19/659 - ACT Planning System Review and Reform

Summary of impacts:

- The key findings of the TBL assessment is that the proposal to review and reform the planning system will have a positive or neutral impact on matters of social, environmental and economic consideration.
- Social Impacts the proposed improved spatial and detailed planning for areas will enable a
 more strategic understanding of future planning needs and intentions for areas. Facilitating
 increased development in proximity to rapid public transport, active travel infrastructure and
 well-designed public places and services will support a diverse, active and healthy community.
- Environmental Impacts urban infill and a more compact built form with greater planning guidance reduces urban sprawl and land-take and improves built form quality. Protecting landscape character and enabling growth in certain areas of the city promotes biodiversity, ecological connectivity and protects habitats.
- Economic Impacts changes to create an improved planning system and planning directions encourages productivity, investment and innovation by managing the growth of the city and providing the development industry with opportunities and greater clarity.
- The next phase of the project will further consider and, where appropriate, address social, environmental and economic matters through the development of the changes to the system and its elements.
- On balance this TBL assessment supports the proposal.
