FOI – Home Warranty Claims statements to the ACT Government This FOI Request relates to the lack of clarity surrounding Home Warranty Schemes (both HIA Insurer and Master Builder Fidelity Fund). The current legislation (Building Act Clause 95 – Duties of Insurers, sub clause 4) requires: (4) On or before 31 July in each year, an authorised insurer must give a written statement to the construction occupations registrar in relation to claims on residential building insurance policies dealt with by the insurer in the financial year ending on the previous 30 June, stating the following: (a) the number of claims; (b) the amount of

each claim; (c) the number of claims that were paid; (d) the amount paid on each claim; (e) if a claim was rejected—the reason for its rejection. The Building Act Clause 103 - Prudential Standards (for Approved Fidelity Funds) goes on to state: (2) The prudential standards may – (b) make provision in relation to – (iv) requiring the giving of information to the commissioner for fair trading, or any other entity prescribed under the prudential standards, about decisions by the trustees to pay or refuse to pay claims. The Building Prudential Standards Clauses 57 and 58 go on to state: Reporting to the commissioner for fair trading 57. The trustees must report to the commissioner for fair trading each decision by the trustees to pay or refuse a request under a fidelity certificate: (a) every three months, commencing from the date of approval of the approved scheme; and (b) if requested in a written direction from the Minister, within the period specified in the direction. A direction made under paragraph (b) is a disallowable instrument. include, in respect of a financial year: (a) the number of requests for payment received by the trustees pursuant to fidelity certificates; (b) the amount sought under each request for payment pursuant to a fidelity certificate; (c) the number of payments made in response to requests for payment pursuant to fidelity certificates; (d) for each request for payment pursuant to a fidelity certificate that was paid, the amount that was paid, and (e) where a request for payment pursuant to a fidelity certificate was rejected, the reason for its rejection. • The Minister's Letter dated 30 Jun 22 (attached) identifies the Commissioner for Fair Trading receives these reports every 3 months (in accordance with Clause 103 (2) (iv) of the Building Act 2004 and Clauses 57 & 58 of the Prudential Standards) • The Commissioner for Fair Trading's Letter to me dated 13 Apr 22 (attached), states that 'the Commissioner does not have any jurisdiction over the approval or oversight functions of the fund' The specific request is to: • Question: Does the term "Authorised Insurer" under the Building Act, Include both the HIA Insurer and the Master Builders Fidelity Fund? • Request the last 10 years of mandated "Authorised Insurer" statements to the Construction Occupations Registrar in relation to the Building Act Clause 95 (4) (or to whomever these reports are now sent to). • Request the last 10 years of mandated "Approved Fidelity Fund Trustees" statements to the Commissioner for Fair Trading in relation to the Building Act Clause 103 (2) (b) (iv) and Building Prudential Standards Clauses 57 and 58 (or to whomever these reports are now sent to). ## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 5 September 2022.

Specifically, you are seeking:

- Request the last 5 years of mandated "Authorised Insurer" statements to the Construction Occupations Registrar in relation to the Building Act Clause 95 (4) (or to whomever these reports are now sent to).
- Request the last 5 years of mandated "Approved Fidelity Fund Trustees" statements to the Commissioner for Fair Trading in relation to the Building Act Clause 103 (2) (b) (iv) and Building Prudential Standards Clauses 57 and 58 (or to whomever these reports are now sent to).

# **Authority**

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

#### **Timeframes**

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD was required to provide a decision on your access application by 5 October 2022 however, following an extension the due date is now 26 October 2022.

## Decision on access

A search of CMTEDD records has failed to identify any documentation in relation to your request. The search was conducted using the information you provided.

I am satisfied that appropriate searches were completed and that no documents relevant to your request are held by CMTEDD.

However, Access Canberra advised you would need to contact the MBA to obtain documents in relation to this request.

### Charges

Pursuant to Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2017 (No 2) processing charges are not applicable for this request because no documents are being released to you.
