I refer to your application under section 30 of the Freedom of Information Act 2016 (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 13 August 2019.

Specifically, you are seeking: "Any and all documents and other material including correspondence, emails, briefing notes and records of communication relating to the complaint about a Liquorland promotion first made by the Foundation for Alcohol Research and Education (FARE) to the Commissioner for Fair Trading on 3 May 2019, and the complaint about a Slim Chillers promotion and product first made by FARE to the Commissioner for Fair Trading on 21 December 2018."

\section*{Authority}

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

\section*{Timeframes}

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application by 10 September 2019.

\section*{Decision on access}

Searches were completed for relevant documents and 31 documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have included as Attachment A to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

I have decided to grant access in full to seven documents relevant to your request. I have decided to grant partial access to four documents and refuse access to 19 documents as I consider they contain information that is contrary to the public interest information under schedule 1 of the Act.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as Attachment B to this letter.

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decisions is below.

\section*{Statement of Reasons}

In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:
- the Act;
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request; and
- the Information Privacy Act 2014

\section*{Exemption claimed}

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the identified documents and components of these documents are as follows:

\section*{Contrary to the public interest information under schedule 1 of the Act}

Documents 1-2, 3, 8-9, 12 and 14-31 contain, or are entirely composed of information that relates to the investigation of a contravention or possible contravention of the law. These documents provide details of the alleged offence, the investigation into the offence and includes details about methodologies and preliminary findings. These documents fall within the definition of information which is contrary to the public interest as prescribed in schedule 1 section 1.14(1)(a) of the Act. I am satisfied that release of this information would prejudice the ongoing investigation of these matters at this time.

\section*{Charges}

Pursuant to Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2017 (No 2) processing charges are not applicable for this request because the total number of pages to be released to you does not exceed the charging threshold of 50 pages.

\section*{Online publishing - Disclosure Log}

\section*{Liquor complaints}

Thank you for your letter, dated 24 April 2019, regarding the status of liquor complaints and enquiring about the review of the Liquor (Responsible Promotion of Liquor) Guidelines 2012 (No 1) (the Promotion Guidelines). I apologise for the delay in providing this response.

\section*{Slim Chillers}

In January 2019, Access Canberra Inspectors investigated the sale of "Slim Chillers Vodka Martinis" icy poles in the ACT. Costco Wholesale Warehouse in the ACT had received one batch of stock which had already been sold. Costco does not currently have these products in stock however inquiries suggest they will be restocked in Spring of 2019. Ahead of this anticipated reorder Access Canberra is considering if these products should be prohibited for being likely to have a special appeal to children or confused with confectionary or a nonalcoholic drink. Access Canberra has made inquiries of other jurisdictions to assist in our deliberations. We will be in touch once we have reached a decision.

\section*{Liquor promotions}

Access Canberra engaged with the licensee of Kokomo's to ensure that their liquor promotions aligned with the Promotion Guidelines. No issues were identified with this licensee regarding liquor promotions on routine inspections. As previously advised, it is my view that the Lazy Su promotions in question do not contravene the Act or the Promotion Guidelines and I confirm no further action will be taken in relation to this complaint.
