FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

1. I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 23 November 2018, in which you sought access to:
 - “Documents, photos and reports related to the Canberra Light Rail project safety audit and inspection of electrical works. Of particular interest is the 11KV cabling with relation to compliance, installation drawings and inspection reports. Reports from the Utility Technical Regulator and Specialist Electrical Engineering Group (SEEG).”
2. On 6 December 2018 you refined the scope to:
 - “HV, LV cable and pit installation, planned compared to as constructed and inspection/audit findings if they exist;
 - Traffic Signal pit and cable installation planned compared to as constructed, inspection/audit findings if they exist;
 - Cable installation compliance with relevant Australian Standards’; and
 - The qualifications, training and experience of the person/s supervising and installing the cable/s, if known”.
3. On 19 December 2018, following a meeting with representatives of Access Canberra you agreed to limit the timeframe of the request to documents between 19 September 2018 and 19 December 2018. You also agreed to an extension of time until 31 January 2019.
4. On 30 January 2019, I wrote to inform you of the need for third party consultation. In accordance with section 38(5)(b) of the Act the due date was extended by 15 working days to allow the relevant third parties to provide their views on disclosure of the documents.

Authority

5. I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

6. In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application by 21 February 2019.

Third Party Consultation

7. In making this decision, I completed consultation in accordance with section 38 of the Act. The views of Canberra Metro Constructions and SEEG Holdings Pty Ltd were taken into account in making this decision.

Decision on access

8. Searches were completed for relevant documents and 80 documents were identified that fall within the scope of points 1, 2 and 3 of your access request. No documents were identified that fall within the scope of point 4 of your request. I have been advised that this information has not been provided by the relevant contractor.
9. I have decided to release 25 documents in full and grant partial access to 54 documents and withhold from release 1 documents. The information that has been withheld from release or redacted in the documents I consider to be information that is contrary to the public interest in accordance with section 16 of the Act, or would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.
10. I have included as Attachment A to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of the documents that fall within the scope of your request and the access decision for that document.
11. My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as Attachment B to this letter.

Material considered

12. In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:
 - the Act;
 - the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
 - contentions made by Canberra Metro Constructions and Specialist Electrical Engineering Group (SEEG) pursuant to section 38 of the Act; and
 - the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Third Party Contentions

13. Pursuant to section 38 of the Act, third party consultation was undertaken with Canberra Metro Constructions and SEEG Holdings Pty Ltd which CMTEDD considered

that release of the information may reasonably be expected to be of concern to. Canberra Metro Constructions raised a number of objections to the release of this information under Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 of the Act. I consider the objections to the release of the information raised by Canberra Metro Constructions are 'relevant considerations' for the purposes of this decision. Accordingly, I have addressed each of these contentions in my decision letter.

14. The Schedule 1 objections raised by Canberra Metro Constructions which I have not accepted and my reasons for not accepting these contentions are outlined below. Objections to the release of information pursuant to Schedule 2 of the Act are considered as relevant factors in applying the public interest test prescribed by section 17 of the Act under the heading 'exemptions claimed'.

Contrary to the public interest information under schedule 1 (section(s) 1.13 & 1.14) of the Act

- Information the disclosure of which would or could reasonably be expected to damage the security of the Commonwealth, the Territory or the State.
 - Information the disclosure of which would or could reasonably be expected to;
 - prejudice the maintenance or enforcement of a lawful method or procedure for protecting public safety.
 - endanger the security of a building, structure or vehicle.
15. Schedule 1.13 allows for information to be withheld if the release of that information would, or could reasonably be expected to damage the security of the Territory. This provision extends to information that includes the 'detection, prevention or suppression of activities that are subversive of, or hostile to, the interests of the Territory'.
16. An objection to the release of information relating to the Canberra Light Rail electrical works has been raised on the grounds of national security, as some of the information contained in the documents outlines the locations of critical infrastructure and provides technical details about the Canberra Light Rail electrical system. The release of this information it is argued 'could endanger the security of the Canberra Light Rail'.
17. In considering this objection, I note that the documents provided to CMTEDD do not contain any national security markers as prescribed by the Protective Security Policy Framework and that the documents in question have been transmitted between various parties using unclassified networks, indicating this information is not considered by the author or parties using the information to be classified national security information.
18. Further, I also researched other Australian rail projects online and noted that documents containing similar information about locations of infrastructure and technical details is readily available online from NSW RailCorp and other State

Governments. As part of this research, I found the Evoenergy Annual Planning Report 2018, which contains information about the Canberra Light Rail, including a map of the proposed optical fibre communications network and chamber substations. I further note that information about the location of the ICON network is publicly available through the 'Dial before you dig' service.

