### FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 27 May 2022, in which you sought access to:

• Any ACT specific modelling, predictions or other expectations on the ACT economy that were considered by the ACT government prior to that lockdown going into effect. Small business closures, bankruptcies, long term projections.

#### Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

### Timeframes

In accordance with section 40 of the Act, CMTEDD is required to provide a decision on your access application by 21 June 2022.

#### Decision on access

I have decided to refuse to deal with part of your application under sections 43(1)(d), and 45(a) of the Act.

Section 43(1)(d) states a respondent may refuse to deal with an access application wholly or in part only if— the government information is already available to the applicant (see section 45).

Section 45(a) states a respondent may refuse to deal with an access application wholly or in part only if— the government information is already available to the applicant.

I have decided to refuse access to one document as I consider it to be contrary to the public interest information under Schedule 1.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as an attachment to this letter.

In accordance with section 54(2) of the Act a statement of reasons outlining my decisions is below.

#### **Statement of Reasons**

In reaching my access decisions, I have taken the following into account:

- the Act,
- the information that falls within the scope of your request.

### **Exemption claimed**

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to the identified document is as follows:

### Contrary to the public interest information under Schedule 1 of the Act

One document that was identified is composed of information that is considered to be contrary to the public interest under Schedule 1 of the Act. Information that falls under the exemptions in Schedule 1 is not subject to the public interest test as detailed in section 17 of the Act.

The document has been identified as information the disclosure of which would reveal deliberations of Cabinet. Under section 1.6 of Schedule 1 of the Act, Cabinet information is exempt from release. The purpose of this exemption is to maintain the confidentiality of the Cabinet process and to uphold the principle of collective ministerial responsibility.

This exemption was discussed in *The Commonwealth v Northern Land Council* [1993] HCA 24; (1993) 176 CLR 604 (21 April 1993). Paragraph 6 of the decision, states that:

... it has never been doubted that it is in the public interest that the deliberations of Cabinet should remain confidential in order that the members of Cabinet may exchange differing views and at the same time maintain the principle of collective responsibility for any decision which may be made.

The information that you have requested falls within section 1.6 of the Act as it is information which has been brought into existence to guide Cabinet it in its decision making and to assist it in its deliberations, and the disclosure of which would reveal those deliberations. It is therefore exempt from release under the Act.

Processing charges are not applicable for this request because no pages are being released to you.

#### **Ombudsman Review**

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in CMTEDD disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.
