## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – RELEASE OF DEFERRED DOCUMENTS

I refer to your application under section 14 of the ACT *Freedom of Information Act* 1989 (the Act), received by the Justice and Community Safety Directorate (the Directorate) on 9 February 2015 in which you sought access to the following:

"All documents and any information held by the Directorate regarding contract 2014/1820-01... [including] ... correspondence regarding selection of the contractor, correspondence with the contractor and reports and accompanying information."

I am the officer authorised under section 22 of the Act to make a decision in relation to your request.

I note that I have previously provided you with a decision in relation to this request on 10 April 2015 and that documents were provided to you on that date and also on 15 April 2015 and 8 May 2015.

The decision outlined in my letter of 10 April 2015 included that access to the report prepared by the contractor and some other related documents would be deferred as these were subject to the provisions set out in section 20(d) of the Act which deals with the deferment of access.

On 14 May 2015, the ACT Road Safety Camera Strategy and the report on the University of New South Wales' (UNSW) evaluation of the ACT road safety camera program were presented in the Legislative Assembly. As these documents have now been tabled, I am providing ten documents for which access was originally deferred.

Please find attached a schedule detailing ten additional documents being released. One document (Reference Number 50) in the schedule provided with the documents released on 10 April 2015, to which access was deferred, has not be released. This is

because on reviewing the document I have decided that it is out of the scope of your request.

For ease of access, I am sending the released documents to you electronically due to the size of some documents. These documents include the report by UNSW, which is also now publicly available from the Justice and Community Safety Directorate's website at: www.justice.act.gov.au.

In relation to the additional information being released today I have assessed the information under the ACT Government's Online Freedom of Information Publication Policy and have determined that the documents which will be fully released, including this decision letter, will be published online. You have the right to seek a review of this outcome under section 59 of the Act within 28 days from the date of this letter, or such other period as the Director-General permits. This right of review extends to a review of the adequacy of the search for documents undertaken by the Directorate. If you wish to seek a review you should write to:
