## **ATTORNEY-GENERAL BILL SUPPORTS INQUIRIES** INTO CONVICTIONS

Attorney-General Simon Corbell today announced amendments to the Crimes Act 1900 that will clarify the judicial nature of the function exercised by the Supreme Court when it considers a report of an inquiry, and also ensure that there are no unnecessary limitations on its ability to hear submissions on the report. These amendments are based on issues that arose during the Supreme Court's recent deliberations on Acting Justice Martin's Inquiry report into the conviction of Mr David Harold Eastman, will help support the process of inquiring into criminal convictions.

The amendments are in line with a decision already made by the Court in this matter and by applying retrospectively, will prevent delays caused by further questions about the Court's ability to make a decision on the inquiry report. The amendments will have no other impact on the outcomes of Mr Eastman's matter.

"Inquiries into convictions are a special process, designed to provide an avenue for review only in the most limited and exceptional matters," said Mr Corbell. "The ACT provides an avenue for looking at criminal convictions even when there is no other legal right of appeal. These amendments will support the ACT's process for these matters."

Section 431 of the Crimes Act 1900, introduced in 2001, contains limitations on the ability of the Court to hear submissions at certain stages in the inquiry process. The Supreme Court recently considered the application of section 431 of the Crimes Act during its consideration of Acting Justice Martin's the Inquiry report into the conviction of David-Mr Eastman's conviction.

"This minor amendment supports the Supreme Court's process of responding to an inquiry report," the Attorney-General said. "Some of these issues have come to light in the first Supreme Court consideration of an inquiry report under part 20 of the Crimes Act. The amendments make minor adjustments to remove any doubt about the operation of part 20 and ensure that the independent Supreme Court process functions well."

Repealing section 431 of the Crime Act will ensure that the current proceedings continue to operate as they have to date, and will prevent confusion about the legislation from interfering with the Supreme Court's independent consideration of an inquiry report.

Thanks for your time last week to discuss the Eastman case and apologies for the delay in getting this email to you. I have prepared a brief summary below of our conversation which I would be very appreciative if you could please have a look through and correct/add detail wherever necessary/possible.

- On 10 August 2012 the Government announced a new inquiry (the Inquiry) into the conviction of Mr Eastman which drove costs to May 2014. This inquiry covered a broad range of subjects and from this a report was prepared.
- The report of the Inquiry was presented to the Registrar of the Supreme court on 29 May 2014.
- The Inquiry found the forensic case against Eastman was deeply flawed, that he had not received a fair trial, and recommended the conviction be quashed.
- The inquiry also recommended there be no retrial because of the passage of time since his conviction in 1995.
- The bench has been considering how it should respond to the inquiry.
- It is now up to a full court to decide what to do with the report.
- It is not known when the court will deliver its ruling.
- There are a two of possible outcomes:
  - o Overturn the Eastman conviction
  - o Uphold the Eastman conviction
- If the Eastman conviction is overturned and it is not challenged any more legal costs should be limited, however it would raise the issue of compensation.
- If the Eastman conviction is overturned and if it is challenged, it could lead to significant legal costs again.
- If the Eastman conviction is not overturned, it will more than likely be challenged and lead to significant legal costs as litigation would be ongoing.
- A further constitutional issue was raised whether or not the Supreme Court actually has the power to consider the report. This is currently being reviewed.

Cheryl Sizer is presently away and I have raised the question with the Cabinet office who were not in a position to provide advice on this matter without Cheryl's input.

We do have a Security Emergency Management Committee (SEMC) meeting on 16 December that we could get an appointment added to the end of the agenda if that is of assistance? (The paperwork would be needed to be lodged with Cabinet office on 10 December. However with a late lodgement letter we could make the timing later (or could even suggest to the AG that he considers walking in the appointment.)





He is also currently a part-time Commissioner of the NSW Law Reform Commission, Deputy Chair of the NSW Sentencing Council, a University Visitor for the Catholic University and a consultant for the Judicial Commission of NSW.

"Justice Whealy's skills and experience are exemplary and he will be an important addition to the ACT's judiciary," said Mr Corbell.

"His appointment also reflects this Government's commitment to support our resident judges and reduce waiting periods for resolution of matters before the courts."







