FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – NOTICE OF DECISION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 26 November 2025.

On 27 November 2025 you were sent a clarification request under section 34 of the Act.

On that date you agreed to the following **revised scope**:

I seek access under the Freedom of Information Act 2016 (ACT) to documents held by the ACT Government relating to the development, consideration and implementation of the process used to seek and assess responses from staff employed under the Legislative Assembly Members Staff Enterprise Agreement 2023-2026 (The Agreement), being ACT Legislative Assembly Staff, affected by incorrect termination payment estimates issued before the 2024 ACT Legislative Assembly election.

Specifically, I request access to all documents relating to meetings, discussions and correspondence between CMTEDD (including the Office of Industrial Relations and Workforce Strategy) and the Treasurer or the Treasurer's office, the Chief Minister or the Chief Minister's office, and/or any other ACT Minister or Ministerial office, that relate or refer to the development, consideration, approval, refinement, or communication of the process used by CMTEDD to assess affected staff members' circumstances, as referenced in letters sent to staff employed under the agreement signed by Robers Wright dated 26 November 2026, and the ACT Government's obligations or potential voluntary duty following the issuance of incorrect termination payment estimates.

This includes, but is not limited to:

1. *briefings, file notes, talking points, minutes, agendas, decision papers, internal or external correspondence, including emails, SMS or instant messaging;*
2. *documents relating to the establishment, drafting or approval of the "Request for consideration of individual circumstances" form provided to affected staff;*

Additional background information

I am seeking information on the process for impacted staff between August 2024 until 26 November 2025 when a letter was sent to impacted staff that was signed by Robert Wright. I am seeking information that provides an understanding of the process undertaken. I am not seeking third party individual personal information, unless it is my own. For example, do not include correspondence on individual payout estimates, unless I am specifically referenced, but correspondence with third parties such as the United Services Union or CPSU on behalf of members generally is requested. Information requested on the process, which was initiated by CMTEDD, includes information on no act of grace payments request information on decisions made. I am seeking information to also understand why the process has taken approximately 12 months.

On 1 December 2025, you were sent a further clarification request under section 34 of the Act.

Does this request include only documents relating to meetings etc between:

1. *CMTEDD (the portfolio, which includes OIRWS)*
2. *The Treasurer/ Treasurer's office*
3. *Chief Minister / Chief Minister's office*
4. *Any other ACT Minister / ACT Minister office*

Or does your request also include internal communication within CMTEDD, the Treasurer's office, CM Office, any other office?

On 2 December 2025, your email reply stated: "Internally or between the parties listed."

You have provided personal identification on 16 December 2025, under section 30(3)(a) of the Act, after searches located information that included your personal information.

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the CMTEDD Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application within 30 days.

As this matter required third party consultation, the decision due date was extended by 15 working days, in accordance with section 40(2) of the Act.

Therefore, a decision is due **9 February 2026**.

Decision on access

Searches within CMTEDD records have identified 334 documents within the scope of your request.

I have decided to grant **full access** to 102 documents.

I have decided to grant **partial access** to 105 documents.

I have decided to grant **no access (nondisclosure)** to 127 documents.

The records identified as relevant to your application are listed in the schedule enclosed at **Attachment A**. This provides a description of each document that falls within the scope of your request and the access decision for each of those documents.

Documents located include correspondence and messages, attachments to those documents such as Excel documents, reference documents, policies, guidelines, and legal advice.

Transfer requests were sent to all ACT Government Ministers Offices in response to your access application. No offices accepted transfer, however some provided material in response to your scope. For the material transferred, I am the Information Officer in accordance with section 58(2)(c)(ii) of the Act.

Release of documents

The information being released to you is provided at **Attachment B**.

Outside scope/excluded documents/duplicates

Duplicates (copies) have been excluded. Where parts of documents, such as an email chain, include documents, the duplicates are either deleted or redacted as 'duplicate' as they are a copy, which is in accordance with the ACT Ombudsman *Freedom of Information Guidelines* (FOI Guidelines).

Where the document is published and not included in the bundle of documents, there is a link at the end of the letter where you can find the information.

Your scope excludes documents relating to individuals (other than yourself). Documents relating to personal circumstances of third parties have been determined to be outside scope of your request. Some parts of documents include redactions as either 'outside scope' or the document was excluded in its entirety.

Statement of Reasons

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decisions is below. In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act
- the information that falls within the scope of your request
- third party views
- *Human Rights Act 2004*
- *Legislative Assembly (Members' Staff) Act 1989*

- *Legislative Assembly (Members' Staff) Members' Hiring Arrangements Approval 2021 (No 1) Disallowable instrument DI2021-181*
- Publicly available information
- ACT Ombudsman Freedom of information Guidelines (FOI Guidelines)

As a decision maker, I am required to determine whether the information within scope is in the public interest to release. To make this decision, I am required to:

- assess whether the information would be contrary to public interest to disclose as per **Schedule 1** of the Act.
- perform the public interest test as set out in section 17 of the Act by balancing the factors favouring disclosure and factors favouring nondisclosure in **Schedule 2** of the Act.

Exemptions claimed

Schedule 1: Information taken to be contrary to the public interest.

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the information or components of information found within documents are as follows:

- *Section 1.2 - Information subject to legal professional privilege.*

Many documents identified as being within the scope of your request are either fully or partially composed of information considered to be contrary to the public interest information under section 1.2 of Schedule 1 of the Act as it is information that is deemed privileged under Legal Professional Privilege (LPP). This information can only be released if the parties involved agree to waive that privilege. The parties have not waived privilege.

