


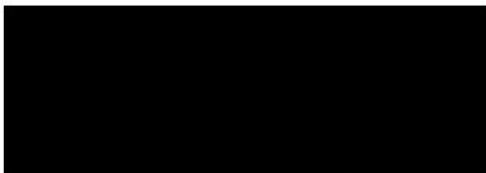

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 25 May 2018, in which you sought access to “asbestos clearance certificates, inspection assessment reports or similar documents issued for 78 barrier St Fyshwick by Robinson Environmental or L&D consulting or other assessors after 1 August 2017 and any Worksafe ACT prohibition notices in relation to a scissor lift at the listed address.

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of CMTEDD under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application by 18 July 2018.

Third Party Consultation

In making this decision, I completed consultation in accordance with section 38 of the Act. The views of identified third parties were taken into account in making this decision.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant documents and 5 documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have decided to partial access to 5 documents. The information redacted in the documents I consider to be information that would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.

I have included as Attachment A to this decision the schedule of relevant documents. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as Attachment B to this letter.

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decision is below.

Statement of Reasons

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act;
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- the submissions made by the relevant third party; and
- the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

Exemption claimed

My reasons for deciding not to grant full access to the identified documents and components of these documents are as follows:

Information Contrary to Public Interest

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interests lies. As part of this process I must consider factors favouring disclosure and non-disclosure.

In *Hogan v Hinch* (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Factors favouring disclosure (Schedule 2.1)

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest':

- (a) *disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:*
- (i) *contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest; and*
 - (viii) *reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.*

Having considered the factors identified as relevant in this matter, I consider that release of information contained in these documents would contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest, namely information relating to asbestos removal.

The information contained in the documents shows the work undertaken by the ACT Government and other relevant stakeholders regarding the steps taken to remove

asbestos and clear the site located at 78 Barrier St Fyshwick of asbestos. I am satisfied the information contained within these documents is within the public interest to release as they reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that has informed the progression of the removal of asbestos.

Factors favouring non-disclosure (Schedule 2.2)

Taking into consideration the information contained in the documents found to be within the scope of your request, I have also identified the following public interest factors in favour of non-disclosure are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest'.

- (a) *disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do any of the following:*
- (ii) *prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004;*

Having reviewed the documents, I have considered the impact that releasing personal information contained in the documents, being the signatures of non-ACT Government employees and the personal details of the private individual contained within the workplace visit report and the removal of prohibition notice. I am of the opinion that release of this information may prejudice the protection of these individuals' right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*. I am satisfied that this factor favouring non-disclosure should be afforded significant weight as it relates to individuals privacy. Accordingly, I have decided to withhold from disclosure the signatures of the non-ACT Government employees and all identifying features of the private individual contained within the workplace visit report and removal of prohibition notice.

Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that is not in the public interest to release, while releasing the rest of the documents will ensure the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.

Accordingly, I have chosen to redact parts of folios 1, 5, 8, 11, 14-15, 17 and 20 of the documents within Attachment B.

Charges

Pursuant to *Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2017 (No 2)* processing charges are not applicable for this request because the total number folio's to be released to you is below the charging threshold of 50 pages.