Further to our discussion this morning, and my phone message this afternoon, I note that:

- The Department of Justice & Regulation (DJR) received an outline of this matter in a letter from the Acting Chief Justice of 23 June 2015. DJR provided an urgent briefing to the Attorney-General earlier this afternoon, with draft Governor in Council (GIC) documents.
- 2. DJR understands the urgency and sensitivity of this matter.
- I spoke to the relevant officer from the Office of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court earlier today, who shares my view that it would **not** be appropriate for the ACT Executive Order, which appoints Justice Ashley as an Acting Judge of the Supreme Court of ACT, to be made prior to GIC making the Victorian order under s 83(4)(i) of the Constitution Act 1975 (Vic), . We would not consider it appropriate for the order to be made prior to the Victorian GIC order, even if the ACT Executive Order did not come into effect for several weeks.
- The Office of the Victorian Attorney-General has stressed that, in accordance with the relevant protocols, DJR 4. and all other public bodies in Victoria and the ACT should refrain from presuming that the GIC order will be made, merely because the Attorney-General recommends that such an order should be made.
- If the Victorian Attorney-General determines that it is appropriate to recommend that the above GIC order should be made then:
- DJR will lodge the GIC documents once it has been advised by the ACT that the ACT Attorney-General has determined that Justice Ashley should be appointed;
- (b) if the GIC documents were signed and lodged by Monday 29 June, GIC would be expected to consider the matter at its meeting of Tuesday 7 July.
- The Office of the Victorian Attorney-General has noted that, even if the Victorian Attorney-General determines that it is appropriate to recommend that the above GIC order should be made, Victoria would not want a public announcement in the ACT that Justice Ashley will preside over the case (prior to the GIC order being made). This reflects concerns that, in accordance with the relevant protocols, it would not be appropriate to publicly presume that GIC will make the relevant order.





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# David Eastman to sue ACT for wrongful imprisonment

David Harold Eastman is suing the ACT government for wrongful imprisonment.

An ACT Supreme Court suit alleges Eastman is eligible for compensation under the Human Rights Act.

Attorney-General Simon Corbell confirmed he was aware of the litigation, but declined to comment on the case as it was before the courts.

Lawyers have previously speculated that Eastman could be <u>eligible for millions of dollars in compensation</u> if he were to pursue a payout.

Eastman spent 18 years, nine months, and 12 days (6860 days) behind bars for the murder of Australian Federal Police Assistant Commissioner Colin Winchester in 1989.

Last year, <u>an inquiry</u> found his 1995 trial had been a <u>miscarriage of justice</u>, and the full bench of the ACT Supreme Court subsequently <u>quashed his conviction</u>.

Canberra prosecutors intend to <u>retry Eastman</u>, but he has <u>launched a stay application</u> to halt the case – on the grounds he will not be able to get a fair hearing – before it can go before a jury.

The stay application is listed to be heard before Acting Justice David Ashley, QC, in February.

Court papers, filed by Eastman's lawyers, Ken Cush and Associates, last week, said the civil claim came as a result of their client's unlawful detention and wrongful conviction.

It alleged the former Treasury official's imprisonment caused him deprivation of liberty, lost income, to suffer mental harm, damage to his reputation, and he had expended legal cost and time in fighting to reverse his conviction.

Eastman alleges the territory is liable to pay him compensation for his unlawful detention under two sections of the Human Rights Act.

He has also asked for interest and costs.

"[Eastman's] imprisonment and detention was unlawful by reason that the deprivation of his liberty was not on grounds or in accordance with procedures established by law," court documents said.

The government is yet to file a defence.

The case is listed for directions in late October.

It is understood Eastman has not received an ex gratia payment – a one-off payment when the government is prepared to compensate a person, but not admit liability – but was provided assistance upon release.

The government Throughcare program helps all ex-prisoners with housing, health, financial advice and other rehabilitation, including reconnection with family and friends.

Mr Corbell said: "ACT Corrective Services has provided Mr Eastman with the same support as all other detainees who have been released from the Alexander Maconochie Centre, including access to the Extended Throughcare program, to support his transition back into the community, while on bail.

"Due to privacy considerations, I have no other comments to make regarding Mr Eastman's personal situation."

The suit follows a number of payouts for unlawful imprisonment in other high profile Australian cases.

Eastman was locked up longer than Perth man Andrew Mallard, who received a \$3.25 million payout in 2009 after serving 12 years for a murder he did not commit.

Mr Mallard, who was cleared in 2006, also received an ex gratia payment of \$200,000 upon his release.

Alice Lynne "Lindy" Chamberlain got a payout of \$1.3 million in compensation in 1992 after she spent about three years behind bars for the death of her nine-week old daughter, Azaria, at Uluru in 1980.

A coronial inquest in 2012 found a dingo had killed the child.

John Button was granted a \$400,000 ex gratia payment after he was wrongly convicted of manslaughter over the hit-and-run death of his 17-year-old girlfriend Rosemary Anderson.

Mr Button had just turned 19 in 1963 when he was sent to Fremantle Prison for five years.

He was exonerated in 2002 at age 56 when a West Australian court ruled that Ms Anderson had actually been murdered by serial killer Eric Edgar Cooke.

Despite the pardon, Mr Button is still fighting for an apology and compensation for his wrongful imprisonment, even with clear evidence showing flaws in the investigation.
