- Many of the recommendations in the 2018 Report will be progressed through the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Agreement 2019-2028.*
- The implementation of the agreed recommendations will have a positive impact on economic and employment outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Canberrans.

Justice and rights	The implementation of the agreed recommendations contained in the ACT Government Response to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elected Body 2018 Hearings Report has a direct positive impact on the quality of life of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the ACT region.
	Many of the recommendations in the 2018 Report will be progressed through the <i>Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Agreement 2019-2028.</i> In the Agreement the ACT Government has committed to Quality Life Outcomes that will provide a positive social impact for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the ACT. The Agreement is centred on the principle of self-determination.

	 co-design the development of a culturally appropriate residential drug and alcohol rehabilitation service for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the ACT - \$0.3 million;
	 implementation of the 'Building communities not prisons' reform including the Warrumbul Sentencing Court for young people and the expanded ACT Bail Support Program - \$5.08 million;
	 continuing the funding the new facility for Winnunga Nimmityjah Aboriginal Health Community Services - \$10.135 million; and
