FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 12 August 2022, in which you sought access to 'a copy of all correspondence between the Chief Minister, his office and/or directorates with the NSW Government and its Ministers in relation to FuelCheck NSW and fuel price monitoring'.

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD was required to provide a decision on your access application by 09 September 2022. However, following third-party consultation, as required under section 38 of the Act, the due date is now 4 October 2022.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant documents and 17 documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have included as **Attachment A** to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

I have decided to grant access in full to five documents relevant to your request. I have decided to grant partial access to 12 documents as I consider them to contain information that would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons, in accordance with section 54(2) of the Act, and the documents released to you are provided as **Attachment B** to this letter.

Statement of Reasons

In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act,
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request,
- the views of the third parties consulted under sections 38 of the Act, and
- the Human Rights Act 2014.

<u>Information that would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act</u>

What is the Public Interest?

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interest lies. As part of this process, I must consider factors favouring disclosure and nondisclosure.

In Hogan v Hinch (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it [public interest] appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest'.

Factors favouring disclosure in the public interest under schedule 2.1:

- (a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:
 - (i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.
 - (ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest.
 - (viii) reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.

Information concerning the interactions between the ACT Government and New South Wales (NSW) counterparts regarding the NSW FuelCheck scheme is reasonably expected to be in the public interest as disclosure would or could promote discussion and contribute to positive and informed debate.

Additionally, the issue of petrol prices affects many people of the ACT community and information discussing measures that could assist with understanding pricing provides background for government decisions and therefore is within the public interest. As such, I give significant weight to these factors for disclosure.

Factors favouring nondisclosure in the public interest under schedule 2.2:

- (a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:
 - (ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004.

Having reviewed the information, I consider that the protection of an individual's right to privacy, is a significant factor as the parties involved have provided their personal information for the purposes of working with the ACT Government. This, in my opinion, outweighs the benefit which may be derived from releasing the personal identities of the individual's involved in this matter.

Individuals are entitled to expect that the personal information they have supplied as part of this process will be dealt with in a manner that protects their privacy. Considering the type of information to be withheld from release, I am satisfied that the factors in favour of release can still be met while protecting the personal identities of the individuals involved. I therefore weight the factor for nondisclosure more highly than the factor in favour of release in this instance. As a result, I have decided that release of this information (names, addresses, email addresses, mobile numbers, phone numbers) could prejudice their right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Having applied the test outlined in section 17 of the Act and deciding that release of personal information contained in the documents is not in the public interest to release, I have chosen to redact this specific information in accordance with section 50(2). Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that I believe is not in the public interest to release will ensure that the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of the information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable for this request because as a Member of the Legislative Assembly, all fees for processing information access applications are waived under section 107 (2)(e).

Online publishing - Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents released to you in response to your access application will be published on the CMTEDD disclosure log. Your personal contact details will not be published.

Ombudsman Review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in CMTEDD disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.

Dear Premier,

Proposal for the ACT to join the NSW Fuelcheck Scheme

I am writing to request that the ACT be able to join the NSW Government's mandatory fuel price monitoring scheme 'FuelCheck'.


As you may be aware, over 40,000 NSW residents travel into the ACT every day to attend work or school, shop, enjoy sports and cultural events, fulfil medical appointments, and access other services the ACT Government provides.

Many of these NSW commuters and visitors seek to fill up their vehicles at a convenient petrol station while in the ACT. Unfortunately, the ACT does not currently have a mandatory fuel price monitoring system in place, and the establishment of a system has been assessed as cost prohibitive for a jurisdiction of our size. This means that both NSW visitors and ACT residents are unable to check accurate and up-to-date information to access the best available fuel prices.

The ACT has historically been subject to unfair fuel margins and pricing behaviour by major petrol retailers. While this has moderated in recent years, following my direct correspondence to fuel retailers and public statements indicating the Government was willing to use legislative powers to introduce price regulation, there remain significant differences in pricing between ACT retailers on any given day.

Recent high fuel prices across the nation have also resulted in a renewed interest in introducing a mandatory fuel price monitoring scheme in the ACT.