Some of the rationale and basis for LPP and confidentiality is explained in the High Court Full Court judgment in the matter of *Glencore International AG v Commissioner of Taxation [2019] HCA 26 14 August 2019*.

[at Para 27]:

The policy of the privilege – the public interest

The rationale for the rule was stated in Grant v Downs [(1976) 135 CLR 674 at 685 per Stephen, Mason and Murphy JJ]. It is that the rule promotes the public interest because it "assists and enhances the administration of justice by facilitating the representation of clients by legal advisers". By keeping secret their communications, the client is encouraged to retain a lawyer and to make full and frank disclosure of all relevant circumstances to the lawyer....

[at Para 29]:

It was recognised in Grant v Downs that there was another, more general, public interest which legal professional privilege did not promote. That public interest lies in the fair conduct of litigation, which requires that all relevant documentary evidence be available. But the public interest which supports the privilege is paramount to the more general public interest. In the provision of the privilege the law has struck the balance between two competing public interest. Consequently, once the privilege is found to exist, no more is required for effect to be given to it. In that sense it may be described as absolute.

The FOI Guidelines, Volume 3, on page 15 states:

In accordance with common law principles, for LPP to apply:

- *an independent legal practitioner and client relationship must exist, and*
- *the communication must have been made for the purpose of giving or receiving legal advice, or for use in litigation (actual or anticipated), and*
- *the advice must have been confidential*

I find that some of the information within your requested scope meets these criteria.

Correspondence within your requested scope, such as emails and attachments (including letters) includes documents labelled with classifications such as 'Sensitive' and 'Legal Privilege' and 'for advice', provide evidence that the information was intended to be LPP information. The intent is indicated in correspondence including clarifying and confirming instructions for legal advice and on the implementation of the legal advice.

Public Interest Test

The Act has a presumption in favour of disclosure. As a decision maker I am required to decide where, on balance, public interest lies. As part of this process, I must consider factors favouring disclosure and nondisclosure.

In *Hogan v Hinch* (2011) 243 CLR 506, [31] French CJ stated that when 'used in a statute, the term [public interest] derives its content from "the subject matter and the scope and purpose" of the enactment in which it appears'. Section 17(1) of the Act sets out the test, to be applied to determine whether disclosure of information would be contrary to the public interest. These factors are found in subsection 17(2) and Schedule 2 of the Act.

Schedule 2: Factors to be considered when deciding the public interest.

Taking into consideration the information within scope of your request, I have identified that the following public interest factors are relevant to determine if release of the information contained within these documents is within the 'public interest'.

Factors favouring disclosure (Section 2.1)

- *Section 2.1(a)(i) - promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(ii) - contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(iii) - inform the community of the government's operations, including policies, guidelines and codes of conduct followed by the government in its dealings with members of the community.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(iv) - ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(vii) - advance the fair treatment of individuals and other entities in accordance with the law in their dealings with the government.*
- *Section 2.1(a)(viii) - reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.*
- *Section 2.1(b)(i) - the information is of the person making the request.*

Information you have requested concerns termination payments for people employed under the *Legislative Assembly Members' Staff* (LAMS) arrangements. Accordingly, I am satisfied that the release of the information would enhance the government's accountability for

public spending and would be likely to contribute to informed debate on the issues and policies about the employment of people in the Ministerial Offices.

As the information you have requested relates to your personal circumstances, and includes some of your personal information, I am satisfied that the release of information would assist you in your understanding of decisions made that impacted you and would be likely to advance your treatment, and others, in dealings with the Territory. I have given the above factors favouring disclosure moderate weight.

However, these factors are to be balanced against the factors favouring nondisclosure.

Factors favouring nondisclosure (Section 2.2)

- *Section 2.2(a)(ii) - prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004.*

Having reviewed the information, I consider that the protection of an individual's right to privacy, is a significant factor. Release of information concerning individuals working within the ACT Public Service is generally not considered to prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy. However, where mobile phone numbers may be used for home and work purposes, this information is redacted, as it could or would reasonably be expected to prejudice an individual's right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*, in particular section 12.

I have made redactions to some additional personal information of staff. An example includes an email with their leave and or availability.

Information that you have requested includes information about staff employed by Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs), who are generally considered **public sector members**, but they are distinct from the traditional, apolitical public service (ACT Public Service) employed under the *Public Sector Management Act 1994 (PSM Act)*.

Information within your requested scope includes personal information of third parties. I have also redacted personal details, such as names and employment numbers, calculations and locations of where people worked. Information of personal circumstances of third parties have been redacted under this factor because the identity of the person could be ascertained, given the low numbers of people impacted by the decision. In this respect, some personal information was redacted where there are special circumstances where people are making or receiving their own enquiries in their personal capacity, and I have found this information to be in the capacity of an individual constituent enquiry. I consider the third parties were not operating in a mere work context and therefore the circumstances of collecting and holding the information outweigh the public interest in releasing the information. Third parties were corresponding regarding their individual circumstances, and the email trails have been de-identified in the schedule to maintain privacy, noting in consultation with you that you were not seeking other people's personal information.

Having applied the test outlined in section 17 of the Act and deciding that release of some information contained in the documents is not in the public interest to release, I have chosen to redact this specific information in accordance with section 50(2). Noting the pro-disclosure intent of the Act, I am satisfied that redacting only the information that I believe is not in the public interest to release will ensure that the intent of the Act is met and will provide you with access to the majority of the information held by CMTEDD within the scope of your request.
