues

Section 130 of the *Financial Management Act 1996*

9. Section 130 of the *Financial Management Act 1996* (FMA) allows the Treasurer to authorise a payment that would not otherwise be authorised by law or required to meet a legal liability.

130 Act of grace payments

- a. If the Treasurer considers it appropriate to do so because of special circumstances, the Treasurer may authorise the payment by a directorate or territory authority of an amount to a person (the **payee**) although the payment of that amount (the **relevant amount**) would not otherwise be authorised by law or required to meet a legal liability.
10. The FMA does not provide a definition of the terms “special circumstances” or “relevant amount”. The ACT Government has developed and published policies and guidelines for the consideration of act of grace requests.
11. Act of grace payments are discretionary. This means there is no situation which creates an automatic entitlement to an act of grace payment.
12. An act of grace payment is generally an avenue of last resort and is not used where there are other options available to provide redress.

What are Special Circumstances?

13. In deciding whether a special circumstance exists, including whether the Territory has a moral obligation in relation to the matter, the ACT Government’s policy provides that a decision maker may consider whether any of the following give rise to circumstances that are uncommon, exceptional or extraordinary in some way:
 - a. the direct role of the ACT Government in causing an unintended and inequitable result to a person such that it considers it has a moral responsibility to address the circumstances of the individual;
 - b. ACT legislation or policy though properly applied has had an unintended, anomalous, inequitable, or otherwise unacceptable impact on the individual’s or organisation’s circumstances, and the impact on the individual’s or organisation’s circumstances is:
 - i. specific to the individual or organisation;
 - ii. outside the parameters of events for which the individual or organisation was responsible or had the capacity to adequately control; but
 - iii. not merely the intended effect of the legislation; and
 - c. the matter is not covered by legislation or specific policy, but the ACT intends to introduce such legislation or policy, and it is considered desirable in a particular case to apply the benefits of the relevant policy retrospectively. ✓
 - d. any other matter that is rationally connected to the circumstances being considered.
14. Being merely policy, this is not an exhaustive list of the factors that may be taken into account; nor is it binding on decision-makers. It should not preclude considering

anything a decision-maker considers relevant or allow the consideration of factors not rationally connected to the subject matter.