Over the past two years, ACT and NSW officials have been in discussions to extend the NSW FuelCheck scheme to include the ACT, if such expansion was found to be feasible. However, these discussions have stalled due to the prohibitive proposed joining cost originally put forward by NSW officials.

Given the benefits that this inclusion would provide to NSW (as well as ACT) residents, and the relatively small additional cost for NSW, I now ask you to consider waiving the establishment and licencing fees to extend the NSW FuelCheck scheme, and to extend basic compliance checks into the ACT from existing compliance activities in surrounding NSW areas.

In providing this extension, the NSW Government would be providing a direct cost-of-living benefit to residents of Queanbeyan, Yass, Bungendore, Murrumbateman, Gundaroo, and many other surrounding communities who need to travel into the ACT. I would be happy to work with you to jointly communicate this cost-of-living support to NSW and ACT motorists.

Dear Premier

I am writing to seek your in-principle agreement and support for the extension of the NSW FuelCheck Scheme to include the ACT fuel market.

The ACT Legislative Assembly has recently completed an inquiry into fuel prices in the Territory, which recommended the ACT Government introduce a real-time, mandatory price reporting and monitoring system, similar to FuelCheck. Given the size of the Territory, and the significant costs associated with developing and implementing a standalone scheme, it is likely that the costs would outweigh the benefits to the ACT community.

However, in view of the well-established FuelCheck Scheme that operates across all service stations in the broader Canberra region, the ACT Government has committed to explore with your government whether it is feasible to expand NSW FuelCheck to incorporate the ACT market. Such an arrangement would ensure a seamless experience for all consumers in NSW and the ACT, while also allowing the Territory to take advantage of the existing administrative and technical structures already in place that support FuelCheck.

From the ACT's perspective, the most cost effective and administratively simple approach would involve direct scheme administration related to ACT service stations being undertaken by NSW Fair Trading, as it does for NSW service stations. In relation to compliance activities, it may be appropriate for initial inquiries to be handled in the first instance by NSW Fair Trading, but more complex compliance matters (requiring subsequent actions such as education or enforcement activities) could be referred to ACT Fair Trading for action. The ACT Government would also introduce amending legislation to provide for mandatory fuel price reporting, consistent with the provisions in the Fair Trading Act 1987 (NSW).


I am advised that preliminary discussions held at officer level between ACT and NSW Government representatives have not identified any obvious technical or legislative issues that would prevent an

extension of the FuelCheck scheme, and it is unlikely there would be significant additional administrative costs or burden for NSW, once initial implementation is completed.

Given this positive preliminary assessment, I therefore seek your in-principle agreement to extend the FuelCheck Scheme to include the ACT fuel market. If you agree to support this proposal, I would also appreciate advice about the fee that NSW would charge for delivering the required services on behalf of the Territory.

I would appreciate if you could provide a formal response to this request before the end of January 2020. This will enable us to ensure that funding to meet any costs to be charged by NSW can be considered as part of the 2020-21 ACT Budget process.



From these initial discussions, we understand that expanding the NSW FuelCheck Scheme to incorporate the ACT is likely to be relatively easy to implement and would be unlikely to impost significant costs on NSW. For example, advised that once service stations in the ACT registered with NSW Fair Trading, they can simply add these service stations on FuelCheck and provide individual service stations owners to upload price via a mobile application; and for the major fuel operators (such as Caltex) they can set up the price upload through the API channel. For the compliance issue, advised that all complaints go through FuelCheck app. They can provide you more technical/compliance information.

I'd value your input/background info on the **FuelCheck expansion discussions** as outlined in the letter **(attached)** between the ACT and NSW. In particular, I'd like to know more about the progress of discussions ie:

1. What – if any – decisions have been flagged or progressed during talks between ACT and NSW? Has the decision to include ACT in the FC Scheme essentially been agreed in pricinple already? If not, what work is needed before this decision can be made?

2. What are the possible models for expanding the Fuel Check scheme to include ACT (including estimated costs)? Were various models considered?

The letter mentioned direct scheme administration. My reading was that this model could involve some kind of split of responsibilities (ie ACT could administer the more burdensome/risky cases and NSW would administer the more 'routine' issues.) Is this correct?