19. Taking into account that information about the Canberra Light Rail is already available online, the fact that similar information has been made available by other jurisdictions and that there has been no attempt to protect the release of this information in accordance with the Protective Security Policy Framework, I am not satisfied that the information in these documents can be considered to be national security information. Subsequently, I consider that schedule 1 section 1.13 of the Act does not apply to these documents.
20. Schedule 1 section 1.14(h) of the Act allows for documents which would, or could reasonably be expected to endanger the security of a building, structure of vehicle to be withheld from release.
21. As outlined in my reasons for not accepting that release of the information could reasonably be expected to damage the security of the Commonwealth, I note that this type of information is publicly available in other jurisdictions. While I accept that release of this information may allow an individual with the correct technical expertise to more quickly identify critical infrastructure, I am not satisfied that release of this information could reasonably be expected to increase the risk of damage occurring to infrastructure, beyond what could reasonably be expected from an individual identifying this infrastructure from viewing the Canberra Light Rail route. Accordingly, I am not satisfied that the release of the information contained in the documents could endanger the security of a building, structure or vehicle.
22. Finally, it is claimed that release of this information may prejudice the maintenance and enforcement of a lawful method or procedure for protecting public safety under schedule 1, section 1.14(g) of the Act.
23. Schedule 1, section 1.14(g) is intended to be used to protect documents which outline the method or process for protecting public safety, for example, policing plans for major public events. The documents which are subject to this request were not created for this purpose and while they contain technical details, they do not provide any information about the methods for protecting the Canberra Light Rail system, for example information about security guards, or the operation of the CCTV system. Subsequently, I consider that Schedule 1 section 1.14 does not apply to these documents.
24. Based on the evidence before me, I am not satisfied that the Schedule 1 exemptions claimed by Canberra Metro Constructions apply to the documents within the scope of this request.

Exemption claimed

25. Having considered all the relevant information and contentions by impacted parties, my reasons for deciding not to grant access to the identified documents and components of these documents are as follows:

Contrary to the public interest information under schedule 1 (section 1.2) of the Act

- Information that would be privileged from production or admission into evidence in a legal proceeding on the ground of legal professional privilege.
26. Pages 415 – 416 are legal advice or contain legal advice from the Government Solicitor’s Office. These documents are subject to legal professional privilege as they were brought into existence for the dominant purpose of providing a legal opinion in relation to this matter. These documents would be privileged from production or admission into evidence in a legal proceeding. Having reviewed these documents, I am satisfied that the legal advice that forms the basis of the submission was provided by an independent legal adviser satisfying the requirements to attract legal professional privilege.
27. Accordingly, I am satisfied that the provisions within schedule 1, section 1.2 of the Act apply to these documents.

Public Interest Test under schedule 2 of the Act

28. The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interests lies. As part of this process I must consider factors favouring disclosure and non-disclosure.
29. In *Hogan v Hinch* (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when ‘used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from “the subject matter and the scope and purpose” of the enactment in which it appears’. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Factors favouring disclosure (Schedule 2.1)

30. Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the public interest:
- promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government’s accountability;
 - contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest;
 - ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds; and

- reveal environmental or health risks or measures relating to public health and safety.
31. It is the contention of Canberra Metro Constructions that there are no factors in favour of disclosure that apply to the documents that have been identified as being within the scope of this request. I disagree with this statement and consider the factors identified above are relevant in determining this matter.
32. In reviewing the documents, I consider that the release of information contained in these documents may reveal environmental or health risks, or measures relating to public health and safety through the provision of documents relating to the compliance of the electrical systems on the Canberra Light Rail project. The Canberra Light Rail project is a significant project for the ACT Government and is expected to be used by a large number of individuals once operational. The release of documents showing the certification process, including areas that require attention before being signed off by relevant regulators can be achieved is, in my opinion, in the public interest as these issues if not correctly addressed, have the potential to cause harm to users of the Canberra Light Rail system.
33. I am also satisfied that release of these documents will ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds, promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability. I consider release of this information may contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest, namely the safety of the Canberra Light Rail project, the expenditure of public funds and role the ACT Government has in ensuring the project is delivered in a quick, efficient and safe manner.
34. I am of the view that the release of the documents will provide the public with information regarding the requirements that are being imposed to ensure safety of the Canberra Light Rail system and the rigorous testing being undertaken as part of the project. Further I consider the documents demonstrate the requirements that have been imposed on Canberra Metro Constructions to deliver the Canberra Light Rail project in compliance with relevant standards and in a safe and cost-effective manner. I consider this information is particularly in the public interest given it relates to a project involving the expenditure of \$700m of public money and given the Canberra Light Rail project has and continues to be a subject of significant interest in the ACT community.

Factors favouring non-disclosure (Schedule 2.2)

35. As required in the public interest test set out in section 17 of the Act, I have also identified the following public interest factors in favour of non-disclosure that I believe are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest':
- prejudice trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person;

- prejudice security, law enforcement and public safety;
- prejudice the flow of information to a regulator;
- is about an unsubstantiated allegations of misconduct or unlawful, negligent or improper conduct and disclosure of the information could prejudice the fair treatment of an individual; and
- prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Business Affairs

36. In the case of *Re Mangan and The Treasury [2005] AATA 898* the term 'business affairs' was interpreted as meaning 'the totality of the money-making affairs of an organisation or undertaking as distinct from its private or internal affairs'. Schedule 2 section 2.2 allows for government information to be withheld from release if disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to prejudice the trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person.
37. Having reviewed the documents, I am satisfied that some of the methods and calculations contained within the Earthing and Bonding Design Report Package 02 (Stage 3) document is sensitive business information. This information was compiled by Performance Electrics Pty Ltd as part of the design work for the Canberra Light Rail System. This information was provided to Canberra Metro Constructions on the understanding it would not be released outside of this purpose. A non-disclosure statement is included in this document which further supports this claim. Accordingly, I give this factor significant weight and consider release of the information would prejudice the business affairs of Performance Electrics Pty Ltd.

