19/604 Adoption Amendment Bill 2020 – Agreement to Introduce

Summary of impacts:

- The Bill introduces amendments to the *Adoption Act 1993* to ensure the best interests of the child or young person are the paramount consideration when dispensing with parental consent in the adoption process.
- The amendments support the ACT Government's strategic priority of social inclusion support when it matters.
- Introduction of this legislation will have no economic or environmental impacts.

The Bill seeks to reduce the adversarial nature of adoption proceedings, by supporting a holistic consideration of the rights of the child or young person, making it more likely that positive relationships can be maintained post-adoption. |
| | | The amendments further support social inclusion and community participation by seeking to rectify the misalignment between 35(1)(b) of the Adoption Act 1993 and a contemporary understanding of disability and mental health. |
| Positive | Human rights | The Bill engages human rights in the context of domestic adoption, including protection of the family and children (section 11 of the Human Rights Act 2004). The proposed amendments are also guided by the objectives of the Adoption Act 1993, supporting the rights of children and young people. |

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| Positive | Impacts on different age groups | The amendments will assist decision-makers to determine the 'best interests' of a child or young person.
