I am happy to accept documents in electronic form and to receive a staged or partial release where that assists processing or reduces delay.

For clarity, I am primarily seeking insight into the assessment criteria, evaluation approach, and factors informing funding decisions, rather than commercially sensitive technical detail.

Fees

Given the limited and targeted scope of this request, and that the documents relate to the allocation of public funds for community sporting infrastructure, I respectfully request that any applicable processing charges be waived or reduced in the public interest under the Freedom of Information Act 2016 (ACT).

If processing charges are still considered necessary, I would appreciate the opportunity to further refine or narrow the scope of the request before any work is undertaken that would incur significant cost.

If any information is exempt, I request that access be provided to the remainder of the documents with exempt material redacted in accordance with section 50 of the Act.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – NOTICE OF DECISION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 9 April 2026.

Specifically, you have sought access to the following information:

“...Under the Freedom of Information Act 2016 (ACT), I request access to documents relating to the following successful projects under the 2026 ACT Sport and Recreation grant programs:

Belconnen United Sharks Rugby League Football Club – Construction of new LED lighting

Tuggeranong BMX Club – Construction of new LED lighting

Eastlake Football Club – Kingston Oval upgrades

Murrumbidgee Country Club – Irrigation redevelopment

For each of the above projects, I request access to:

The final submitted grant application(s), including all attachments and supporting documentation; and

Any assessment summaries, scoring sheets, and evaluation records prepared by the assessment panel in relation to these applications...”

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the CMTEDD Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application within 30 days.

As this matter required third party consultation, the decision due date was extended by 15 working days, in accordance with section 40(2) of the Act.

Therefore, a decision is due by **16 June 2026**.

Decision on access

Searches of CMTEDD records have identified 112 documents within scope of your request. Below are my decisions regarding the release of information:

Full access to 43 documents.

Partial access to 48 documents.

Defer access to 21 documents

Where only out-of-scope information has been removed from a document, the document is considered to have been released in full. This is in accordance with *Ombudsman FOI Guidelines – Dealing with access applications (2020)*.

The records identified as relevant to your application are listed in the schedule at **Attachment A**. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

Release of documents

The information being released to you today is provided at **Attachment B, C, D, E**.

Pursuant to section 38(6)(b) of the Act, I have decided to **defer access to Attachment F** as it includes information identified as of concern to an affected third party. Third parties affected may apply for review of my release decision within 20 working days, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman. I will write to you to advise when access is no longer deferred for this information.

Statement of Reasons

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decisions is below. In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act
- the information that falls within the scope of your request
- third party views
- the *Human Rights Act 2004*

As a decision maker, I am required to determine whether the information within scope is in the public interest to release. To make this decision, I am required to:

- assess whether the information would be contrary to public interest to disclose as per **Schedule 1** of the Act.
- perform the public interest test as set out in section 17 of the Act by balancing the factors favouring disclosure and factors favouring nondisclosure in **Schedule 2** of the Act.

There have been no Schedule 1 factors identified within the documents.

Public Interest Test

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interest lies. As part of this process, I must consider factors favouring disclosure and nondisclosure.

In *Hogan v Hinch* (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when ‘used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from “the subject matter and the scope and purpose” of the enactment in which it appears’. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Schedule 2: Factors to be considered when deciding the public interest

Taking into consideration the information within scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the ‘public interest’.

Factors favouring disclosure (Section 2.1)

- *Section 2.1(a)(i) - promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government’s accountability.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(iv) - ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(viii) - reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.*

Disclosure of the requested information will contribute to informed public debate regarding Sport and Recreation grant projects, strengthening transparency and accountability in government decision-making. I allocate significant weight to this factor for disclosure.

The material contains information concerning the allocation and use of public resources. In my opinion the disclosure of this information will enable the public to scrutinise how funds have been spent and assess whether such expenditure aligns with policy objectives and community expectations. This factor attracts significant weight regarding public interest.

The in-scope information also provides insight into the rationale and context behind the approval of grants for the government project listed in the scope, and the release of this information will assist the public in understanding the basis upon which the decision was made, including the factors considered and the process followed. Again, the release of this information carries significant weight.

I am satisfied that these factors favouring disclosure carry significant weight. However, these factors are to be balanced against the factors favouring nondisclosure.

Factors favouring nondisclosure (Section 2.2)

- *Section 2.2(a)(ii) - prejudice the protection of an individual’s right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004.*
- *Section 2.2(a)(xi) - prejudice trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person.*
- *Section 2.2(a)(xii) - prejudice an agency's ability to obtain confidential information.*

When considering this information against the factors favouring nondisclosure, I am satisfied that the protection of an individual's right to privacy is a significant factor. Not all parties involved in the in-scope information provided their consent to release their personal information which include names, signature and contact information. These individuals are entitled to expect that the personal information they have supplied as part of this process will be dealt with in a manner that protects their privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Release of information concerning individuals working within the ACT Public Service is generally not considered to prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy. However, where mobile phone numbers may be used for home and work purposes, this information is redacted, as it could or would reasonably be expected to prejudice an individual's right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

I have also considered the impact of disclosing information which relates to business affairs. In the case of *Re Mangan and The Treasury* [2005] AATA 898 the term 'business affairs' was interpreted as meaning 'the totality of the money-making affairs of an organisation or undertaking as distinct from its private or internal affairs'. Schedule 2 section 2.2(a)(xi) allows for government information to be withheld from release if disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to prejudice the trade secrets, business affairs or research of an agency or person. Some information has been found to contain pricing information that could lead to competitive pressures. I have given significant weight to this factor for nondisclosure; however, redactions have been applied sparingly.

I have considered the potential impact that disclosure may have on an agency's ability to obtain confidential information in the future. Grant applicants engage with government programs on the understanding that the information they provide will be handled with appropriate care and, where necessary, confidentiality. There is the possibility that future grant applicants could be deterred from applying for a grant, should their information be subject to disclosure. However, the Freedom of Information framework is a legal requirement of government administration. Third party consultation has been undertaken as appropriate under section 38 of the Act. In my opinion it is also unlikely that grant applicants would not provide information as required for a grant as this would limit their likelihood of achieving a grant. I apply minimum weight to this factor for nondisclosure.

Having applied the test outlined in section 17 of the Act and deciding that release of some information contained in the documents is not in the public interest to release, I have chosen to redact this specific information in accordance with section 50(2). Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that I believe is not in the public interest to release will ensure that the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of the information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.

Charges

Processing charges are applicable for this request because the total number of pages to be released to you exceeds the charging threshold of 50 pages. However, the charges have been waived.

Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a [disclosure log](#).

Your original access application and my decision will be published on the CMTEDD disclosure log. Your personal contact details will not be published.

Ombudsman Review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is provided to you, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.