- 3. What are your views on the financial (including cost sharing arrangements) and operational issues for this proposal?
 - a. What kind of fee are you expecting from NSW?
 - b. What information has ACT provided on the likely costings?

I would value your input **today** – and happy to discuss over the phone as well. At the moment we have a fairly tight briefing timeframe, noting that the letter asks for a NSW response by the end of January.

Timing

Depending on the status of the discussions (ie if they have progressed to the point that the decision has effectively been made, versus if an accurate estimate of costs still requires consideration): it would be helpful if we could have a little more time to respond to the letter.

Is this feasible from your perspective? (I understand the time pressure is due to the ACT Budget Process (ie having the proposal ready in time).

We have now received through the initial cost estimates below from the Department of Customer Service (DCS). The estimated provided is \$320-\$360,000 one off and \$220,000 annually plus the cost of a 5/6 grade officer.

These estimates are significantly higher than what expected given that we only have 60 stations compared to around 2,500 in NSW already within the scheme, we assumed that the marginal costs to NSW would be relatively low. This was based on previous officer level discussions with DCS, and the information provided to the ACT Legislative Assembly Inquiry.

 The advice provided to the ACT Legislative Assembly inquiry into fuel pricing was that the design and development costs for FuelCheck, back when it was established in 2016 was around \$600,000 in total, and that ongoing costs of supporting ICT for the system were only estimated at around \$65,000 per annum.

On this basis, we consider the estimates do appear to be relatively high – in particular the \$320,000 - \$360,000 for set up costs which equates to an average cost of somewhere around \$6000 - \$7000 per petrol station,

Given around 90 per cent of the 60 or so stations in the Territory are operated directly by the major fuel brands (Such as BP, Caltex, Coles, Woolworths etc), which already operate in NSW and have therefore developed systems that takes into account requirements of FuelCheck, we were hopeful that the cost of adding our service stations would be relatively low as the systems are already in place for most participants.

As a result of our concerns, I was wondering whether there is an opportunity to review the cost estimates as part of the advice being prepared to the Minister on this issue?

Happy to discuss with you further when you have an opportunity to do so, but we thought it would be useful to raise our concerns directly with you at this stage, prior to finalisation of the work you are undertaking.

From these initial discussions, we understand that expanding the NSW FuelCheck Scheme to incorporate the ACT is likely to be relatively easy to implement and would be unlikely to impost significant costs on NSW. For example, Rai advised that once service stations in the ACT registered with NSW Fair Trading, they can simply add these service stations on FuelCheck and provide individual service stations owners to upload price via a mobile application; and for the major fuel operators (such as Caltex) they can set up the price upload through the API channel. For the compliance issue, Roberto advised that all complaints go through FuelCheck app. They can provide you more technical/compliance information.

I hope you had a restful end of year break. My colleagues in DCS shared with me your contact details. I'd value your input/background info on the **FuelCheck expansion discussions** as outlined in the letter (attached) between the ACT and NSW. In particular, I'd like to know more about the progress of discussions ie:

- 1. What if any decisions have been flagged or progressed during talks between ACT and NSW? Has the decision to include ACT in the FC Scheme essentially been agreed in pricinple already? If not, what work is needed before this decision can be made?
- 2. What are the possible models for expanding the Fuel Check scheme to include ACT (including estimated costs)? Were various models considered?

The letter mentioned direct scheme administration. My reading was that this model could involve some kind of split of responsibilities (ie ACT could administer the more burdensome/risky cases and NSW would administer the more 'routine' issues.) *Is this correct?*

- 3. What are your views on the financial (including cost sharing arrangements) and operational issues for this proposal?
 - a. What kind of fee are you expecting from NSW?
 - b. What information has ACT provided on the likely costings?

I would value your input **today** – and happy to discuss over the phone as well. At the moment we have a fairly tight briefing timeframe, noting that the letter asks for a NSW response by the end of January.

Timing

Depending on the status of the discussions (ie if they have progressed to the point that the decision has effectively been made, versus if an accurate estimate of costs still requires consideration): it would be helpful if we could have a little more time to respond to the letter.

Is this feasible from your perspective? (I understand the time pressure is due to the ACT Budget Process (ie having the proposal ready in time).
