20/250 Translation Services in response to COVID-19

Summary of impacts:

COVID-19 has increased the vulnerability of large cohorts of Canberrans.

The ACT has a significant proportion (24%) of people who speak a language other than English at home, including people who speak no or very little English.

The effectiveness of the ACT Government to contain and manage the spread of COVID-19 requires a level of community understanding and adherence to direction never required before. To achieve this, it is critical all Canberrans have access to, and receive, information they understand.

The Australian Government and SBS have invested significantly in providing important health and community messaging in a large range of languages, including verbally for some languages that are not written such as Dinka. This information is available and shared with the Canberra community via the ACT COVID-19 website.

This information does not cover ACT specific messaging which is a critical gap in information for Canberrans who speak little to no English. The rapidly changing nature of COVID-19 requires Canberrans to fully understand the restrictions to follow advice, directions and to be able to access support if needed. This includes understanding what support is available and where, testing requirements, changes to education and childcare and physical distancing measures.

This proposal ensures timely, accurate and ACT specific information is translated in multiple languages and is distributed to support Canberrans who speak little to no English, to receive and be able to act on important information in relation to their health, wellbeing as well as economic matters.