Online publishing – Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the Act, CMTEDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents released to you in response to your access application will be published in the CMTEDD disclosure log after 20 June 2018. 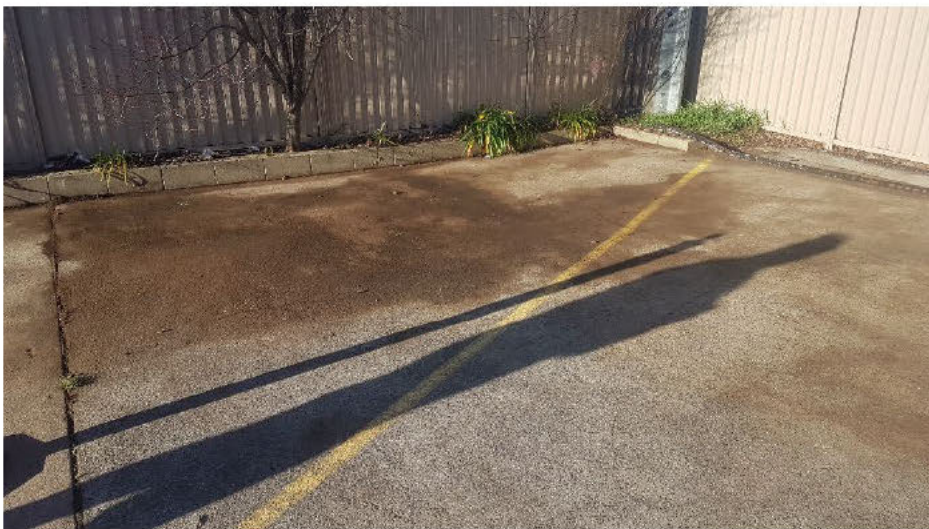

