Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of CMTEDD under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD was required to provide a decision on your access application by 9 October 2023.

Under the strategy, the ACTPS operates a network of Veterans' Employment |

Executive Champions who support and promote the employment of veterans. In 2020, the ACTPS was awarded the • 2020 Veterans' Employer of the Year for Public Sector Organisations in the Prime Minister's Veterans' Employment Awards. The ACT Government's Veterans' Employment website includes advice about beginning a career in the ACT Public Service (ACTPS) workforce. Among other resources, the ACTPS Veterans' Employment Transition Guide provides information on the ACTPS and useful tips for job searching and navigating the application and selection process. The ACTPS attends ADF Transition Seminars. During these events, ADF personnel looking to transition out of Defence Services can access further information and support to apply for ACTPS jobs. The ACTPS Vocational Employment Program (VEP) is an entry level pathway to permanent ACTPS employment for people from diverse backgrounds; it was expanded this year to include applicants from Defence families, ie: children and partners of serving ADF members. The ACTPS holds a Platinum Pledge Partnership with Soldier On. The Soldier On Pledge is a voluntary standard that signals ACTPS support for current and ex-serving ADF personnel and their families and recognition of the valuable skills and experience they bring to work.

Charges