Security, Law Enforcement and Public Safety

38. In noting the contentions of Canberra Metro Constructions in regard to the application of schedule 1 provisions relating to the prejudice the release of the documents could have on security, law enforcement and public safety, I consider that schedule 2.2, section 2.2(a)(iii) should also be considered as part of the public interest test under section 17 of the Act. In considering this factor, I note my reasoning for not accepting that release of these documents would impact the security, or public safety of the Canberra Light system under schedule 1 applies. Accordingly, I consider this factor carries no weight in determining the public interest, as I am not satisfied that release of the information contained in the documents, could reasonably be expected to prejudice the security, or public safety of the project.

Flow of Information to a Regulator

39. The flow of information to the police or other law enforcement or regulatory agency and the agency's ability to obtain confidential information are essential for the operation of government and law enforcement. I am cognisant that release of

information under the Act may impact the future flow of information as individuals may be concerned that the information they provide will be released more widely than they had initially intended it to be.

40. In *Animals Australia Inc and Department of Agriculture* [2015] AICmr 14 the Australian Information Commissioner, in addressing similar provisions under the Commonwealth Freedom of Information Act, was asked to consider if the release of information from a third party which was provided voluntarily should be withheld on the grounds that its release may impact the provision of similar voluntary information in the future. In making his decision the Information Commissioner was not satisfied that release of the information would impact the provision of future information. He noted that the information was voluntary and at any time, the individuals who provided the information could choose to stop providing the information to the Department. Further the Commissioner noted that release of the information would be unlikely to impact the flow of future information as it was in the interests of the third party to provide the information to the Department if asked to do so by their employer.
41. On reviewing the documents within the scope of the request, I note that all of the information has been provided to the ACT Government in a voluntary manner as it has been in the interest of Canberra Metro Constructions as part of the Canberra Light Rail project to achieve relevant certifications. Taking into account the decision in *Animals Australia Inc and Department of Agriculture*, the subject matter of the documents and the fact that the information provided was voluntary, I am not satisfied that release of this information could be reasonably expected to prejudice flow of information to the police or other law enforcement or regulatory agency or the agency's ability to obtain confidential information as the information is being provided to meet the interests of Canberra Metro Constructions.

Unsubstantiated Allegations of Misconduct or Unlawful, Negligent or Improper Conduct

42. It is further contended by Canberra Metro Constructions that some of the documents within the scope of the request contain unsubstantiated allegations of misconduct or unlawful, negligent or improper conduct and the disclosure of this information could prejudice the fair treatment of individuals. In reviewing the documents, I am mindful that the issues identified in regard to non-compliance of the Canberra Light Rail electrical system with relevant code standards are interim reports designed to highlight areas which require additional remediation activities. I do not consider these allegations are unsubstantiated as they are identified by relevant experts and supported with evidence to show the non-compliance. It is noted that many of the non-compliances are acknowledged by Canberra Metro Constructions. Therefore, I am satisfied this factor does not apply.

Personal Privacy

43. Finally, I consider that the protection of an individual's right to privacy, especially in the course of dealings with the ACT Government is a significant factor as the parties involved have provided their personal information for the purposes of working with the ACT Government, in my opinion, outweighs the benefit which may be derived from releasing the personal information of the individual's involved in this matter.
44. These individuals are entitled to expect that the personal information they have supplied as part of this process will be dealt with in a manner that protects their privacy. Considering the type of information to be withheld from release, I am satisfied that the factors in favour of release can still be met while protecting the personal information of the individuals involved. I therefore weight the factor for non-disclosure more highly than the factor in favour of release in this instance. As a result, I have decided that release of this information (email addresses, mobile numbers and names of individuals not employed by the ACT Public Service) could prejudice their right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.
45. In reviewing the documents, I consider that overall the weight of factors in favour of disclosure outweigh the factors in favour of non-disclosure. However, I consider that there are some documents where this does not apply. Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that I believe is not in the public interest to release accordance with section 50(2) of the Act will ensure the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of the information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request. Details of the documents to be released and the relevant sections which information has been withheld from release are at Attachment A.

Release of Documents

46. In accordance with section 38(6)(b) of the Act, I am required to withhold the release of these documents until the end of the third-party review period. Unless a review of my decision is sought, the documents will be provided to you after 22 March 2019.

Charges

47. Pursuant to Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2017 (No 2) processing charges are applicable for this request because the total number of pages to be released to you exceeds the charging threshold of 50 pages. However, the charges have been waived in accordance with section 107(2)(b) of the Act.

Online publishing – Disclosure Log

48. Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents released to you in response to your access application will be published in

the CMTEDD disclosure log on or after 27 February 2019. Your personal contact details will not be published.