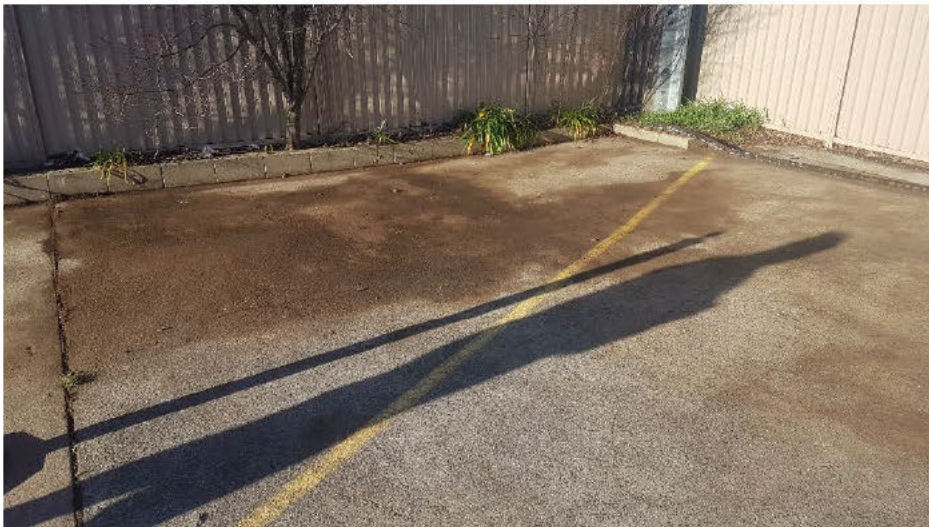

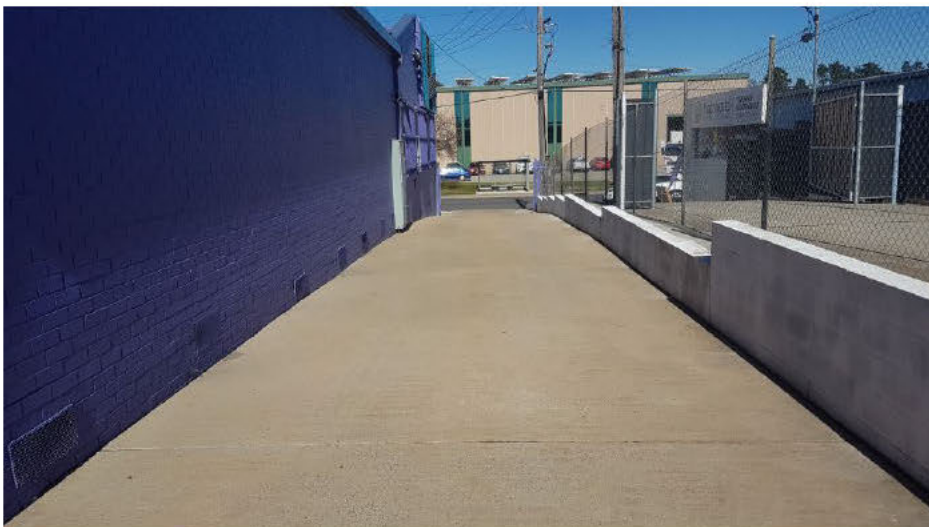

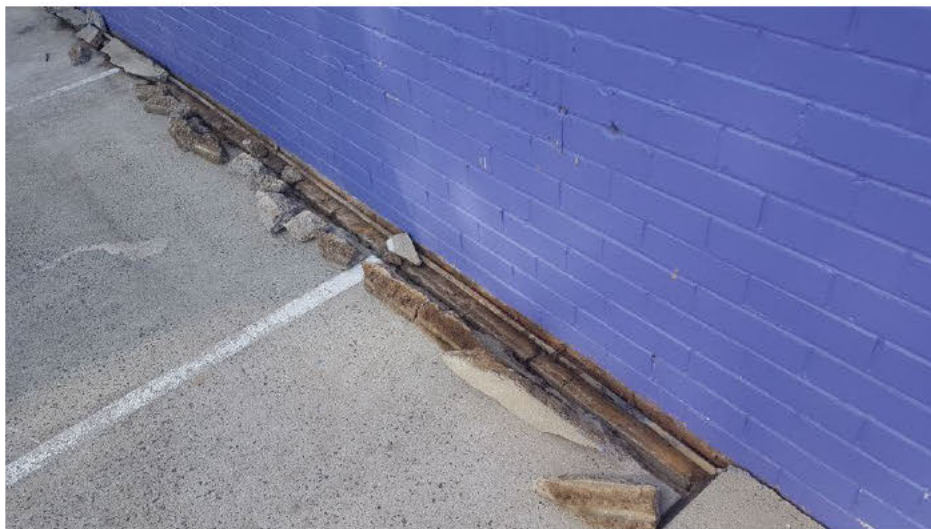

If you have any questions you may contact the inspector who issued this notice.

Display of Notices A person to whom a notice is issued must, as soon as possible, display a copy of the notice in a prominent place at or near the workplace, or part of the workplace, at which work is being carried out that is affected by the notice (s 210(1)). A person must not intentionally remove, destroy, damage or deface a notice displayed under s 210(1) while the notice is in force (s 210(2)). The maximum penalty for failing to comply with these provisions is \$5,000 for an individual or \$25,000 for a corporation.

Compliance with direction or notice The person to whom a direction is given under section 195(2) or a prohibition notice is issued must comply with the direction or notice (s197). The maximum penalty for failing to comply with this requirement is \$100,000 for an individual or \$500,000 for a corporation.

Regulator may carry out action If a person to whom a prohibition notice is issued fails to take reasonable steps to comply with the notice, and after giving written notice of its intentions and the person's liability for the costs, the regulator (WorkSafe ACT) may take any remedial action it believes reasonable to make the workplace or situation safe (s 211). I write to inform you that I have formally removed the prohibition notice number **PN-P32685-QN55N7-1** on the premises under your control at 78 Barrier Street, Fyshwick issued by Manager WorkSafe ACT Robert ALFORD on 2 November 2016. There are no remaining restrictions on the access or use of the premises by WorkSafe ACT.

The lifting of this notice does not in anyway affect your obligations to ensure that an appropriate Asbestos Management Plan (AMP) is in place before ongoing work is conducted in the workplace. It is the expectation of WorkSafe ACT that this AMP is inclusive of information relating to the contamination and areas of the premises that could not have reasonably been accessed or cleaned. The professional compiling the AMP on your behalf is required to be fully appraised of the events at the premises which resulted in the issuance of the prohibition notice. I require a copy of the AMP once this has been compiled and I am available to assist yourself and or the professional you engage to undertake this task.

This letter in no way impacts on the strict prohibition of the use or access of the scissor lift situated at the rear of the premises. To assist in clarification of these prohibitions I attach a new detailed Prohibition Notice relevant to this item of plant.
