FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 11 November 2022, in which you sought access to:

"The subject line of all final ministerial briefs from 11th July to 11 September 2022 generated for or directed to any ACT Government Minister."

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD was required to provide a decision on your access application by 5 September 2022. However, on 25 November 2022 you agreed to a 20-working day extension, which was applied in accordance with section 41 of the Act. This resulted in a revised due date of 9 January 2023.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant information and 203 subject lines were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have decided to grant access in full to 172 subject lines and partial access to three subject lines. I have decided to refuse access to 28 subject lines as I consider the information to be contrary to the public interest under Schedule 1 of the Act.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons, in accordance with section 54(2) of the Act, and the documents released to you are provided as an attachment to this letter.

Statement of Reasons

In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act
- the information that falls within the scope of your request.

Exemption claimed

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the identified documents and components of these documents are as follows:

Contrary to the public interest information under schedule 1 of the Act

Twenty-five of the subject lines identified contain information hat is contrary to the public interest under Schedule 1 of the Act. Information that falls under the exemptions in Schedule 1 is not subject to the public interest test as detailed in section 17 of the Act.

These 25 subject lines have been identified as information the disclosure of which would reveal deliberations of Cabinet. Under section 1.6(1)(a) information that has been submitted, or that a Minister proposes to submit, to Cabinet for its consideration and that was brought into existence for that purpose and section 1.6(1)(d) information the disclosure of which would reveal any deliberation of Cabinet (other than through the official publication of a Cabinet decision) of Schedule 1 of the Act, is considered Cabinet information and is exempt from release. The purpose of this exemption is to maintain the confidentiality of the Cabinet process and to uphold the principle of collective ministerial responsibility.

This exemption was discussed in *The Commonwealth v Northern Land Council* [1993] HCA 24; (1993) 176 CLR 604 (21 April 1993). Paragraph 6 of the decision, states that:

... it has never been doubted that it is in the public interest that the deliberations of Cabinet should remain confidential in order that the members of Cabinet may exchange differing views and at the same time maintain the principle of collective responsibility for any decision which may be made.

The information that you have requested falls within Schedule 1, section 1.6 of the Act as it is information which has been brought into existence to guide Cabinet it in its decision making and assist it in its deliberations. It is reasonable to consider that the disclosure this material would or could reveal those deliberations. Therefore, these 25 titles are exempt from release under the Act.

Contrary to the public interest information under schedule 2 of the Act

While the majority of subject lines are to be released in full, the remaining subject lines have been assessed for factors favouring disclosure and nondisclosure, and therefore are required to be subject to the public interest test as set out in section 17 of the Act.

Taking into consideration the information contained in the subject lines, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these subject lines is within the 'public interest':

- Promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability (s 2.1(a)(i) of Schedule 2)
- Contribute to the positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest (s 2.1(a)(ii) of Schedule 2)

I consider that disclosing the contents of the information sought could contribute to open discussion and informed debate on the matters contained in the subject lines. I am satisfied there may be a public interest, however, I weigh these factors lightly as release of single subject lines alone may not reasonably contribute to informed debate.

In relation to three subject lines, I note that the following factor favouring nondisclosure is relevant:

• Prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or other rights under the Human Rights Act 2004 (s 2.2(a)(ii) of Schedule 2)

Three subject lines list the names of members of the public and it is reasonable that this type of information is not released. I note that these brief titles are in reference to meetings between a Minister and non-ACT Government Employees and the release of their names could or would reasonably be considered to prejudice their right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*. I note that these redactions are minor in nature.

In relation to an additional three subject lines, I also note that the following factors favouring nondisclosure are relevant:

- Prejudice intergovernmental relations (s 2.2(a)(x) of Schedule 2)
- Prejudice a deliberative process of government (s 2.2 (a)(xvi) of Schedule 2)

Three subject lines refer to information that involves a deliberative process of government, therefore the factor for nondisclosure s 2.2 (a)(xvi) is relevant. While information referring to a deliberative process of government can be disclosed where the information is factual or administrative, nondisclosure is recommended where prejudice of decision is reasonably expected to occur.

The three subject lines contain information that requires protection in order for the Government to continue to make informed decisions, especially in relation to negotiations with other governments. Therefore, I also consider the factor of s2.2 (a)(x) as relevant, although carrying less weight than s 2.2 (a)(xvi) which I consider to be significant.

I am satisfied that on balance, the release of the three subject lines is considered not in the public interest and will are exempt from disclosure.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable for this request.

Ombudsman Review
