19-298 Building and Construction Legislation Amendment Bill 2019

Summary of Impacts

The proposal:

- will help to maximise the Territory's investment in building regulatory reforms and administration of the building regulatory system;
- has mainly positive social impacts for building owners affected by defective construction work, particularly access to justice, and for disadvantaged and vulnerable owners;
- may have positive impacts on the cost of living, and consumption for certain building owners;
- may have minor positive impacts on skills and education, and visual quality;
- has neutral effects on human rights, in that impacts on human rights are reasonable in a fair and just society and in balance with improved protections for building owners; and
- does not trade off economic, social and environmental outcomes.

Key to impacts: Red – negative, Blue - neutral and Green - positive.
