Summary of impacts:

- The ACT Road Safety Strategy 2020–25 and ACT Road Safety Action Plan 2020–23 (the Road Safety Strategy and Action Plan) sets the direction for the ACT Government's efforts to improve road safety.
- The key goals of the Road Safety Strategy are:
 - o reduce serious and fatal crashes;
 - o build a community that shares responsibility for road safety;
 - o change road user attitudes and behaviour through education and compliance activities; and
 - strengthen collaboration across Government and with stakeholders to improve road safety in the ACT.
- Addressing road safety issues will have positive flow-on effects for the safety of all road users and the community more broadly.
