FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 13 March 2023 where you sought access to:

All invoices, statements and booking confirmations received from the between 1 January 2018 and 31 December 2021 in relation to the hiring of private meeting rooms for meetings. Those invoices would be addressed to either: The Commissioner for Fair Trading Access Canberra, ACT Government Solicitor's office, Minister Shane Rattenbury's office.

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD was required to provide a decision on your access application by 12 April 2023. However, following third-party consultation as required under section 38 of the Act, the due date for a decision was rescheduled to **4 May 2023**.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant documents and three documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have included as **Attachment A** to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

I have decided to grant partial access to three documents relevant to your request as I consider them to contain:

- contrary to the public interest information under schedule 1; or
- information that would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act, my access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as **Attachment B** to this letter.

Statement of Reasons

In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request
- the Information Privacy Act 2014

Exemption claimed

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the identified documents and components of these documents are as follows:

<u>Information that would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under</u> the test set out in section 17 of the Act

Public Interest

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interests lies. As part of this process, I must consider factors favouring disclosure and non-disclosure.

In Hogan v Hinch (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest'.

Factors favouring disclosure in the public interest:

- (a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:
 - (i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.
 - (vii) reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.

Information concerning meetings of the government for the Territory is reasonably expected to provide some context and shows transparency. I weigh these factors highly.

Factors favouring nondisclosure in the public interest:

- (a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:
 - (ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004.

Having reviewed the information, I consider that the protection of an individual's right to privacy, is a significant factor. Release of information concerning individuals working within the ACT Public Service is generally not considered to prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy. However, where mobile phone numbers may be used for home and work purposes, this information is redacted. I have redacted the personal details of an employee of Hotel Realm, as I consider that they were provided as part of a business transaction with the ACT government, they can reasonably expect that these details will not be disclosed. The release of such information could or would reasonably be expected to prejudice an individual's right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act* 2004.

Having applied the test outlined in section 17 of the Act and deciding that release of some personal information contained in the documents is not in the public interest to release, I have chosen to redact this specific information in accordance with section 50(2).

Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that I believe is not in the public interest to release will ensure that the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of the information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable for this request because there are less than 50 pages.

Online publishing - Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents released to you in response to your access application will be published in the CMTEDD disclosure log after 8 May 2023. Your personal contact details will not be published.

Ombudsman Review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act.
